All,

As of this morning, USCP is expecting approximately 2,000 participants for the Occupy Congress demonstration on the 17th. While the event is scheduled to end at 2300 hours that evening, USCP is expecting that many individuals will remain on the West Front of the Capitol and possibly engage in Civil Disobedience. Though the group has been instructed that tents will not be allowed on Capitol grounds, USCP also expects some in the group will ignore that ground rule. They also believe that many affiliate individuals and groups will also participate in the Occupy the Courts demonstration on the 20th. I will pass on any further information as the event gets closer.

I am sure you are aware of the group call "OCCUPY" is conducting a walk from NYC to DC. Today they should be stopping in the OCCUPY Baltimore meeting area/camp. The attached word document was sent by the MCAC and contains the intended route to DC with estimated dates of arrival; however, they are currently using US route 40 and are somewhere near Aberdeen, MD. After analyzing possible routes to DC using Google Maps (walking route), I have determined that they may use US route 1 for the remainder of their walk. This route does not cross any bridges and the closest body of water they will near is the Inner Harbor where they arrive at OCCUPY Baltimore where they intend to stay overnight. Compared to the dates of their intend route and where they are currently, they may arrive in DC earlier than intended. 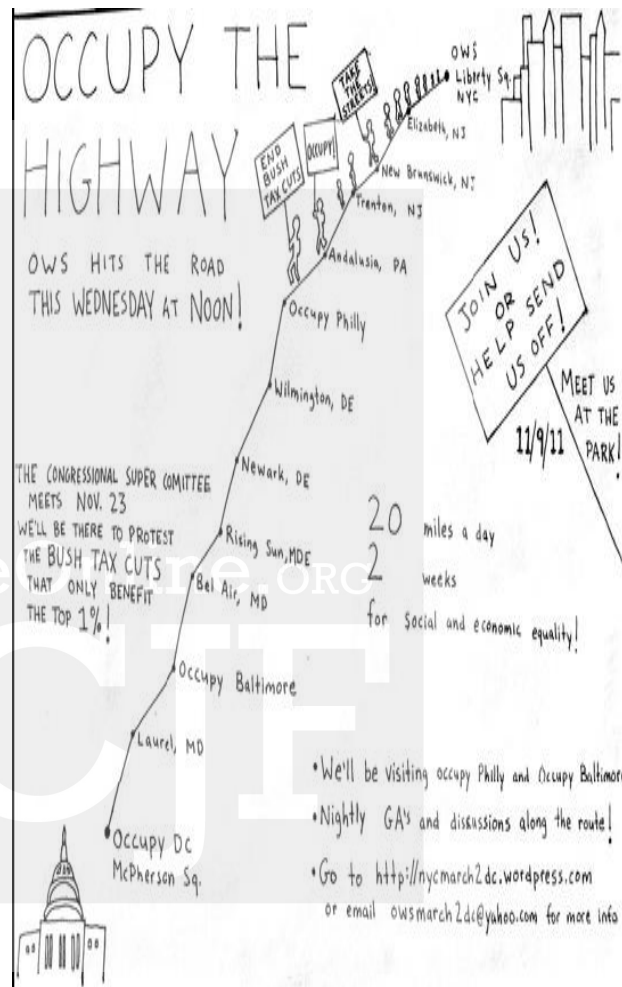

CIA Double-Speak on full display as intelligence agency refuses to respond to FOIA request on its role in the nationwide crackdown on Occupy movement

CIA plays new version of "I Won't Tell You."

The Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) is refusing to process a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request that would reveal what role, if any, the agency has played in law enforcement's coordinated, nationwide campaign to shut down and evict Occupy movement encampments in cities throughout the country.

The FOIA demand for records was filed by the Washington D.C.-based civil rights legal organization, the Partnership for Civil Justice (PCJF).

The language used by the agency to announce its refusal to process the FOIA request concerning its role in the crackdown on the Occupy movement is "a classic case of CIA-double speak," according to the attorneys at the PCJF.

The CIA is not specifically denying that it has records and documents that would reveal its role in the coordinated crackdown that evicted the encampments in major cities within a short period of time. Rather, the agency asserts that it won't look for such records and documents.

"The CIA is apparently asserting that because its involvement in law enforcement's crackdown of the Occupy movement would be barred by law, it is not possible for the CIA to conduct an effective search for information responsive to our inquiry into its role in the operation," stated Mara Verheyden-Hilliard, Executive Director of the PCJF. "In other words," she continued, "because the actions would be illegal, they would also be off the books."

Far from claiming it does not possess responsive records, the CIA stated in its letter to Ms. Verheyden-Hilliard that because such activities would be barred by law, "our records systems are not configured in a way that would allow us to perform a search reasonably calculated to lead to responsive records. Therefore, we must decline to process your request."

The PCJF has demanded that the CIA reconsider its request and is prepared to take legal action as necessary to force the agency to comply with its obligations under the Freedom of Information Act. This denial comes on the heels of a series of Associated Press articles revealing the CIA's involvement with the NYPD.

The Partnership for Civil Justice Fund (PCJF) has filed Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests with the Department of Justice, Department of Homeland Security, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), and the National Park Service (NPS) requesting that the agencies release information that they possess related to the involvement of federal agencies in the planning of a coordinated law enforcement crackdown that has taken place in multiple cities against the Occupy Movement. These requests are also on behalf of the National Lawyers Guild Mass Defense Committee.

The FOIA to the various federal law enforcement agencies states: "This request specifically encompasses disclosure of any documents or information pertaining to federal coordination of, or advice or consultation regarding, the police response to the Occupy movement, protests or encampments."

Occupy DC prepares for massive January rally

The upcoming Occupy Congress protest is shaping up to be one of the largest demonstrations Occupy DC has produced, but that doesn't mean protesters are planning to play by the rules.

District and federal authorities have asked [Occupy Congress](#) organizers to file applications for four separate permits for the Jan. 17 event, which participants say could draw thousands to the District to protest money in politics on the day Congress

returns to work.

Participants say they will only ask for two permits: One, already granted, allows protesters to converge outside the Capitol building, and another establishes a drop-off site for busloads of Occupiers.

They don't plan to obtain a permit to march in the streets or to gather in McPherson Square, where Occupiers have camped without a permit for more than three months.

"When we do march in the street, our intent is largely civil disobedience. People will be arrested, and a permit doesn't really help," said Occupy Congress participant Mario Lozada, who added that the protest will be "completely nonviolent and peaceful."

Occupiers in D.C. are bracing for the arrival of up to 2,000 additional protesters for the event. That would put the population in McPherson Square well above the 500-person limit set by the National Park Service, but most Occupiers said they weren't worried about the influx of protesters. Unlike their counterparts in Freedom Plaza, who recently obtained a permit to protest in the park through February, McPherson Occupiers have insisted they don't need a permit to occupy the square.

U.S. Park Police are adopting a wait-and-see attitude toward the protest. Spokesman Sgt. David Schlosser said police would address the situation as it unfolds.

"I don't think there will be more than 500 people in the park," said McPherson Occupier Sam Jewler, a media organizer for the movement. "There will be people staying at Freedom Plaza as well, so the burden's not entirely on McPherson."

Lozada, though, said Occupy is reaching out to local churches and Freedom Plaza protesters to house some of protesters.

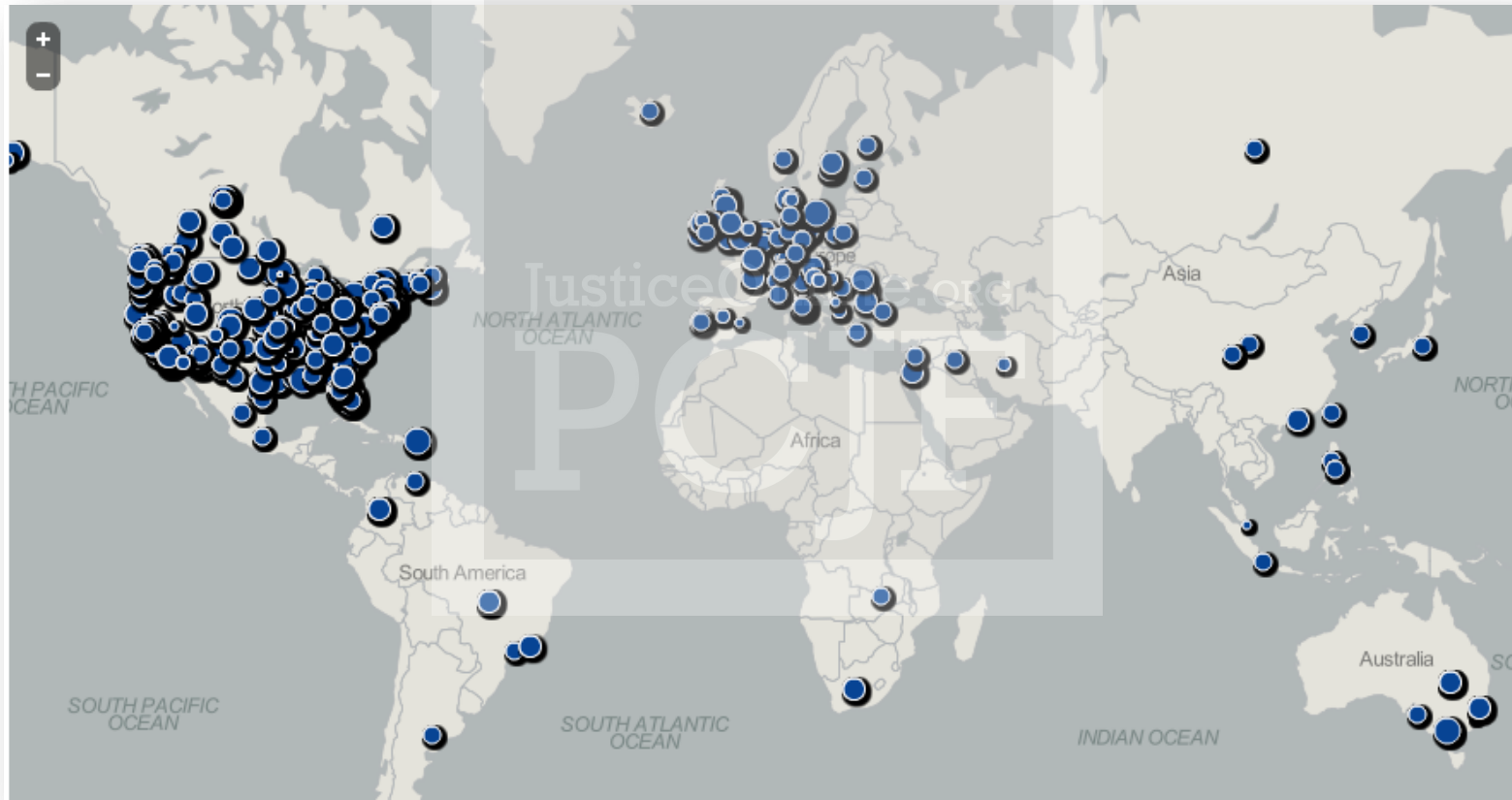
Occupy Movement - Overview

HISTORY

- Occupy arose from the 15 May (15-M) movement that still mobilises large numbers of protestors in Spain
- It is helped and supported by the Anonymous hacktivist collective and takes in other existing single-issue groups
- The movement initially tried to mobilise in US on July 12 – failed; re-launched as Occupy Wall Street (OWS) on September 17, with local success; media coverage muted
- Movement launched a “push” for global action on 15 October and finally achieved real traction in major cities worldwide

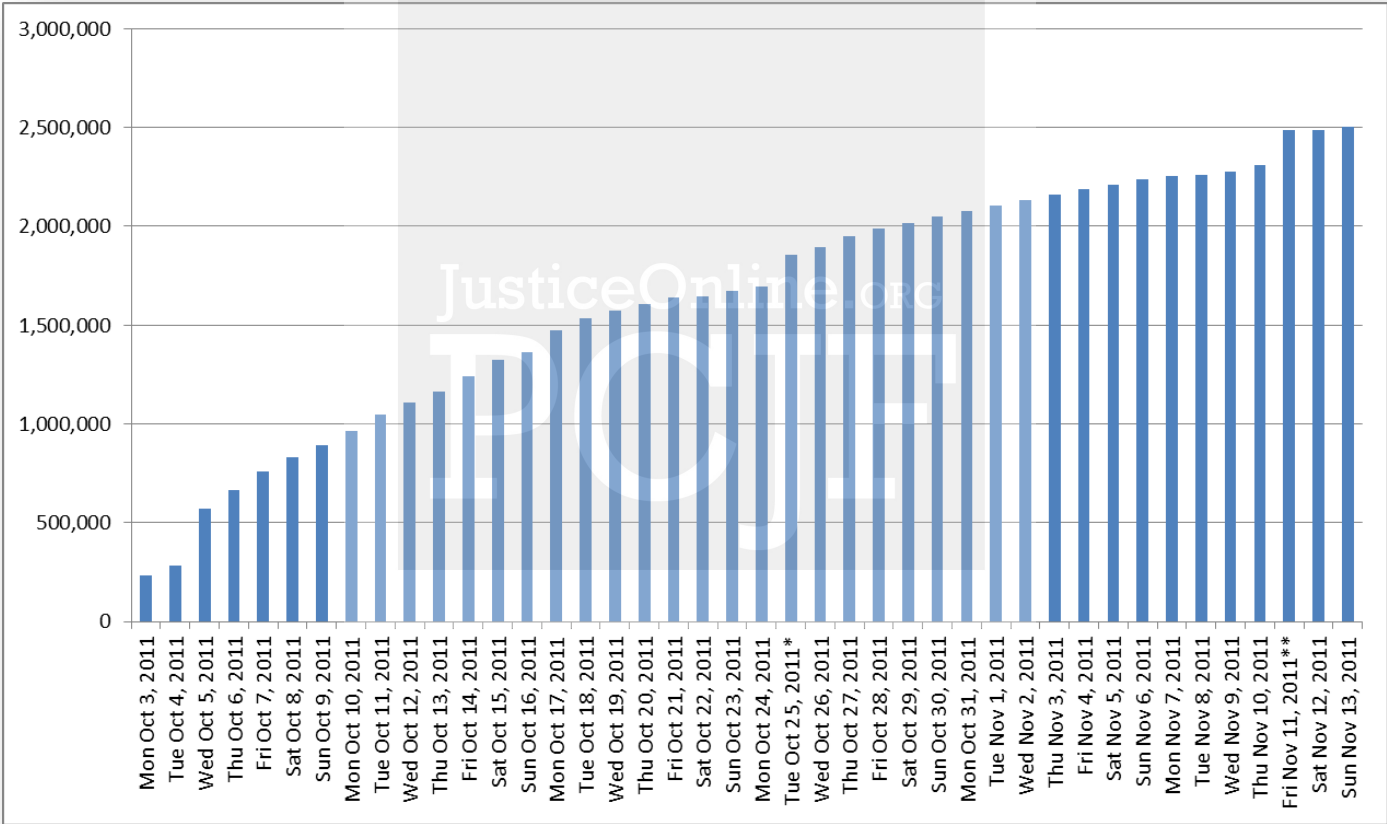
Occupy Movement - Overview

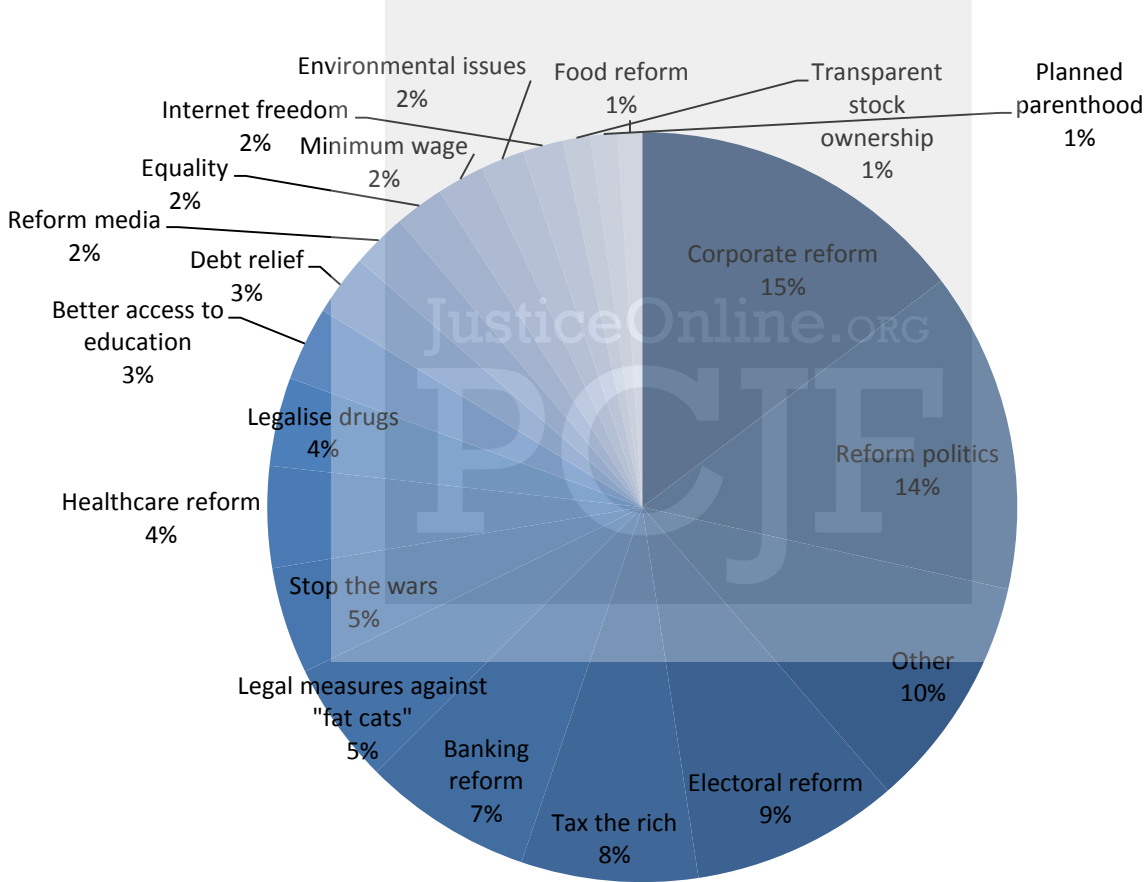

GENERAL ORGANISATION AND COORDINATION

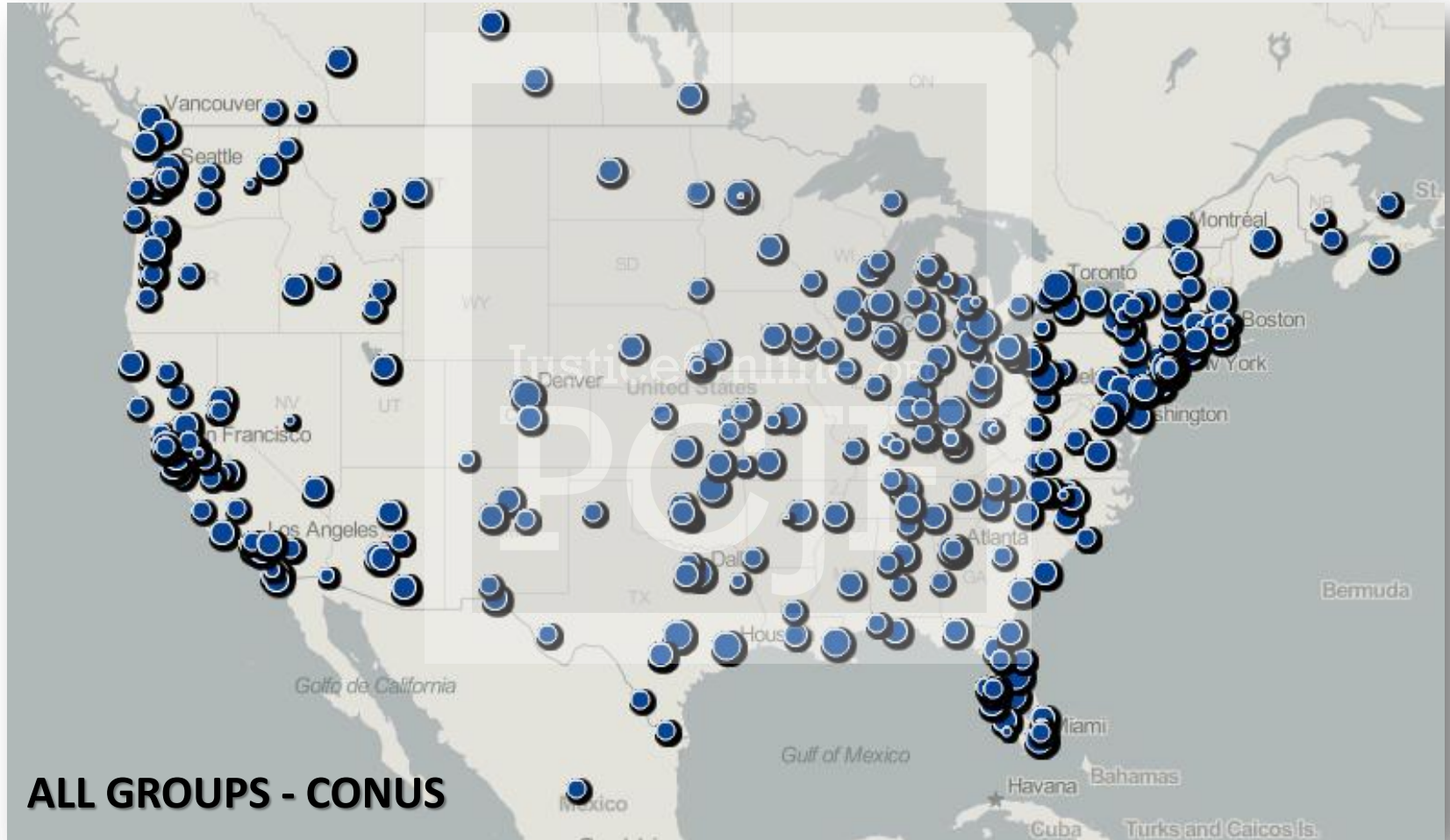

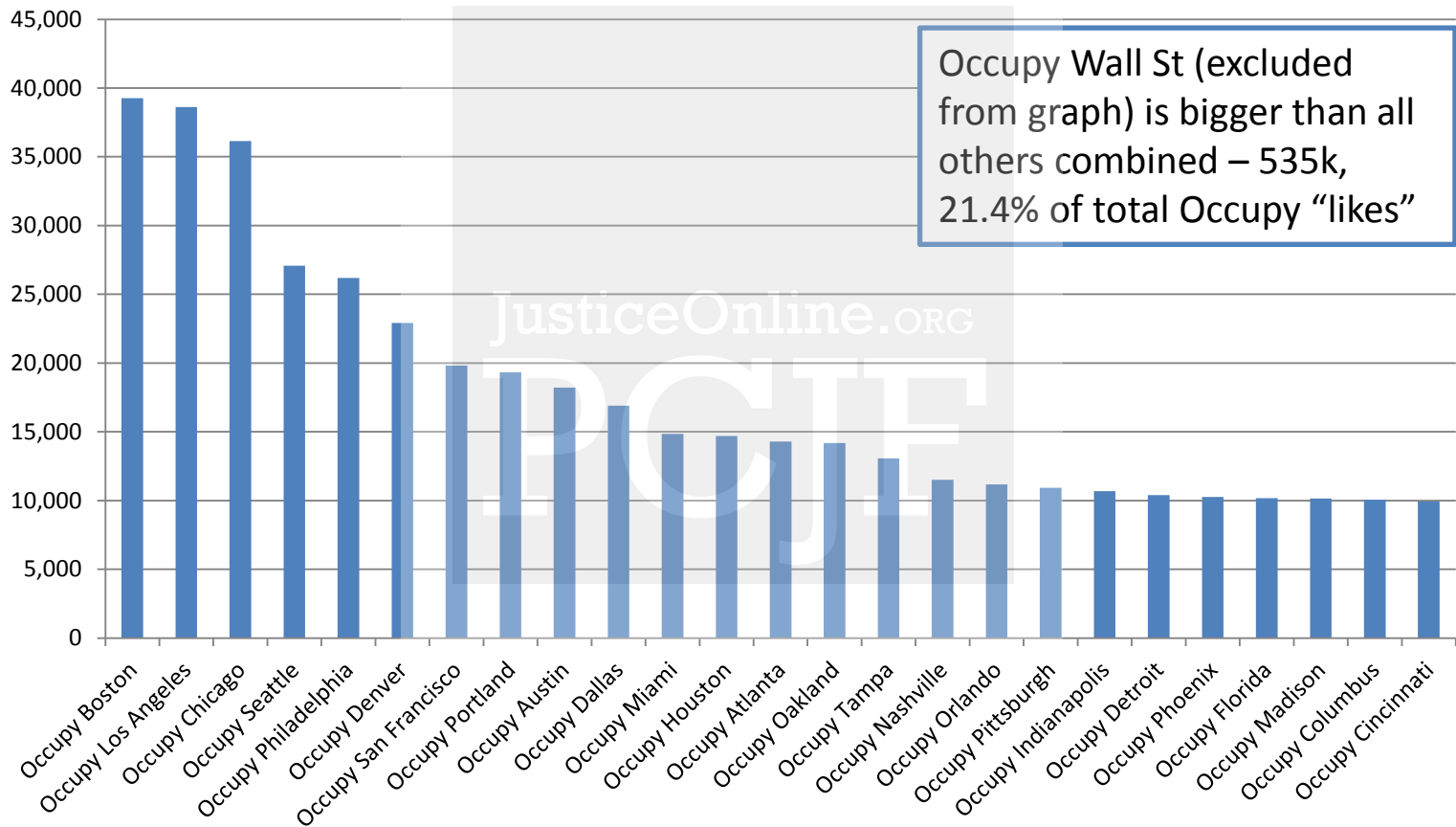

Attitude Towards Retail

- Black Friday and the outpouring of money into retail forms a natural target for the Occupy movement
- Activists who are now involved with Occupy have attempted to launch nationwide boycotts for ten years (Buy Nothing Day); boycott calls are already being seen again from numerous sources, especially with retailers launching very early deals
- There is a major move to try to persuade people instead to “buy local” and support “small business Saturday”
- More worryingly, there have already been numerous calls to directly target malls and there have been incidents in Boulder and Anchorage
- Comments indicate that OWS clearance on 15 Nov has been seen as a move “just in time for Black Friday”
- However, many protestors think that targeting retail would hurt “the 99%” and this is far from being a popular target or tactic

Attitude Towards Retail

- Social media will be used to call for and coordinate boycotts and direct operations; pages related to Black Friday actions have doubled this week
- Whilst retail disruption is therefore to be expected, research suggests widespread support for this sort of move is comparatively unlikely at this stage
- Aim will probably be to get shoppers to “buy local” and publicise the Occupy cause near malls (taking advantage of traffic)
- Direct action against malls is likely to focus on blockading entrances, car parks etc or causing passive disruption
- Most action will take place on public land so that the protestors cannot be moved on
- Groups are likely to be small – anticipate tens more than hundreds
- Within malls, flash mobs are possible (and we know some are being planned), with the aim being to draw attention to the cause

Specific Known Threats

Historical Buy Nothing Day tactics which might be used by Occupy and other protesters:

- Public protests, especially at entrances to Malls
- Credit card cut up: Participants stand in a shopping mall, shopping center, or store with a pair of scissors and a poster that advertises help for people who want to put an end to mounting debt and extortionate interest rates with one simple cut
- Free, non-commercial street parties
- Sit-ins
- Flash mobs
- Alternative mass green transport activities
- Zombie Walk: participants wander around shopping malls or other consumer havens with a blank stare. When asked what they are doing participants describe Buy Nothing Day.
- Disruption in stores, initially posing as legitimate shoppers (e.g. turning up at tills with lots of stuff and then claiming money has “accidentally” been left at home)
- Wildcat General Strike -participants not only embargo stores for twenty-four hours but also obey a “green” strike, so use no power or fuel. This ties in with current 25 November general strike calls

Assessment

- Intent: peaceful. Aim is to drive national boycotting effort
- Occupy Black Friday has numerous smaller imitators, some of which share the name

- Shortage of volunteers has been noted

- Unlikely to inspire direct action outside leafleting; however, may interact with other campaigns

- Group is strongly “liked” but turnout likely to be much lower than group size suggests

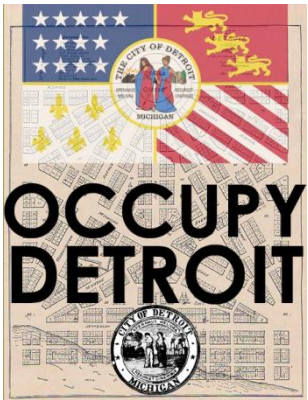

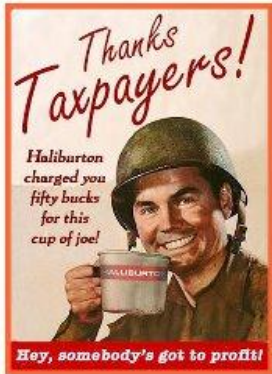

There are also credible indicators of the following:

- Reports of discussed action on Black Friday by:
 - Occupy LA
 - Occupy San Francisco
 - Occupy Jackson
 - Occupy Oregon (targeting Portland Business Alliance members)
 - Occupy Orlando
 - Occupy Santa Cruz
- Evidence that criminals were looking to take advantage of events in Denver on 12 November to loot 16th Street Mall – a possible secondary threat for areas where police are known to be busy elsewhere (as happened in London in August); Denver will remain an area where this is a potential problem
- Wal-Mart, Target, and Best Buy have all repeatedly been cited as the best and most suitable targets for protest activity
- We will continue to monitor, observe and report on threats

Trigger Issues and Trends

The following **factors or events** constitute triggers:

- **Time** – the longer protests go on without real accomplishments, the more the pressure to adopt different (more direct) approaches
- **Site clearances** – are escalatory and force protestors to adopt new tactics in order to continue making their point; winter weather may also force the same
- **A major flashpoint or issue** – significant violent flashpoints may help propel more militant, breakaway splinters to the fore across the wider movement
- **Penetration** – the movement is wary of agents provocateurs. If one were unveiled the consequences are unpredictable, plus it would prove that these fears were real
- **An “official” call for occupying malls** – a call to target malls from one of the major groups (especially OWS) could rapidly rally a great deal of support
- **A high-profile incident in a mall** – this could inspire copycats, although not immediately. The run-up to the holidays will continue to be a period of increased threat
- **Customer deaths on Black Friday** – would encourage direct action before the holidays

Trigger Issues and Trends

The following **dates** are worth noting:

- **Nov 15** – Mass rallies to counter OWS eviction. Interoccupy call at noon will discuss national activity.
- **Nov 16** – likely actions nationwide in response to ongoing clearances
- **Nov 17** – planned international day of action for Occupy groups
- **Nov 25** – Black Friday, with threats as previously mentioned
- **Dec 6-8** – Possible date for planned mass march on the National Mall, DC by groups from around the country (may be accelerated by current clearances)

Risk Advisory Support

Risk advisory and threat awareness support is being provided in the following fashion:

- This brief forms the **baseline assessment** and we are also releasing a slightly reduced version that can be presented directly to security staff
- We are providing **daily risk update briefings**, which will be disseminated via email at noon EST. These will summarise significant events over the last 24 hrs, changes in the threat picture, new strategic issues, emerging tactics, and a look forward at key likely events. They will have a strong predictive element and will also touch on any other threat issues that are noticed
- We will also issue **Alerts** if we get breaking news that requires action before the next daily summary is due (and may call conference calls if there are significant issues)

You are encouraged to interact with the analytical team and pass on any comments, questions, interests or concerns to help ensure that the product meets your needs as best as is possible.

This analysis has been synthesised from numerous open sources and social media posts using intelligence techniques. On occasion human sources have also been used. In the document, references have been omitted for the sake of brevity.

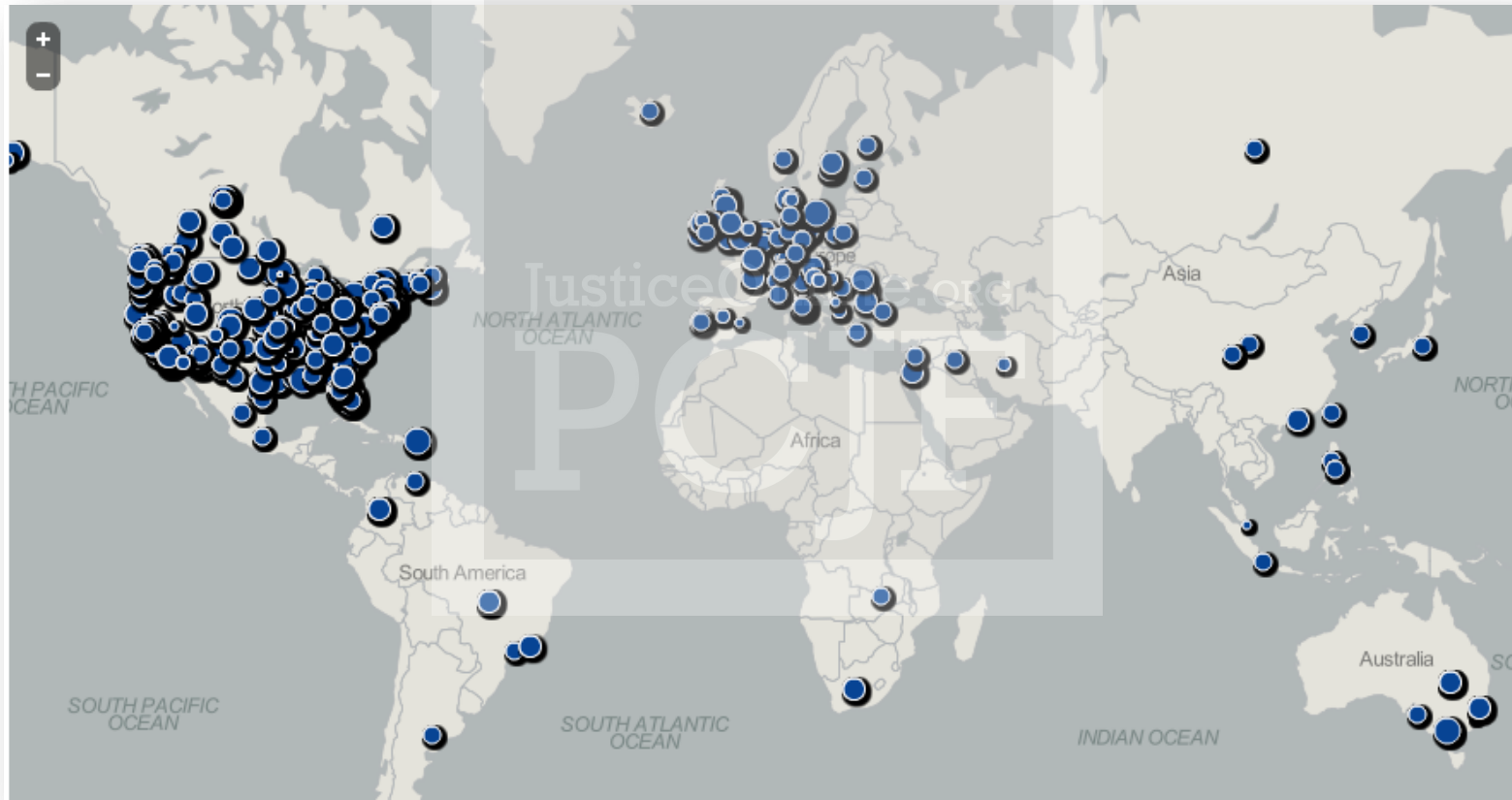

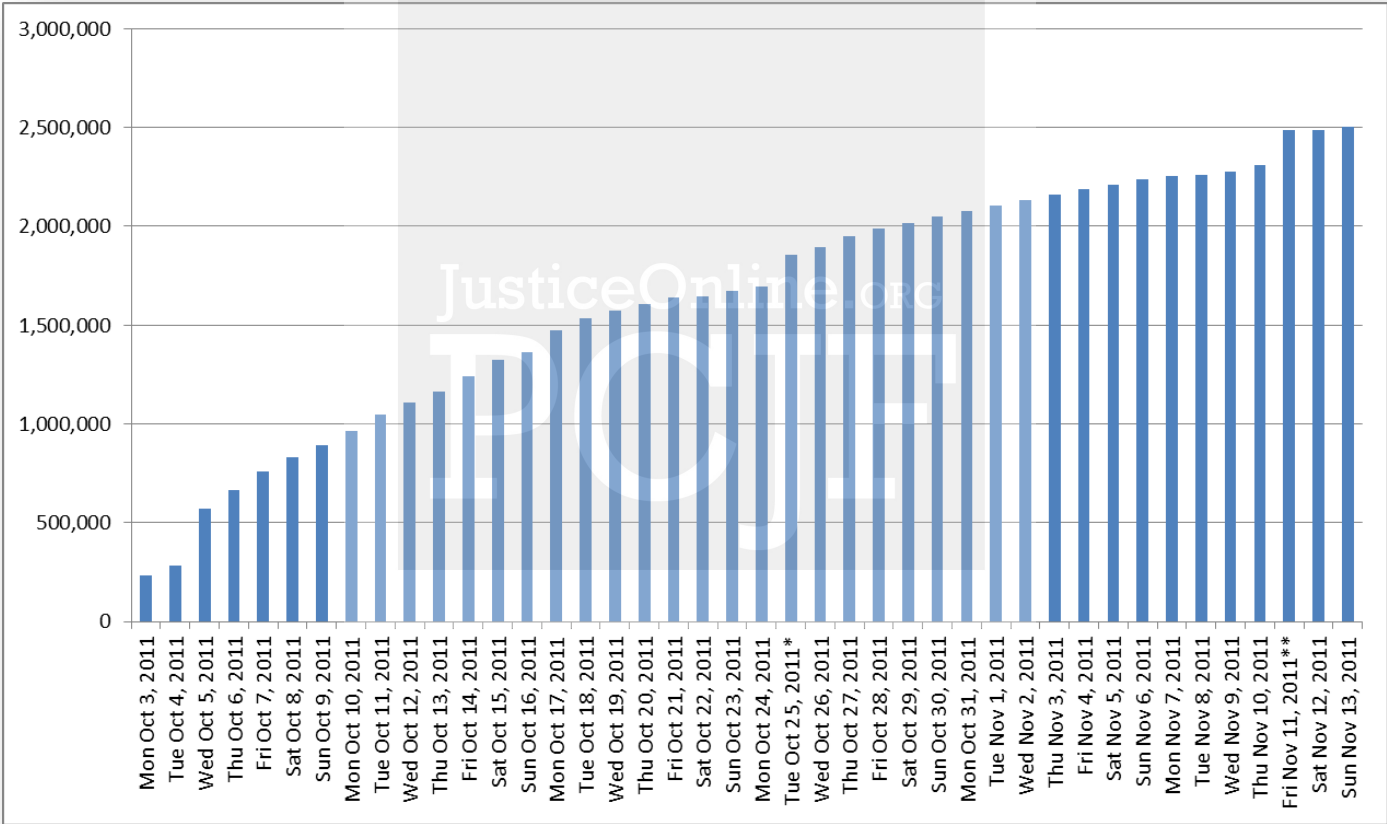

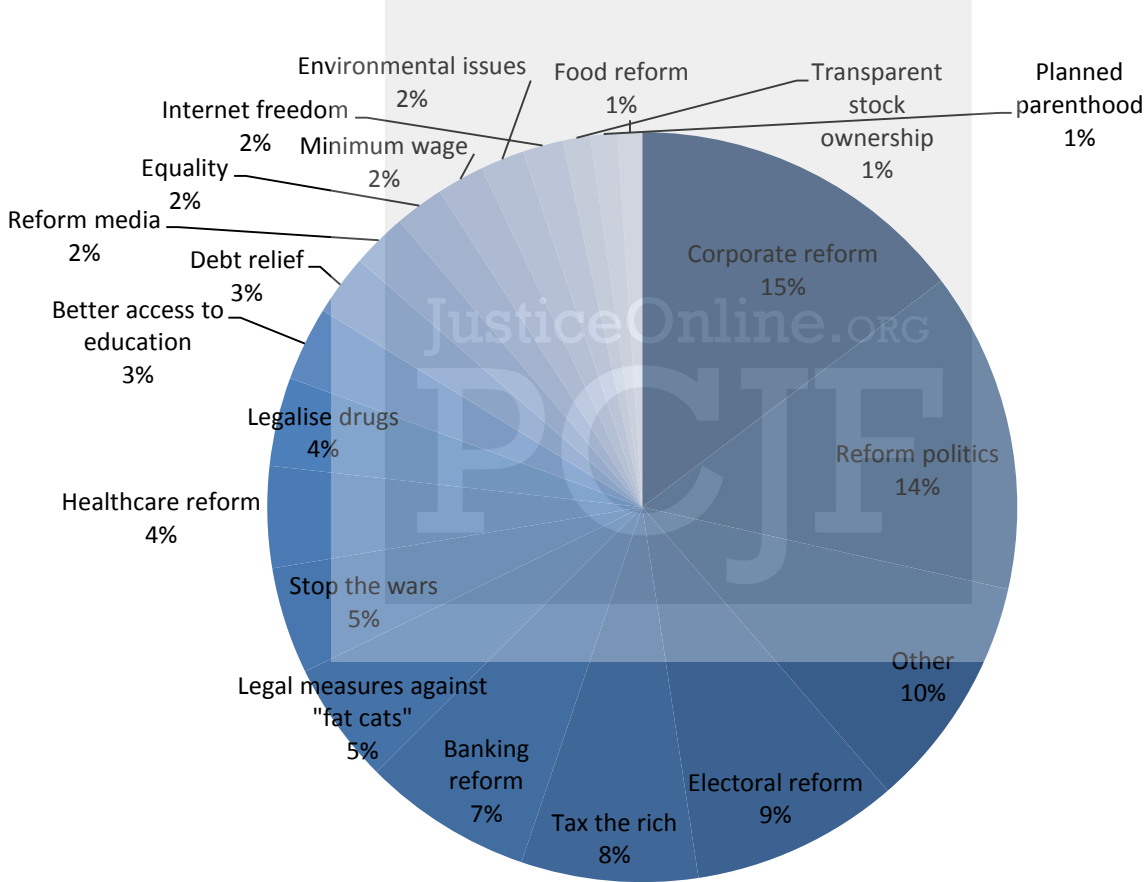

- Some of the Occupy movement is “virtual” rather than physical, possibly in part due to the Anonymous overlap
- The physical parts of the movement are all unique but share certain similar characteristics (described on next slide)
- There are increasing efforts to establish similar structures and improve coordination
- Social media and use of web-based tools has played a very big part in coordination, including enabling national conference calls by the “interoccupy” movement: minutes of these are useful for research
- Training is increasingly being standardised and best practice is being shared through these means

OVERALL CHARACTERISATION AND ASSESSMENT

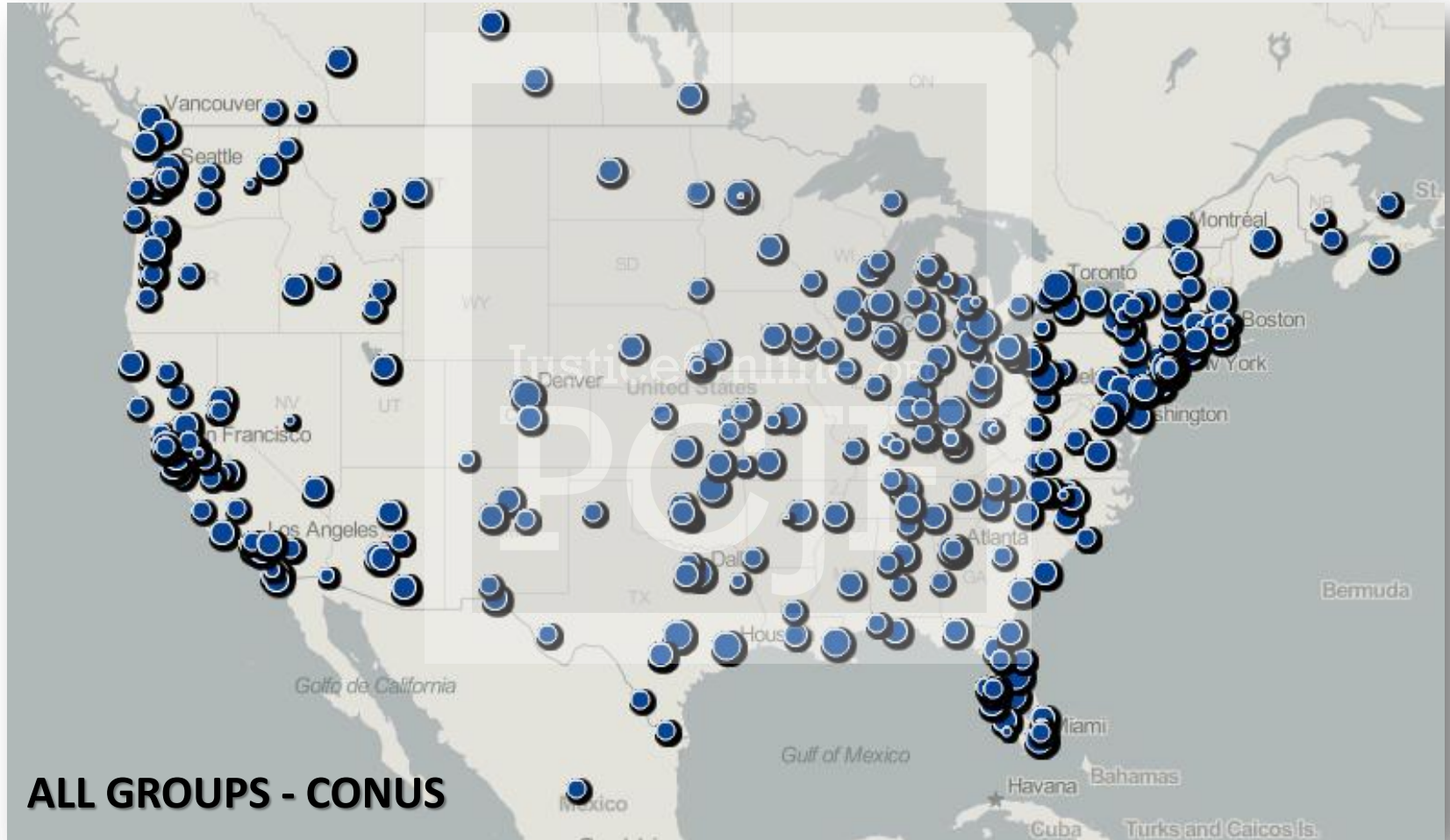
- Occupy encompasses experienced activists, stay-at-home “hacktivists” and a large number of newcomers
- There are concerns within the movement that newcomers do not understand the boundaries of peaceful protest
- Members also fear penetration by elements intent on causing violence (suspecting that some may be agents provocateurs)
- Therefore, Whilst this is genuinely a peaceful resistance movement, we have already seen that violence can flare, especially when there is confrontation with authority figures
- The probability of violence increases as time passes and site clearances continue

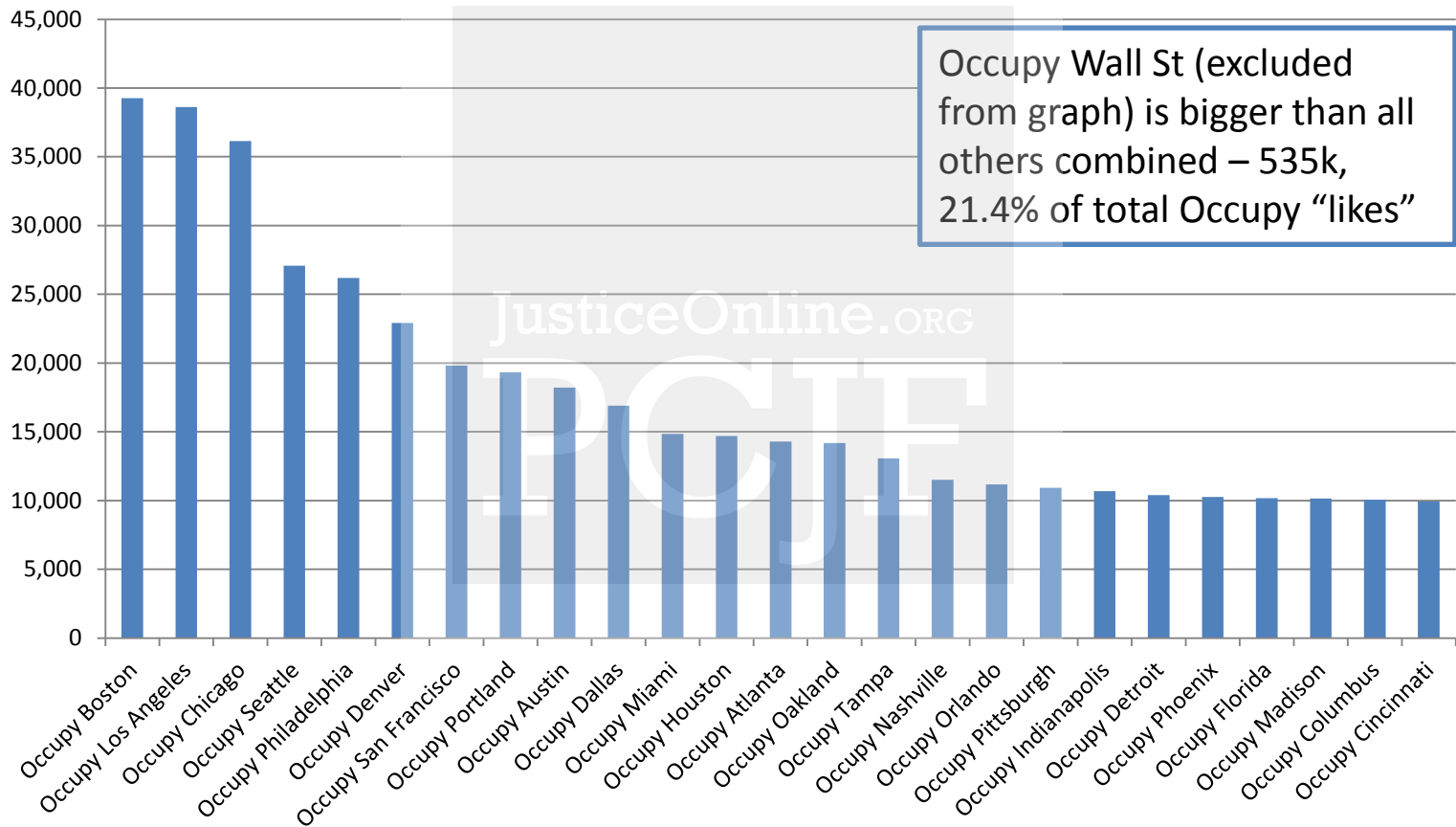
- Occupy has established a strong presence across the US, especially from October onwards

Attitude Towards Retail

- Black Friday and the outpouring of money into retail forms a natural target for the Occupy movement
- Activists who are now involved with Occupy have attempted to launch nationwide boycotts for ten years (Buy Nothing Day); boycott calls are already being seen again from numerous sources, especially with retailers launching very early deals
- There is a major move to try to persuade people instead to “buy local” and support “small business Saturday”
- More worryingly, there have already been numerous calls to directly target malls and there have been incidents in Boulder and Anchorage
- Comments indicate that OWS clearance on 15 Nov has been seen as a move “just in time for Black Friday”
- However, many protestors think that targeting retail would hurt “the 99%” and this is far from being a popular target or tactic

Attitude Towards Retail

- Social media will be used to call for and coordinate boycotts and direct operations; pages related to Black Friday actions have doubled this week
- Whilst retail disruption is therefore to be expected, research suggests widespread support for this sort of move is comparatively unlikely at this stage
- Aim will probably be to get shoppers to “buy local” and publicise the Occupy cause near malls (taking advantage of traffic)
- Direct action against malls is likely to focus on blockading entrances, car parks etc or causing passive disruption
- Most action will take place on public land so that the protestors cannot be moved on
- Groups are likely to be small – anticipate tens more than hundreds
- Within malls, flash mobs are possible (and we know some are being planned), with the aim being to draw attention to the cause

Specific Known Threats

Historical Buy Nothing Day tactics which might be used by Occupy and other protesters:

- Public protests, especially at entrances to Malls
- Credit card cut up: Participants stand in a shopping mall, shopping center, or store with a pair of scissors and a poster that advertises help for people who want to put an end to mounting debt and extortionate interest rates with one simple cut
- Free, non-commercial street parties
- Sit-ins
- Flash mobs
- Alternative mass green transport activities
- Zombie Walk: participants wander around shopping malls or other consumer havens with a blank stare. When asked what they are doing participants describe Buy Nothing Day.
- Disruption in stores, initially posing as legitimate shoppers (e.g. turning up at tills with lots of stuff and then claiming money has “accidentally” been left at home)
- Wildcat General Strike -participants not only embargo stores for twenty-four hours but also obey a “green” strike, so use no power or fuel. This ties in with current 25 November general strike calls

Assessment

- Intent: peaceful. Aim is to drive national boycotting effort
- Occupy Black Friday has numerous smaller imitators, some of which share the name
- Biggest FB group to date, with multiple pages, and responsible for a lot of current
- Is looking for alternatives to “big business” to recommend to people
- Shortage of volunteers has been noted

- Trying to disseminate lists of alternatives
- Serves as one of the main rallying posts for anti-retail efforts

We will also be boycotting and picketing any organization that disciplines any person for joining the general strike. We need everyone to go on strike. The more people, the more effective. No work. - Unlikely to inspire direct action outside leafleting; however, may interact with other campaigns

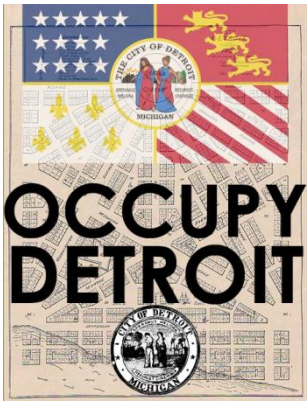

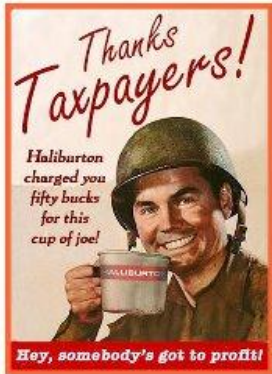

Specific Known Threats

There are also credible indicators of the following:

- Reports of discussed action on Black Friday by:
 - Occupy LA
 - Occupy San Francisco
 - Occupy Jackson
 - Occupy Oregon (targeting Portland Business Alliance members)
 - Occupy Orlando
 - Occupy Santa Cruz
- Evidence that criminals were looking to take advantage of events in Denver on 12 November to loot 16th Street Mall – a possible secondary threat for areas where police are known to be busy elsewhere (as happened in London in August); Denver will remain an area where this is a potential problem
- Wal-Mart, Target, and Best Buy have all repeatedly been cited as the best and most suitable targets for protest activity
- We will continue to monitor, observe and report on threats

Trigger Issues and Trends

The following **factors or events** constitute triggers:

- **Time** – the longer protests go on without real accomplishments, the more the pressure to adopt different (more direct) approaches
- **Site clearances** – are escalatory and force protestors to adopt new tactics in order to continue making their point; winter weather may also force the same
- **A major flashpoint or issue** – significant violent flashpoints may help propel more militant, breakaway splinters to the fore across the wider movement
- **Penetration** – the movement is wary of agents provocateurs. If one were unveiled the consequences are unpredictable, plus it would prove that these fears were real
- **An “official” call for occupying malls** – a call to target malls from one of the major groups (especially OWS) could rapidly rally a great deal of support
- **A high-profile incident in a mall** – this could inspire copycats, although not immediately. The run-up to the holidays will continue to be a period of increased threat
- **Customer deaths on Black Friday** – would encourage direct action before the holidays

Trigger Issues and Trends

The following **dates** are worth noting:

- **Nov 15** – Mass rallies to counter OWS eviction. Interoccupy call at noon will discuss national activity.
- **Nov 16** – likely actions nationwide in response to ongoing clearances
- **Nov 17** – planned international day of action for Occupy groups
- **Nov 25** – Black Friday, with threats as previously mentioned
- **Dec 6-8** – Possible date for planned mass march on the National Mall, DC by groups from around the country (may be accelerated by current clearances)

Risk Advisory Support

Risk advisory and threat awareness support is being provided in the following fashion:

- This brief forms the **baseline assessment** and we are also releasing a slightly reduced version that can be presented directly to security staff
- We are providing **daily risk update briefings**, which will be disseminated via email at noon EST. These will summarise significant events over the last 24 hrs, changes in the threat picture, new strategic issues, emerging tactics, and a look forward at key likely events. They will have a strong predictive element and will also touch on any other threat issues that are noticed
- We will also issue **Alerts** if we get breaking news that requires action before the next daily summary is due (and may call conference calls if there are significant issues)

This analysis has been synthesised from numerous open sources and social media posts using intelligence techniques. On occasion human sources have also been used. In the document, references have been omitted for the sake of brevity.

Analyst Notes: Russell Simmons is the co-founder of Def Jams record label, as well as the creator of clothing fashion line Phat Farm. Simmons is an elite figure in the hip-hop community. Simmons announced a recommended amendment to the Constitution

– barring all, but public financing, for Federal candidates running for public office. ⁱⁱ He also announced his plan to participate in the march at 5:00 PM with OB.

- 12:00 PM, 15 November 2011: Strike Captains' Training at Medical Campus at the HMS Quadrangle. (Harvard Custodial Workers)
- 2:30 PM, 15 November 2011: Strike Captains' Training at the Courtyard in front of the Science Center and Burden Hall at the Business School. (Harvard Custodial Workers)
- 3:30 PM, 15 November 2011: Protest at President Drew Faust's speech at Loeb Drama Center, 64 Brattle St. (Harvard Custodial Workers)
- 4:30 PM, 15 November 2011: Harvard Custodial Workers Rally in Dewey Square. Harvard Custodians will be protesting / rallying outside of the Harvard Management Company located at 600 Atlantic Ave. (the Federal Reserve building). (Harvard Custodial Workers)

Analyst Notes: The BRIC has no reason to believe OB or Occupy Harvard will be participating in these events; however with the close proximity of protests in Harvard to Occupy Harvard and the Federal Reserve Bank to OB, it is possible these groups will show support to the custodial workers. In addition, OB has showed support for past labor union marches. OB has posted this event on their website, however, it is not on their calendar.

SEIU Local 615 represents approximately 335 custodians at Harvard University, and on 13 November 2011 approximately 230 custodians voted inside the First Parish Church in Cambridge to strike.

At this time the BRIC has information that Occupy Boston will conduct a solidarity march at approximately 5:00 PM starting from Dewey Square (see above); however, there is no further information to indicate the route that this march will take. There is no information at this time to indicate that Occupy Boston is involved in the protest outside the Federal Reserve building; however, the proximity in time and location to the Occupy Boston solidarity march set for 5:00 PM should be noted for the potential for the groups to merge. We will continue to assess publically available open sources regarding this march and provide updates as more information becomes available.

- 5:00 PM, 15 November 2011: Strike Captains' Training at 3 locations: (Harvard Custodial Workers)
 - Courtyard in front of Science Center
 - Main Yard by the John Harvard Statue
 - Burden Hall at the Business School

Events Scheduled for Wednesday, 16 November 2011 ⁱⁱⁱ

- No significant events planned for Wednesday, 16 November 2011. Normal weekly meetings will continue to take place.

Events Scheduled for Thursday, 17 November 2011^{iv}

- 4:00 PM, 17 November 2011: Jobs Not Cuts March. Mass Uniting in collaboration with Jobs for Justice, Occupy Boston, and Occupy the Hood. Exact route is unknown; they will depart Dewey Square at 4:00 PM.

Analyst Notes: BU Occupies put this march on their Facebook page last week stating their support and plan to participate. The participation from other universities is also possible. United for Justice with Peace, Mass Nurses and Mass Green Rainbow Party will also likely participate. This march has the potential to draw hundreds of participants. This day is also the 2 month anniversary of the Occupy Wall Street movement and has received significant attention on Twitter. The plans are likely to remain fluid in the days leading up to 17 November. The BRIC will provide updates as necessary.

Occupy Boston Recent Actions

- Nothing Significant to Report.

General Notes Regarding Occupy Boston

- Harvard University janitors (participants and supporters of Occupy Harvard) have voted to authorize a strike if contract negotiations fail; their contract expires at midnight tonight, Tuesday, 15 November 2011. The occupation inside Harvard Yard will continue at least until then. **They have multiple actions planned throughout the day today, see above for more details.**
- Northeastern University began an occupation on Sunday, 13 November 2011. About 40 students and 4 tents are set up on Krentzman Quadrangle (360 Huntington Ave.). Northeastern will be occupying this area of 48 hours; the group has until 4:00 PM on Tuesday, 15 November 2011 to disperse according to NUPD. **Occupy Northeastern announced their presence in the quad will end at 3:45 PM today, prior to marching down to Dewey Square to join OB for the 5:00 PM march.**

General Notes Regarding the Occupy Movement:

- **Zuccotti Park in NYC was cleared early this morning by police; approximately 70 people have been arrested. The Mayor and company that own the park decided to clear the park due to health and fire safety hazards to the protestors and surrounding community. According to open source materials, the protestors will be allowed back in the park, but will not be allowed to stay overnight. The National Lawyers Guild of NY obtained a temporary restraining order against the City of New York directing that occupiers be allowed back on the premises with their belongings.**

Analyst Notes: The situation in NY is rapidly developing and changing; exact stipulations of the return of protestors are unknown at this time. The BRIC will update as the situation evolves.

A number of weapons were discovered in New York's Zuccotti Park after Occupy Wall Street protesters were evicted by the Police Department last week, law enforcement sources tell FoxNews.com.

Gardeners employed by the park owners, Brookfield Properties, to clean up the mess made by occupiers during their two-month stay discovered knives and other potential instruments of violence in flower beds throughout the public space, according to officials.

"We (NYPD) aren't taking the weapons, building security is," said a high-ranking officer who spoke on the condition of anonymity. "Security at the Brookfield building across from Zuccotti. They have all the weapons."

Officials from the NYPD would only confirm that one knife was found buried in a planter on Tuesday. But the haul was believed large enough for Brookfield Security workers to collect them in the real estate company's headquarters across from the park.

It was not immediately clear what security at Brookfield will do with the weapons. A spokeswoman for the company declined comment.

A court motion related to the clearing of the park filed by Deputy Mayor Cas Holloway last week noted that, "Makeshift items that can be used as weapons, such as cardboard tubes with metal pipes inside, had been observed among the occupiers' possessions."

"It was our understanding that the protester may have had a significant number of items that could be potentially used as weapons," read the statement.

The motion also noted that "knives, mace and hypodermic needles were observed discarded onto the roadway," after an Oct.1 Occupy Wall Street march across the Brooklyn Bridge.

The motion also notes that since the protests began in Zuccotti Park on Sept. 17, "approximately 73 misdemeanor and felony complaints and 50 arrests," have occurred, and a number of repeat and violent offenders were spotted in and around the park.

Requests for comment from City Hall were not immediately returned.

Lastly, I fully comprehend that because I placed an announcement on the DC IMC about Climate Action Week, that the security network in the district noticed it and showed up at GreenGov to attempt to prevent us from attending the climate change plenary session in our protest mode. However, in discussion with others at both camps, we have decided that it would be even worse to be anonymous. We have spiritual duty to defend Mother Earth uncompromisingly from the greed, hatred, and delusion of the confused, postmodern humanity. Friends, that's just the way it is.







Occupy Phoenix to protest on light rail Thursday

Protesters involved with the Phoenix version of the anti-Wall Street movement say they are planning to “occupy the light rail” on Thursday.

Speaking on behalf of Occupy Phoenix, Ezra Kaplan said protesters will board the light rail trains at 7 a.m. Thursday at three major stops: Sycamore/ Main in Mesa; Washington/Central in downtown Phoenix; and Montebello/19th Avenue.

“The goal is to hit the rush-hour traffic (on the light rail),” Kaplan said. “Once the rush-hour traffic calms down, it (the protest) will probably taper off.”

Kaplan said the group also is planning a flash mob that would take place in the downtown business and entertainment areas around noon on Thursday.

The group also is planning a rally on Friday. Kaplan said it will likely begin in the afternoon.

A steady group of Occupy Phoenix protesters has met every day at Cesar Chavez Plaza in downtown Phoenix near City Hall, where police have been monitoring the group to ensure, among other things, that the protesters are obeying the city's no-camping law. This law bars protesters from spending the night on the plaza.

Protesters have objected about the law to the Phoenix City Council, but the nine-member council has declined to offer the group a waiver. The protesters also asked for public port-a-potties. They have been using restrooms at nearby businesses and public buildings.

Last week, Phoenix police spokesman Sgt Trent Crump said that since the protest began in mid-October, 50 protesters have been arrested. Crump said some of the protesters were cited for violations of the no-camping law, as well as issues with public urination and defecation.

The protesters argue that the police and other city officials are unfairly portraying them as homeless people.

Have the feeling you'll soon be wearing handcuffs and an orange jumpsuit? The "I'm Getting Arrested" app for Android will automatically send out an alert as soon as the cops say "freeze!"

Desperate times call for desperate measures - and also some nifty new apps! Android developer Jason Van Anden, a self-described "artist/technologist," has created a new app inspired by the Occupy Wall Street movement, after a friend was nearly arrested during one of the protests.

Aptly titled "I'm Getting Arrested," Van Anden's free app allows users to "Alert your lawyer, loved ones, etc. that you are being arrested" with a single click, according to the app's description on the Android Market.

"It's a technology that fits well with democracy," Van Anden told The Brooklyn Paper.

I'm Getting Arrested has a very simply functionality. A user must first write a text message in the space provided, and list the phone numbers of the people he or she wishes to contact in case of incarceration. That message is then saved, and a giant bull's eye appears on the screen. A user must the simply tap the bull's eye, and the message goes out to the various contacts listed via SMS.

Of course, there are a few downsides to the app. First, you have to know that there's a chance you might get arrested. Second, you have to have the wherewithal to pull out your phone and send the message if things start to get dicey. Still, it's much better than nothing, and seems to us solid, at least in concept.

Van Anden says that he is not, himself, an Occupy Wall Street protester, but said he "was glad that I was able to contribute something with my skill-set." He says that he hopes to release a version for Apple's iOS devices soon.

I have received several calls regarding the Occupy Wall Street. This is what i have so far. Approximately, 175 arrests with two non-life threatening injuries to two officers.

One police officer was slashed and a second cop was taken to a local hospital with an eye injury-- after clashes between protesters and activists across lower Manhattan. Both officers are said to be in stable condition.

The Wall Street area was cordoned off with metal barricades and officers.

The NYPD set up a checkpoint where NYSE employees could enter the plaza. A few hundred protesters massed there, and heckled the arriving workers with chants of, "Shame! Shame! Shame!" and "Shut it down!" Some protesters blocked traffic on a roadway in the Financial District. The NYPD responded by peacefully got the group back to the sidewalk.

The protesters appeared to number between 1,000 and 2,000, although they had splintered into numerous, smaller groups, making an accurate assessment difficult.

There, a couple hundred protesters, their ranks depleted with the passing hours.

The group announced it would rally near the New York Stock Exchange, then fan out across Manhattan and head to subways, before gathering downtown and marching over the Brooklyn bridge.

Organizers say the loss of the Zuccotti Park campsite may help broaden the movement. The head of the group's finances says it will open a dialogue with organizers in other cities and take the protest to the next level.

A judge in New York ruled Tuesday that the protesters could return to Zuccotti but could not set up camp. Currently protesters are forming up in lower Manhattan to attempt to walk across Brooklyn Bridge. NYPD is also preparing i will keep you advised.

December 13, Bellingham Herald – (Washington) Bellingham protesters arrested after blocking railroad tracks; about a dozen arrested. Bellingham, Washington police arrested about a dozen protesters after they linked themselves together and laid down on railroad tracks for more than 3 hours December 12. About 80 to 100 protesters blocked the tracks and an intersection near downtown Bellingham starting at noon, in what they said was a show of solidarity with Occupy Oakland and other events aimed at shutting down ports on the West Coast. After several warnings from police, most of the protesters moved away from the tracks except for a handful who refused to move. Several had connected themselves together with bicycle locks around their necks. Around 3 p.m., officers began arresting protesters one at a time. Arrests lasted several hours because officers had to use a saw to cut the bike locks on some protesters' necks. Those arrested were put onto a bus to Whatcom County Jail, where a police spokesman said they likely would remain overnight on suspicion of second-degree criminal trespassing, and obstructing an officer. The protest reportedly delayed two trains, one heading north and the other south, though that could not be confirmed with Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway (BNSF) December 12. In response to constant police surveillance, violence, and arrests, Occupy Wall Street protesters and legal observers have been turning their cameras back on the police.

The police may soon be watching you in your garden picking your vegetables or your bottom. As police plans for increasing unmanned aerial surveillance take shape <<http://www.guardian.co.uk/uk/2010/jan/23/cctv-sky-police-plan-drones>>, there is a new twist. Private citizens can now buy their own surveillance drones to watch the police.

This week in New York, Occupy Wall Street <<http://www.guardian.co.uk/world/occupy-wall-street>> protesters have a new toy to help them expose potentially dubious actions of the New York police department. In response to constant police surveillance, police violence and thousands of arrests, Occupy Wall Street protesters and legal observers have been turning their cameras back on the police. But police have sometimes made filming difficult through physical obstruction and "frozen zones". This occurred most notably during the

eviction of protesters from Zuccotti Park in lower Manhattan <<http://www.guardian.co.uk/news/blog/2011/nov/15/occupy-wall-street-police-action-live>>, where police prevented even credentialed journalists from entering.

Now the protesters are fighting back with their own surveillance drone. Tim Pool, an Occupy Wall Street protester <http://www.time.com/time/video/player/0,32068,1279751069001_2099632,00.html>, has acquired a Parrot AR drone he amusingly calls the "occucopter". It is a lightweight four-rotor helicopter that you can buy cheaply on Amazon and control with your iPhone. It has an onboard camera so that you can view everything on your phone that it points at. Pool has modified the software to stream live video to the internet so that we can watch the action as it unfolds. You can see video clips of his first experiments here <<http://www.ustream.tv/timcast>>. He told us that the reason he is doing this "comes back to giving ordinary people the same tools that these multimillion-dollar news corporations have. It provides a clever loophole around certain restrictions such as when the police block press from taking shots of an incident."

Pool is attempting to police-proof the device: "We are trying to get a stable live feed so you can have 50 people controlling it in series. If the cops see you controlling it from a computer they can shut you down, but then control could automatically switch to someone else."

This is clever stuff and it doesn't stop there. He is also working on a 3G controller so that "you could even control the occucopter in New York from Sheffield in England". We asked him if he was concerned about police shooting it down. "No," he said firmly. "They can't just fire a weapon in the air because it could seriously hurt someone. They would have no excuse because the occucopter is strictly not illegal. Their only recourse would be to make it illegal, but it is only a toy and so they might as well make the press illegal – they have already arrested 30 journalists here."

Ordinary people having the technology to watch the watcher is not something George Orwell predicted in his futuristic vision of 1984. He introduced us to the idea of a totalitarian state using total surveillance to suppress the entire population. This is why CCTV cameras and police drones watching us unseen sends shivers down the spines of so many of us. We are not so much worried about the current political establishment than we are about the possibility of a technology that enables the creation of a repressive regime.

That might be less likely to happen when the same surveillance systems are turned back on the authorities. But it is not all good news. These devices could also extend the range of potential breaches of privacy. You could fly over your neighbour's garden or up to their bedroom window. And drones could be a great asset for criminals to "case a joint" or to keep watch for the police.

There are also concerns that the roll-out of citizen drones might be disingenuously used by the police to justify and speed up police acquisition and use of drones for the surveillance of protests. Police departments in the UK and across the US are eager to use drones, but there

has been little or no debate about the impacts on public safety, privacy and liberty. And there has certainly been no public engagement about this expansion of police surveillance.

It will probably not be long before there are test cases in court or before legislation is introduced to ground citizen drones. Our spirits were lifted talking to Pool about his occuicopter, yet we feel uneasy about the ever-increasing use of drone surveillance. Like all tools they can be used for both good and bad, and for repression and resistance.

The question is, do we really want the paranoid nightmare of our airspace being polluted by police and personal drones with all of us watching our watchers? We are not sure how this will unfold, but we are sure that the outcome will be as unpredictable as the technological developments themselves.

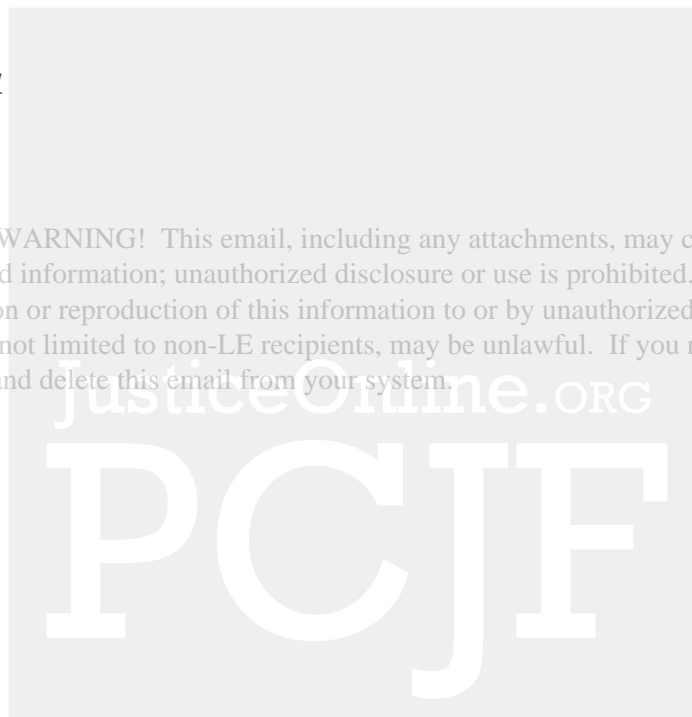

Violence Escalates in "Occupy" Protests - As some protesters in the expanding Occupy movement clash with police, municipalities across the U.S. are grappling with the proper use of public use and security issues. Violence was seen from coast to coast, as arrests were made in Atlanta the same week that Oakland police deployed tear gas to disperse protestors. The now international movement, which began as Occupy Wall Street in lower Manhattan, has seen pockets of violence from both participants and detractors. [In Portland, the Occupy Maine encampment was targeted with a small, liquid-based IED, which fortunately, did not seriously injure anyone.](#)

Assessment: As the movement's duration approaches two months, some communities continue to suffer. A recent [article](#) said that unsanitary conditions at these protests could lead to disease, consistent with complaints lodged by neighbors of the downtown NYC protest. Another concern is the fire hazard, specifically, the use of gasoline heaters and generators, especially with the approach of winter. Emergency responders should prepare for more weather-related medical calls and possible trauma injuries if protests turn more violent.

1. Ceremonial Flyover of the IWO JIMA Memorial will be conducted at approximately 0740 hours local, by two (2) MV-22 OSPREYS
2. Parachute jump by the "RANGER GROUP" will be conducted at approximately 0800 hours local to kick off the event.

Severe Weather- Overview: The National Weather Service (NWS) reports a winter storm has impacted the interior Mid-Atlantic and Northeastern states and will continue to affect these areas through tonight. Winter Storm Warnings are in effect from West Virginia (WV) to eastern Maine (ME).

The NWS reports the heaviest snowfall amounts are forecast to fall in a band from extreme northern Maryland (MD) northeastward through New Jersey (NJ) and western Massachusetts (MA) into eastern ME; lighter slushy snow accumulations are possible for the major cities of the Mid-Atlantic and the Northeast. High Wind Warnings for gusts up to 60 mph are in effect for coastal areas from middle Long Island and southern Connecticut (CT) up to eastern ME, including Boston, MA. Coastal Flood Warnings are in effect for coastal areas of MD, Delaware, NJ, and Cape Cod, MA.

A NWS Liaison at the Federal Aviation Administration Command Center briefed top level air traffic planners on the coming event to facilitate preparation for staffing and logistics. New York (NY) aviation interests were briefed both from a flight planning and ground operations perspective. Open source media reports airports including John F. Kennedy, LaGuardia, Newark Liberty International, Reagan National, and Philadelphia International are posting delays and cancellations due to weather. Portions of Interstate 84 in CT, Interstate 287 in NJ, Interstate

78 in PA, and Interstate 87 in NY have been closed. Amtrak service along the Keystone Corridor between Harrisburg and Philadelphia, PA has been disrupted due to downed trees and weather related infrastructure issues.

In PA, approximately 417,000 customers are without power; 197,000 in NJ; 159,000 in CT; 78,000 in NY; 28,000 in WV, and 28,000 in MD

(U//FOUO) Executive Summary: An article entitled ‘When Should You Shoot a Cop?’ was discovered on October 31, 2011 at an Occupy Phoenix encampment. The article has been circulating the internet and in paper form since June 2011. Police have no credible information that the article poses additional threats to law enforcement safety, however, vigilance and situational awareness is encouraged.

(U//FOUO) Scope: Provide law enforcement officers with situational awareness regarding the two-page article ‘When Should You Shoot a Cop?’ discovered at an Occupy Phoenix encampment.

(U//FOUO) Background: Copblock.org is an organization that seeks to expose police corruption, false arrest, and brutality through online postings of news articles and videos of police brutality. On June 28, 2011, an article entitled ‘When Should You Shoot a Cop’ was published on Copblock.org.¹ Police discovered the article in the form of a flyer at an ‘Occupy Phoenix’ encampment on October 31, 2011.



- The Occupy Phoenix movement is an extension of the national ‘Occupy Wall Street’ movement where participants, exercising their first amendment rights, protest against social and economic inequality, government corruption, and corporate greed, especially in the financial services sector.
- The ‘Occupy Wall Street’ movement has been heralded by the media as America’s Arab Spring. The Arab Spring is a wave of demonstrations in Arab countries beginning in 2010, where protestors used civil resistance, strikes, demonstrations, and social media to organize actions and awareness of the cause. Many Arab Spring demonstrations resulted in violent responses from government forces.

(U//FOUO) Overview: The author of the two-page ‘When Should You Shoot a Cop?’ article characterizes the government as a tyrannical regime backed by police officers dubbed as “mercenaries, hired thugs and jackboots.” The paper focuses on one central point:

If a police officer violates your rights (freedom of speech, right to bear arms, freedom from unreasonable search and seizure) then you have the choice to either submit or kill the officer

The author draws parallels to atrocities committed in the Hitler, Lenin, and Chairman Mao regimes where citizens were treated like sub-humans and gunned down in the street by corrupt and violent ‘law enforcement officials.’ Readers are told that they have the right to stop corrupt police, which “will almost always require killing them.”

(U//FOUO) Outlook: The article ‘When Should You Shoot a Cop?’ has been circulating online and in hard copy since June of 2011. Although many readers agreed with the substance of the article, numerous people who posted online responses patently disagree with the author’s thesis calling it dangerous, over the top, and absurd. Phoenix Police investigating the discovery of the flyer said there were no credible threats against law enforcement officers as a result of the discovery. The District’s Occupy Wall Street movement is active however; there has been no local discovery of the document in protest encampments and no local attempts to harm police monitoring the movement.

Statement from Chief Lanier regarding Occupy DC

(Washington, DC) While the Occupy DC movement has been here since October 6, 2011 and the Metropolitan Police Department supports an individual's right to assemble, we do not condone nor will we tolerate violence or aggression. Prior demonstrations had been peaceful. However, the aggressive nature of Friday's demonstration prompted the Metropolitan Police Department to adjust tactics as needed to ensure safety.

MPD will continue to protect life (residents, visitors, protestors --everyone) and property as warranted. The administration will do what's necessary to maintain order in the city and to ensure that everyone is safe.

Five people that we are aware of were injured. That is no longer a peaceful protest. Demonstrators have become increasingly confrontational and violent toward uninvolved bystanders and motorists. Statement from Chief Lanier regarding Occupy DC

(Washington, DC) While the Occupy DC movement has been here since October 6, 2011 and the Metropolitan Police Department supports an individual's right to assemble, we do not condone nor will we tolerate violence or aggression. Prior demonstrations had been peaceful. However, the aggressive nature of Friday's demonstration prompted the Metropolitan Police Department to adjust tactics as needed to ensure safety.

MPD will continue to protect life (residents, visitors, protestors --everyone) and property as warranted. The administration will do what's necessary to maintain order in the city and to ensure that everyone is safe.

Five people that we are aware of were injured. That is no longer a peaceful protest. Demonstrators have become increasingly confrontational and violent toward uninvolved bystanders and motorists. Demonstrators have also jeopardized the safety of their own children by using them in blockades. The following videos highlight such actions by demonstrators:

Mark, thank you so very much for handling this request. It's a real time pressure cooker for me. For your record, I'm the Intelligence Analyst for Metro Nashville PD, in Nashville TN, and liaison to the TN FC. I've been tasked to produce an overview of Occupy movement activities in various cities around the nation, to be disseminated to all our Chiefs tomorrow morning at 1000 hrs.

The purpose of the product is to generate an accurate threat assessment, provide for officer safety, prepare contingency plans, and ensure the safety of citizens and protection of civil rights. In other words, we need to know what other agencies have faced and the effectiveness of their actions and responses.

I am aware that tri-'state' law enforcement has been very involved in dealing with this movement, and am hopeful our department can benefit from your experience. The fact that you've received movement information from distant locations will be especially beneficial, I'm sure.

Your selection of information will certainly be the most appropriate; however, if it's necessary to reduce any labor requirements, you'll find a worksheet attached outlining the information we're gathering. Much of it just requires an 'X' in a block. Below is the basic framework we're working with, though I think the attachment is self explanatory; the intended emphasis is on understanding the movement development, growth and stated issues, and on establishing appropriate planning for LE and citizen protections.

LE Agencies experiencing Occupy activity:

- Agency type [state, local?]
- Agency name [a POC would be fabulous]
- What type of issues are there [i.e. safety, property damage, assaults, drugs, theft, threats to LE; any signs of known extremist orgs present?]
- What type of presence is LE presenting [on site 24 hrs; patrols (car, bike, foot; scheduled, periodic); only calls for service; etc]
- What actions/adjustments/plans/concerns [what worked, didn't work] [safety, health, rights]
- Is other government engaged – mayor; governor; state or local attorney, etc; has it been beneficial

The overriding concern is knowing what to expect, what's worked and what hasn't. Thanks very much for your assistance, Mark, and for your consideration to the short time element. Be assured any additional comments you feel are pertinent are certainly most welcomed. Thanks, again, and know you are securely embedded in my little black spreadsheet of valuable POCs. And let me know if I can ever return the assistance. –jayce+
