Ocean Manifest

On Monday, December 12, 2011, Occupy Wall Street Oakland (OWS Oakland) is expected to join cities including San Diego, Los Angeles, Portland and Tacoma for a West Coast port shutdown. Organizers are planning to stage mass protests to shut down (blockade) west coast ports similar to the shutdown action taken at the Port of Oakland on November 2, 2011. The Port of Oakland has advised CBP that the decision to shut down various terminals will not be made prior to 1400 today, thus the situation remains fluid.

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Brokers and Importers can submit documents that would normally be submitted to the East Bay Station at either the West Bay Cargo Facility at 648 Westfield Rd., San Francisco or at the San Francisco Customs House at 555 Battery St., Entry Control, San Francisco.

Appointments can be made to for vessel entrance and clearances by calling the Duty Supervisor at (415) 725-9463.

AT-CET and Trade will continue to conduct examinations at all accessible locations.

Importers and brokers should contact the East Bay Station Monday for a status update prior to sending documents to the facility. If you can not reach someone in the East Bay please call Steve Baxter (415) 782-9206 or Jim Farrell (415) 782-9204 at the Customs House.

The MCC Intelligence Commander's Emerging Issues Sub-Committee Mission Statement:

- In an effort to increase situational awareness and promote public safety, the Emerging Issues Sub-Committee's mission is to:
- Identify, research and document trends or activities that may threaten public safety,
- And then to disseminate accurate and timely information to the Major City Chiefs Association.

To that end, the committee has taken up the task of developing a vehicle by which we can keep the MCCA, MCICG and Fusion Centers informed about issues that affect a large number of agencies.

The first issue the committee is working is the Occupy Movement. At the present time it is our intention to utilize the services of the Southern Nevada Counter Terrorism Center to collect, analyze and disseminate bulletins twice a week.

HOWEVER, we need your help. The committee is asking that on Monday and Thursday of each week you consider sending updates regarding the information listed below to Capt. Al Salinas (A3179S@lvmpd.com) AND Lt. Karen Francis (K4294F@lvmpd.com). We're looking for **open source information on:**

- ***Changes in the tactics and strategies used by protestors:***
Examples would include moving from occupying public/private parks to banks or foreclosed properties; or protesting at private retail stores or malls.
- ***Upcoming Events:*** For example, we've received sporadic reports of action specifically associated with Black Friday, or days where the focus of the protests will be at the ports.
- ***Changes in your agency's response or tactics that have proven to be effective or ineffective***

You do not have to send an email if you have nothing to add or nothing has changed since your last report. However, since we are interested in producing the bulletin twice a week, we would appreciate your continued attention to sharing the information on a fairly regular basis.

It would be very helpful to us if you would include a link to the open source that describes the information noted in your email and we'll possibly include that link in the bulletin.

Computer hackers are avenging the Occupy movement by exposing the personal information of police officers who evicted protesters and are threatening family-values advocates who led a boycott of an American Muslim television show.

In three Internet postings last week, hackers from the loose online coalition called Anonymous published the personal information of thousands of law enforcement officers all over the country.

One hacker posted the email and physical addresses, phone numbers and encrypted passwords of more than 2,400 police officers and corporate security executives. The targeted police officers and security personnel were members of the Coalition of Law Enforcement and Retail (CLEAR), a nonprofit group that promotes cooperation between local police forces and retail corporations throughout the United States.

Another hacker struck the website of the Florida Family Association. In an Internet posting, he told the family association he was reading its email, and he published email addresses and partial credit-card information of two dozen or so of the group's supporters.

A third hacker posted 18,000 emails, names and passwords of customers from Specialforces.com, a website that sells military-style clothing and weapon accessories. A brief review suggested that many of the customers might be police officers or military personnel and identifiable as such by their emails.

railroad tracks downtown after a rally Monday, Dec. 12.

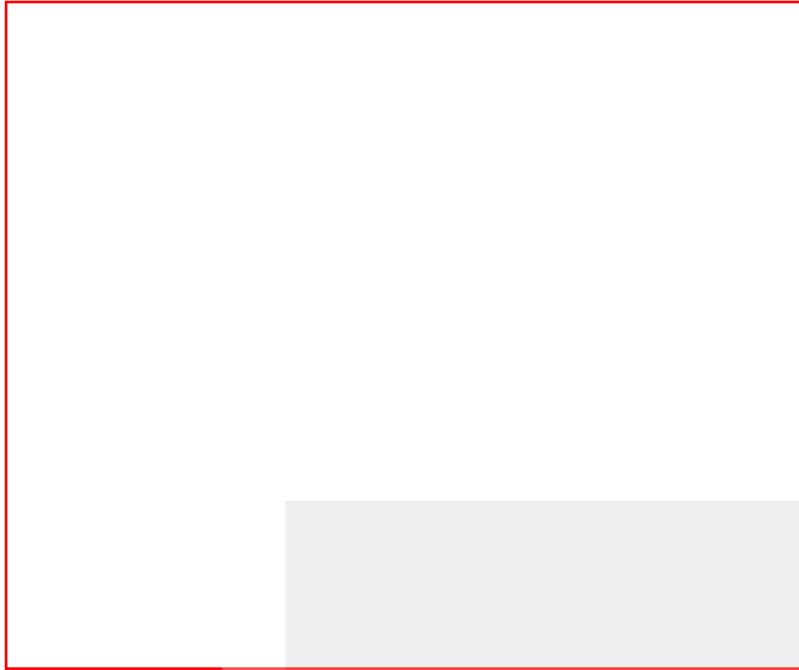
Protesters said they will meet at 11:30 a.m. at Maritime Heritage Park

Occupy DC is advertising/planning a demonstration on Capitol Hill for Sunday, December 18, 2011. At this time there is no information on exact location, time or number of participants, but we are in contact with our MPD and USPP counterparts and monitoring pertinent websites. As information is obtained, we will advise. The information listed below was taken directly from the Occupy DC website (www.occupydc.org/schedule/):

"Events on December 18, 2011

National Defense Authorization Action Protest

Starts: 12:00 PM

Ends: December 18, 2011 - 1:30 PM

Description: March and protest of the threat to civil liberties that the National Defense Authorization Action that is working it's way through Congress this week. As currently passed this bill places domestic terror investigations and interrogations in the control of the US military and permits trial-free, indefinite detention of anyone, including American citizens, so long as the government calls them terrorists. Action will include a march to the White House, 45 minutes at the

White House, March to the US Capital [sic] for an hour, and a mourner's march back to ODC. (mourning our loss of civil liberties). As part of the proposal ODC will call on other Occupy organizations to hold similar events on Sunday throughout the US.

(A proposal for this action was discussed at the GA on 2011-Dec-13 and consensus was agreed to go forward with this action)"

While monitoring the group, a demonstrator approached me and asked why I've been loitering all day. I told him I've been waiting for the march to the Hart. The source said there wasn't going to be a march because the Capitol Police were at Freedom Plaza asking questions. Instead, the protesters decided to demonstrate in Senator Levin's Russell office. The source proceeded to say he hoped I wasn't an informant.

This indicates we should prepare for posted actions (e.g. bulletin board, OSINT) targeting the Hill to be changed with little or no notice.

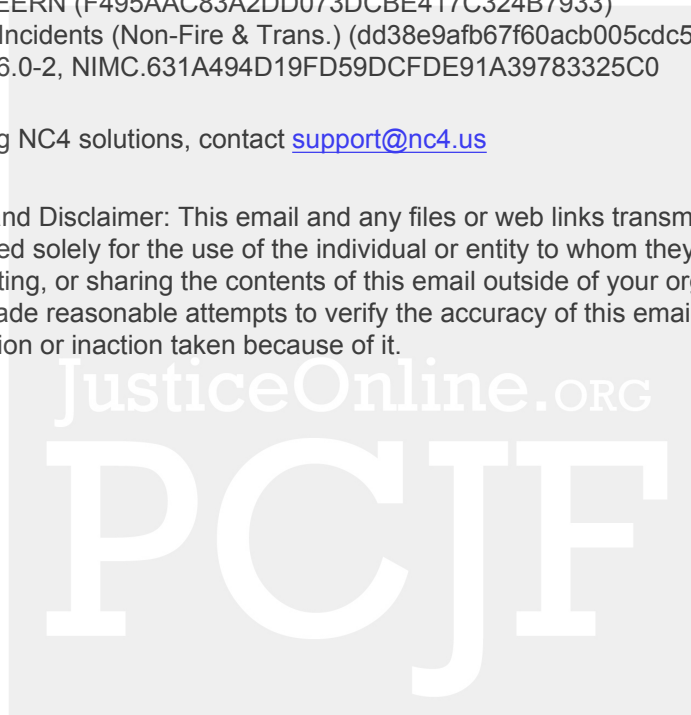

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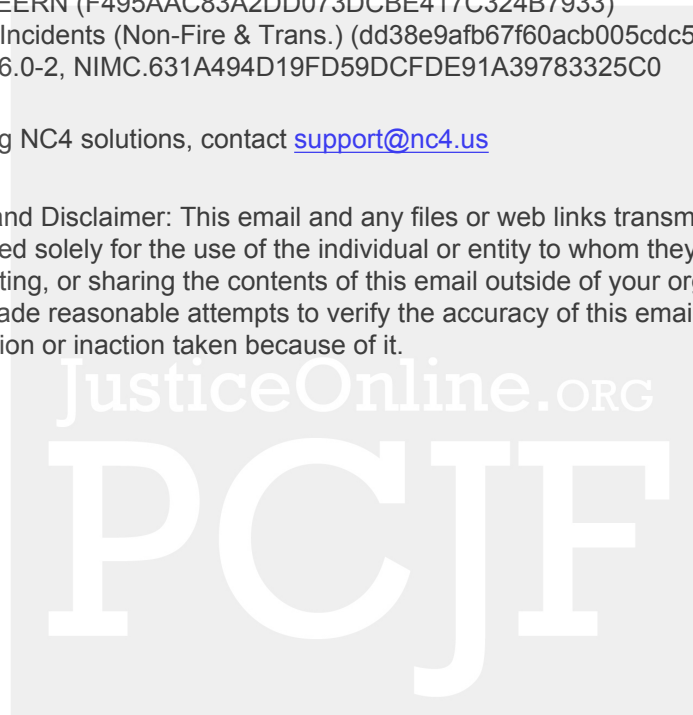

Occupy Wall Street protests are ongoing in Liberty Plaza near Liberty St and Broadway. Several hundred protesters marched through the streets of New York

(U//FOUO) Executive Summary: An article entitled 'When Should You Shoot a Cop?' was discovered on October 31, 2011 at an Occupy Phoenix encampment. The article has been circulating the internet and in paper form since June 2011. Police have no credible information that the article poses additional threats to law enforcement safety, however, vigilance and situational awareness is encouraged.

(U//FOUO) Scope: Provide law enforcement officers with situational awareness regarding the two-page article 'When Should You Shoot a Cop?' discovered at an Occupy Phoenix encampment.

(U//FOUO) Background: Copblock.org is an organization that seeks to expose police corruption, false arrest, and brutality through online postings of news articles and videos of police brutality. On June 28, 2011, an article entitled 'When Should You Shoot a Cop' was published on Copblock.org.[1] Police discovered the article in the form of a flyer at an 'Occupy Phoenix' encampment on October 31, 2011.

The Occupy Phoenix movement is an extension of the national 'Occupy Wall Street' movement where participants, exercising their first amendment rights, protest against social and economic inequality, government corruption, and corporate greed, especially in the financial services sector.

The 'Occupy Wall Street' movement has been heralded by the media as America's Arab Spring. The Arab Spring is a wave of demonstrations in Arab countries beginning in 2010, where protestors used civil resistance, strikes, demonstrations, and social media to organize actions and awareness of the cause. Many Arab Spring demonstrations resulted in violent responses from government forces.

(U//FOUO) Overview: The author of the two-page 'When Should You Shoot a Cop?' article characterizes the government as a tyrannical regime backed by police officers dubbed as "mercenaries, hired thugs and jackboots." The paper focuses on one central point:

If a police officer violates your rights (freedom of speech, right to bear arms, freedom from unreasonable search and seizure) then you have the choice to either submit or kill the officer

The author draws parallels to atrocities committed in the Hitler, Lenin, and Chairman Mao regimes where citizens were treated like sub-humans and gunned down in the street by corrupt and violent 'law enforcement officials.' Readers are told that they have the right to stop corrupt police, which "will almost always require killing them."

(U//FOUO) Outlook: The article 'When Should You Shoot a Cop?' has been circulating online and in hard copy since June of 2011. Although many readers agreed with the substance of the article, numerous people who posted online responses patently disagree with the author's thesis calling it dangerous, over the top, and absurd. Phoenix Police investigating the discovery of the flyer said there were no credible threats against law enforcement officers as a result of the discovery. The District's Occupy Wall Street movement is active however; there has been no local discovery of the document in protest encampments and no local attempts to harm police monitoring the movement.

(U//FOUO) Public Safety and Health Information Bulletin Long-Term Mass Gatherings

(U//FOUO) SCOPE

The Washington Regional Threat and Analysis Center (WRTAC) produces Information Bulletins in response to changes in the threat environment from all-crimes and all-hazards. This product specifically addresses potential concerns stemming from long-term mass gatherings.

Note: Legal protests, demonstrations, assemblies, and petitions are First-Amendment protected activities. This paper addresses factual accounts of public health and safety issues associated with mass gatherings for situational awareness purpose only.

(U//FOUO) BACKGROUND

Long-term mass gatherings can pose potential public safety and health risks. A large influx of people can place a considerable burden on emergency services personnel to control crowds, protect critical infrastructure, and maintain public safety and order. Large scale gatherings also carry the potential for violence, crime, disorderly conduct, destruction of property, vandalism, and obstruction of traffic.

Participants in mass gatherings have leveraged technology and social media to communicate, organize,

and operate. A distinct feature of social media and IT usage is that it is wireless, mobile, instant, and wide reaching. These characteristics of social media can be leveraged to quickly and without warning rapidly expand the number of participants at a mass gathering, further challenging public safety and health resources.

(U//FOUO) KEY FINDINGS/IMPLICATIONS FOR THE DISTRICT

There are numerous ongoing public safety and health hazards associated with mass gatherings in the District which will result in continued allocation of resources to mitigate these potential hazards. Historically, the District of Columbia has served as a center for mass gatherings expressing their First Amendment Rights and continues in this tradition today. As a result, it is anticipated that as long term mass gatherings self-terminate nationwide (with few exceptions, i.e. New York City), those in the District will likely endure. This realization will require continued dedication of city resources and will further tax resources already challenged.

(U//FOUO) SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

A mass gathering environment, either “on the move” or in an encampment, presents a suspicious package and vehicle challenge. The law enforcement/intelligence community remains concerned with suspicious activity due to its potential link to crime or terrorism.

Unattended packages, items or vehicles are an ongoing concern for law enforcement in relation to the threat of possible IED’s and VIED’s. This is particularly true when such items are found in proximity to large numbers of people, critical infrastructure, and tourist/iconic locations. Long-term mass gatherings present the potential for an increase in the reporting of suspicious activity related to backpacks, vehicles, or other items related to mass gathering encampments.

This scenario presents a challenge for officials charged with identifying and responding to suspicious packages and vehicle reporting. These challenges are currently playing themselves out across the nation, including Washington DC, in association with mass gatherings.

To date, national SAR reporting and specifically Washington DC has no SARs directly linked to the recent long-term mass gatherings.

(U//FOUO) PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS

Participants in close quarters using tents as temporary housing units in public parks and accumulating in mass gatherings may be susceptible to communicable disease. Unsanitary conditions also may pose a public health risk.

(U//FOUO) FIRE SAFETY

Long-term mass gatherings where overnight camping is involved present unique issues. The presence of electrical generators, cooking devices, heating devices, various fuel usage and storage practices, when combined with the potential for open fires, cigarette smoking, make-shift non-flame retardant shelters create hazards. Aggravating factors are varying wind and weather conditions and participants sleeping in close proximity without smoke/fire detection present.

The following are considerations regarding issues associated with these camping sites that may present a life safety hazard:

- Electrical generators require fuel to include gasoline, diesel and propane. Each fuel presents unique fire hazards and produces deadly carbon monoxide as a product of combustion. The lack of proper ventilation and stand-off distance from any sleeping area may cause poisoning and/or death.

- Portable heating devices have similar concerns to electric generators (fuel/carbon monoxide) with the added concern of proximity to flammable materials.
- Stoves for preparing food/drink mirror the concerns with portable heating devices, as would the potential presence of any type of open warming and/or cooking fire.
- Fuel storage issues include the lack of safe storage areas with adequate stand-off distances from sleeping areas and lack of approved storage containers and absence of limitations on quantity of fuel stored on site. Safety could be compromised by the absence of fire extinguishers and neglecting to follow proper refueling guidelines for each appliance.
- Cigarette smoking in unprotected sleeping areas (no smoke/fire detection devices) is a major concern, as would be smoking near any fuel storage areas.
- Construction issues include the makeshift shelters, which may not be flame retardant, lack of smoke/fire detection devices, lack of any type of fire separations which would prevent rapid spread of fire, and use of makeshift electrical wiring, a known fire hazard.

Some of the hazards presented above have become reality in other incidents. After Hurricane Katrina, there were 51 reported carbon monoxide poisoning events, resulting in 5 deaths. Many of these were associated with generator usage.

(U//FOUO) CRIME CHALLENGES

Long-term mass gatherings create significant challenges for law enforcement agencies. Law enforcement has to protect legitimate First Amendment rights while also protecting innocent bystanders, safeguarding municipal and private property, ensuring unobstructed traffic, containing unruly protestors and preventing injuries to officers.

Criminals may use a large scale gathering as a “crime of opportunity” environment. Criminals may target those involved in long-term mass gatherings for robbery, sexual offenses, assault, theft and pickpocketing. They also can prey on protestors or perpetrate crimes in other areas and then blend into the anonymity provided by long-term mass gatherings. A criminal actor’s nature and potentially violent tendencies can also exacerbate any tensions that may develop between law enforcement personnel and legitimate protestors.

(U//FOUO) OUTLOOK

As long term mass gatherings continue, quality of life concerns may be exacerbated by the following circumstances:

- Severe winter weather conditions may increase the likelihood of the use of heating devices, which increases the potential for fire hazards;
- The longer the gathering, the greater the potential for disease transmission

- Any attempt at removal of mass gathering participants may result in violent clashes with law enforcement
- The hazardous conditions relative to recent mass gatherings may be replicated at other large gatherings or protests

The following reported incidents have lead city leaders to take action in response to growing civil unrest and unsanitary conditions at recent mass gatherings throughout the nation:

--Atlanta, GA: On Oct 26, 2011, the city of Atlanta decided to shut down a mass gathering site after a man with an AK-47 assault rifle joined the protesters. [\[ii\]](#)

--Oakland, CA: On Nov 14, 2011, the Oakland police department ordered the shutdown of a mass gathering site after a young man was fatally shot yards from the Frank Orawa Plaza site. [\[iii\]](#) [\[iv\]](#)

--New York City, NY: On Nov 15, 2011, the NY police department ordered the shutdown of Zuccotti Park, due to unsanitary conditions. [\[v\]](#)

--Dallas, TX: On Nov 17, 2011, the Dallas police department evicted a mass gathering encampment near City Hall due to growing public safety and health condition concerns. [\[vi\]](#)

Transportation Sector: Mass gatherings taking place in downtown areas can have a significant impact on transportation, causing widespread traffic jams, road closures, and suspension of public transit.

- On September 30, New York Police arrested 700 demonstrators for blocking the roadway during a march across the Brooklyn Bridge. (Huffington Post)
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- On October 6, a gathering of 10,000 protesters caused TriMet, the public agency in charge of mass transit in Portland, to temporarily suspend service and forced police to block-off several roadways. (Portland Oregonian)

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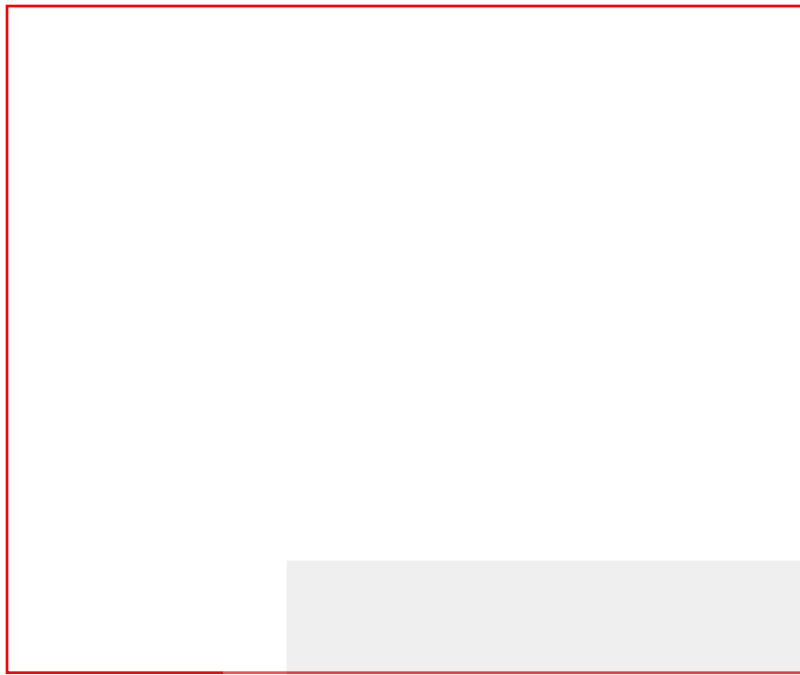

Severe Weather- Overview: The National Weather Service (NWS) reports a winter storm has impacted the interior Mid-Atlantic and Northeastern states and will continue to affect these areas through tonight. Winter Storm Warnings are in effect from West Virginia (WV) to eastern Maine (ME).

The NWS reports the heaviest snowfall amounts are forecast to fall in a band from extreme northern Maryland (MD) northeastward through New Jersey (NJ) and western Massachusetts (MA) into eastern ME; lighter slushy snow accumulations are possible for the major cities of the Mid-Atlantic and the Northeast. High Wind Warnings for gusts up to 60 mph are in effect for coastal areas from middle Long Island and southern Connecticut (CT) up to eastern ME, including Boston, MA. Coastal Flood Warnings are in effect for coastal areas of MD, Delaware, NJ, and Cape Cod, MA.

A NWS Liaison at the Federal Aviation Administration Command Center briefed top level air traffic planners on the coming event to facilitate preparation for staffing and logistics. New York (NY) aviation interests were briefed both from a flight planning and ground operations perspective. Open source media reports airports including John F. Kennedy, LaGuardia, Newark Liberty

International, Reagan National, and Philadelphia International are posting delays and cancellations due to weather. Portions of Interstate 84 in CT, Interstate 287 in NJ, Interstate 78 in PA, and Interstate 87 in NY have been closed. Amtrak service along the Keystone Corridor between Harrisburg and Philadelphia, PA has been disrupted due to downed trees and weather related infrastructure issues.

In PA, approximately 417,000 customers are without power; 197,000 in NJ; 159,000 in CT; 78,000 in NY; 28,000 in WV, and 28,000 in MD

I have received several calls regarding the Occupy Wall Street. This is what i have so far. Approximately, 175 arrests with two non-life threatening injuries to two officers.

One police officer was slashed and a second cop was taken to a local hospital with an eye injury-- after clashes between protesters and activists across lower Manhattan. Both officers are said to be in stable condition.

The Wall Street area was cordoned off with metal barricades and officers.

The NYPD set up a checkpoint where NYSE employees could enter the plaza. A few hundred protesters massed there, and heckled the arriving workers with chants of, "Shame! Shame! Shame!" and "Shut it down!"

Some protesters blocked traffic on a roadway in the Financial District. The NYPD responded by peacefully got the group back to the sidewalk.

The protesters appeared to number between 1,000 and 2,000, although they had splintered into numerous, smaller groups, making an accurate assessment difficult.

There, a couple hundred protesters, their ranks depleted with the passing hours. The group announced it would rally near the New York Stock Exchange, then fan out across Manhattan and head to subways, before gathering downtown and marching over the Brooklyn bridge.

Organizers say the loss of the Zuccotti Park campsite may help broaden the movement. The head of the group's finances says it will open a dialogue with organizers in other cities and take the protest to the next level.

A judge in New York ruled Tuesday that the protesters could return to Zuccotti but could not set up camp.

Currently protesters are forming up in lower Manhattan to attempt to walk across Brooklyn Bridge. NYPD is also preparing i will keep you advised.

SCOPE

The Washington Regional Threat and Analysis Center (WRTAC) produces Information Bulletins in response to changes in the threat environment from all-crimes and all-hazards. This product specifically addresses potential concerns stemming from long-term mass gatherings.

Note: Legal protests, demonstrations, assemblies, and petitions are First-Amendment protected activities. This paper addresses factual accounts of public health and safety issues associated with mass gatherings for situational awareness purpose only.

(U//FOUO)
BACKGROUND

Long-term mass gatherings can pose potential public safety and health risks. A large influx of people can place a considerable burden on emergency services personnel to control crowds, protect critical infrastructure, and maintain public safety and order. Large scale gatherings also carry the potential for violence, crime, disorderly conduct, destruction of property, vandalism, and obstruction of traffic.

Participants in mass gatherings have leveraged technology and social media to communicate, organize, and operate. A distinct feature of social media and IT usage is that it is wireless, mobile, instant, and wide reaching. These characteristics of social media can be leveraged to quickly and without warning rapidly expand the number of participants at a mass gathering, further challenging public safety and health resources.

**(U//FOUO) KEY FINDINGS/IMPLICATIONS FOR
THE DISTRICT**

There are numerous ongoing public safety and health hazards associated with mass gatherings in the District which will result in continued allocation of resources to mitigate these potential hazards. Historically, the District of Columbia has served as a center for mass gatherings expressing their First Amendment Rights and continues in this tradition today. As a result, it is anticipated that as long term mass gatherings self-terminate nationwide (with few exceptions, i.e. New York City), those in the District will likely endure. This realization will require continued dedication of city resources and will further tax resources already challenged.

(U//FOUO) SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

A mass gathering environment, either “on the move” or in an encampment, presents a suspicious package and vehicle challenge. The law enforcement/intelligence community remains concerned with suspicious activity due to its potential link to crime or terrorism.

Unattended packages, items or vehicles are an ongoing concern for law enforcement in relation to the threat of possible IED’s and VIED’s. This is particularly true when such items are found in proximity to large numbers of people, critical infrastructure, and tourist/iconic locations. Long-term mass gatherings present the potential for an increase in the reporting of suspicious activity related to backpacks, vehicles, or other items related to mass gathering encampments.

This scenario presents a challenge for officials charged with identifying and responding to suspicious packages and vehicle reporting. These challenges are currently playing themselves out across the nation, including Washington DC, in association with mass gatherings.

To date, national SAR reporting and specifically Washington DC has no SARs directly linked to the recent long-term mass gatherings.

(U//FOUO) PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS

Participants in close quarters using tents as temporary housing units in public parks and

accumulating in mass gatherings may be susceptible to communicable disease. Unsanitary conditions also may pose a public health risk.

(U//FOUO) FIRE SAFETY

Long-term mass gatherings where overnight camping is involved present unique issues. The presence of electrical generators, cooking devices, heating devices, various fuel usage and storage practices, when combined with the potential for open fires, cigarette smoking, make-shift non-flame retardant shelters create hazards. Aggravating factors are varying wind and weather conditions and participants sleeping in close proximity without smoke/fire detection present.

The following are considerations regarding issues associated with these camping sites that may present a life safety hazard:

- Electrical generators require fuel to include gasoline, diesel and propane. Each fuel presents unique fire hazards and produces deadly carbon monoxide as a product of combustion. The lack of proper ventilation and stand-off distance from any sleeping area may cause poisoning and/or death.
- Portable heating devices have similar concerns to electric generators (fuel/carbon monoxide) with the added concern of proximity to flammable materials.
- Stoves for preparing food/drink mirror the concerns with portable heating devices, as would the potential presence of any type of open warming and/or cooking fire.
- Fuel storage issues include the lack of safe storage areas with adequate stand-off distances from sleeping areas and lack of approved storage containers and absence of limitations on quantity of fuel stored on site. Safety could be compromised by the absence of fire extinguishers and neglecting to follow proper refueling guidelines for each appliance.
- Cigarette smoking in unprotected sleeping areas (no smoke/fire detection devices) is a major concern, as would be smoking near any fuel storage areas.
- Construction issues include the makeshift shelters, which may not be flame retardant, lack of smoke/fire detection devices, lack of any type of fire separations which would prevent rapid spread of fire, and use of makeshift electrical wiring, a known fire hazard.

Some of the hazards presented above have become reality in other incidents. After Hurricane Katrina, there were 51 reported carbon monoxide poisoning events, resulting in 5 deaths. Many

of these were associated with generator usage.

(U//FOUO) CRIME CHALLENGES

Long-term mass gatherings create significant challenges for law enforcement agencies. Law enforcement has to protect legitimate First Amendment rights while also protecting innocent bystanders, safeguarding municipal and private property, ensuring unobstructed traffic, containing unruly protestors and preventing injuries to officers.

Criminals may use a large scale gathering as a “crime of opportunity” environment. Criminals may target those involved in long-term mass gatherings for robbery, sexual offenses, assault, theft and pickpocketing. They also can prey on protestors or perpetrate crimes in other areas and then blend into the anonymity provided by long-term mass gatherings. A criminal actor’s nature and potentially violent tendencies can also exacerbate any tensions that may develop between law enforcement personnel and legitimate protestors.

(U//FOUO) OUTLOOK

As long term mass gatherings continue, quality of life concerns may be exacerbated by the following circumstances:

- Severe winter weather conditions may increase the likelihood of the use of heating devices, which increases the potential for fire hazards;
- The longer the gathering, the greater the potential for disease transmission
- Any attempt at removal of mass gathering participants may result in violent clashes with law enforcement
- The hazardous conditions relative to recent mass gatherings may be replicated at other large gatherings or protests

The following reported incidents have lead city leaders to take action in response to growing civil unrest and unsanitary conditions at recent mass gatherings throughout the nation:

--Atlanta, GA: On Oct 26, 2011, the city of Atlanta decided to shut down a mass gathering site after a man with an AK-47 assault rifle joined the protestors.[\[ii\]](#)

--Oakland, CA: On Nov 14, 2011, the Oakland police department ordered the shutdown of a mass gathering site after a young man was fatally shot yards from the Frank Orawa Plaza site.[\[iii\]](#)

--New York City, NY: On Nov 15, 2011, the NY police department ordered the shutdown of Zuccotti Park, due to unsanitary conditions.[\[v\]](#)

--Dallas, TX: On Nov 17, 2011, the Dallas police department evicted a mass gathering encampment near City Hall due to growing public safety and health condition concerns.[\[vi\]](#)

Transportation Sector: Mass gatherings taking place in downtown areas can have a significant impact on transportation, causing widespread traffic jams, road closures, and suspension of public transit.

- On September 30, New York Police arrested 700 demonstrators for blocking the roadway during a march across the Brooklyn Bridge. (Huffington Post)
- On October 12, gatherers forced the suspension of cable car service in the city's financial district. (Bay Area News Group)
- On October 6, a gathering of 10,000 protesters caused TriMet, the public agency in charge of mass transit in Portland, to temporarily suspend service and forced police to block-off several roadways. (Portland Oregonian)

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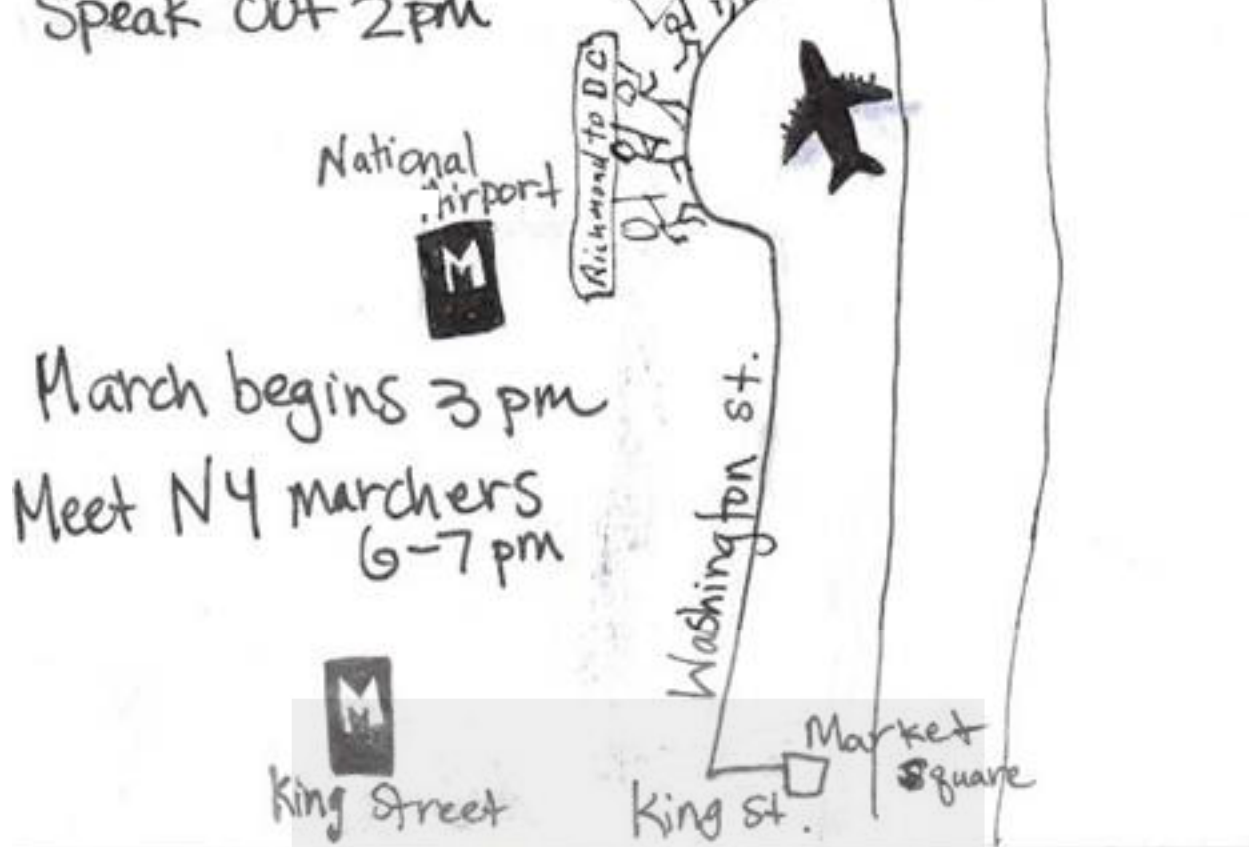

Occupy Wall Street gains institutional cheerleaders

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A live feed from Occupy Wall Street was played at the opening of a major annual gathering of liberal groups in Washington, as progressive organizers try to build on the protests momentum. They set an example of all of us, of discipline, of non-violence in the heart of the belly of the beast, said Robert Borosage, co-director of the Campaign for Americas Future, which organized the conference. We are going to keep building here, over the next three days we were going to build plans for the next 18 months.

Now the conference's progressive leaders are urging them to support a D.C. offshoot of Occupy Wall Street, which converged Sunday at McPherson Square. On Thursday, they'll protest the role of corporate money in politics. Occupy K Street is starting. It's from Wall Street to K Street, says Liz Butler, campaign director for climate advocacy group 1Sky. To send the same message to corporate lobbyists that's being sent to Congress and Wall Street. The following photos were at the recent National Socialist Movement rally in Pomona on November 5, 2011. A number of individuals have been identified at this rally (as noted in the document.) Please let us know if there are others noted in the document that you are able to identify. We hope you find this useful.

The National Socialist Movement (NSM) held an anti-immigration protest on Saturday, November 5, 2011 in Pomona, California at the City Hall located at 505 S. Garey Avenue. The protest was similar in theme to the previous protests they have held in California over the past two years: "Reclaim the Southwest." Their stated purpose of this particular rally, according to their after action report posted on the NSM site was, "to protest the California Dream Act, the influx of illegal aliens, and sanctuary cities." National NSM Director, Jeff Schoep, noted in one NSM interview, "this is a frontline city, this a frontline battle and we are a frontline organization."

News reports estimated 75 protesters present on the NSM side, faced off against 300 counter-protesters. However, NSM numbers appeared to be closer to 60 people.

Since the murder of former California NSM leader Jeff Hall earlier this year, San Diego-based Pete "Butch" Urban has assumed the regional leadership position. Another member, Ken Dias, listed as the "Inland Empire unit leader," was also a point of contact for the event. Following the event, the California white power band, *Youngland*, with songs such as "Thank God I'm A White Boy," performed at an after-party at an off-site location.

GROUP REPRESENTATION:

In addition to the NSM, other groups represented at the event included the Golden State Skinheads, Supreme Power Skins, Antelope Valley Skins and JT Ready's [US Border Patrol](#).

GEOGRAPHIC MAKE-UP:

Members came from Arizona, California, Connecticut, Michigan, New York, Oklahoma, Oregon and New Jersey.

Dear Inspector Giaccio,

Thank you for your inquiry about our OCCUPY THE COURTS action which is scheduled for 1/20/2012. We have a permit for Capitol Hill Area 9. Our first speaker there will be at 12:00 Noon.

At this point I honestly have no idea how big our action is going to be. I do know that, while our nation-wide protest is getting ignored by the mainstream media, it is generating a HUGE buzz in the blogosphere. Our national action map, which you can see at www.movetoamend.org/occupythecourts only been up for 5 weeks, and it has already been viewed 410,000 times!

As for civil disobedience, there are some people who have expressed an intention to engage in peaceful, non-violent, non-confrontational, civil disobedience. For example, Move to Amend's national spokesman (and 2004 Green Party Presidential Candidate) David Cobb, intends to leave area 9 at the end of that action, walk across the street to the U.S. Supreme Court, mount the main Supreme Court steps and give a speech denouncing the Supreme Court for its Citizens United v. FEC decision, and calling for the passage of a constitutional amendment to say clearly, and unequivocally, that rights recognized under the Constitution belong to human beings, only, and that political campaign contributions is not constitutionally protected free speech.

David's actions will be peaceful, non-violent, and non-confrontational, but he intends to speak until he is arrested. He will peacefully, but not necessarily quietly, submit to arrest.

I do not know how many people in attendance at the Area 9 protest will follow David across the street and attempt to mount the stairs with him.

It is our understanding that any protest on the stairs of the Supreme Court – including making political speeches from the stairs - are illegal and will lead to arrest. Is that true? If so, what would you expect a person who engages in the peaceful, non-violent, non-confrontational C-D described above, to be charged with? Is there the ability for people who are arrested, as described above, to self-pay their bail and not spend the holiday weekend in custody?

I look forward to your prompt response to this inquiry.

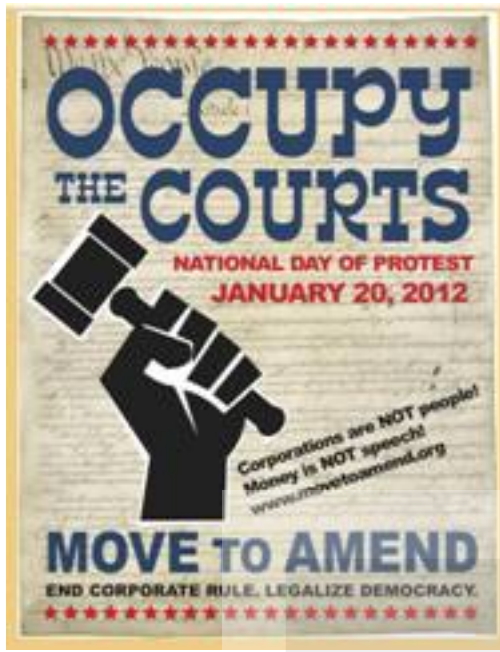

Witness Against Torture (WAT) demonstration on Wednesday, January 11. SCUS Threat unit made contact with Matt Daloisio. He states WAT will be in town at various locations January 2-12th. They will be fasting during this time. Their main event is January 11th. They will start at Lafayette Park at approximately 1000 hours. From there, they will march to the White House, march to the DOJ, then march to the SCUS, then march to the US Capitol. They should arrive at the SCUS around 1400 hours and depart by 1415 hours. He stated they would have approximately 200 participants, some in the orange jumpsuits. He stated he does not believe any participants will not engage in civil disobedience at the SCUS since the Court is NOT their focus. I have received several calls regarding the Occupy Wall Street. This is what i have so far. Approximately, 175 arrests with two non-life threatening injuries to two officers.

One police officer was slashed and a second cop was taken to a local hospital with an eye injury-- after clashes between protesters and activists across lower Manhattan. Both officers are said to be in stable condition.

The Wall Street area was cordoned off with metal barricades and officers.

The NYPD set up a checkpoint where NYSE employees could enter the plaza.

A few hundred protesters massed there, and heckled the arriving workers with chants of, "Shame! Shame! Shame!" and "Shut it down!"

Some protesters blocked traffic on a roadway in the Financial District. The NYPD responded by peacefully got the group back to the sidewalk.

The protesters appeared to number between 1,000 and 2,000, although they had splintered into numerous, smaller groups, making an accurate assessment difficult.

There, a couple hundred protesters, their ranks depleted with the passing hours. The group announced it would rally near the New York Stock Exchange, then fan out across Manhattan and head to subways, before gathering downtown and marching over the Brooklyn bridge.

Organizers say the loss of the Zuccotti Park campsite may help broaden the movement. The head of the group's finances says it will open a dialogue with organizers in other cities and take the protest to the next level.

A judge in New York ruled Tuesday that the protesters could return to Zuccotti but could not set up camp.

Currently protesters are forming up in lower Manhattan to attempt to walk across Brooklyn Bridge. NYPD is also preparing i will keep you advised.

Occupy Wall Street gains institutional cheerleaders

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A live feed from Occupy Wall Street was played at the opening of a major annual gathering of liberal groups in Washington, as progressive organizers try to build on the protests momentum. They set an example of all of us, of discipline, of non-violence in the heart of the belly of the beast, said Robert Borosage, co-director of the Campaign for Americas Future, which organized the conference. We are going to keep building here, over the next three days we were going to build plans for the next 18 months.



(SOURCE: GETT IMAGES) With attendees from Washington's major progressive institutions from [MoveOn.org](#) and labor unions to the Center for American Progress and members of the House Progressive Caucus the CAF conference had already been planned a Wednesday march on Capitol Hill to advocate for jobs not cuts. Now the conference's progressive leaders are urging them to support a D.C. offshoot of Occupy Wall Street, which converged Sunday at McPherson Square. On Thursday, they'll protest the role of corporate money in politics. Occupy K Street is starting. It's from Wall Street to K Street, says Liz Butler, campaign director for climate advocacy group 1Sky. To send the same message to corporate lobbyists that's being sent to Congress and Wall Street. It's a beautiful moment of convergence versus Wall Street, versus cuts, for our future.

But exactly how these long-standing progressive groups will relate to Occupy Wall Street is still unclear. Local union affiliates have joined the New York protesters and contributed food to the encamped participants, but the movement has yet to converge upon the kind of agenda that established groups have been pushing for. In fact, the CAF conference will be organizing a lunch Tuesday to discuss the best way to support the expanding protests and, perhaps, to link their own organizing efforts with the burgeoning movement. The Washington Regional Threat and Analysis Center (WRTAC) produces Information Bulletins in response to changes in the threat environment from all-crimes and all-hazards. This

product specifically addresses potential concerns stemming from long-term mass gatherings.

Note: Legal protests, demonstrations, assemblies, and petitions are First-Amendment protected activities. This paper addresses factual accounts of public health and safety issues associated with mass gatherings for situational awareness purpose only.

(U//FOUO)

BACKGROUND

Long-term mass gatherings can pose potential public safety and health risks. A large influx of people can place a considerable burden on emergency services personnel to control crowds, protect critical infrastructure, and maintain public safety and order. Large scale gatherings also carry the potential for violence, crime, disorderly conduct, destruction of property, vandalism, and obstruction of traffic.

Participants in mass gatherings have leveraged technology and social media to communicate, organize, and operate. A distinct feature of social media and IT usage is that it is wireless, mobile, instant, and wide reaching. These characteristics of social media can be leveraged to quickly and without warning rapidly expand the number of participants at a mass gathering, further challenging public safety and health resources.

(U//FOUO) KEY FINDINGS/IMPLICATIONS FOR THE DISTRICT

There are numerous ongoing public safety and health hazards associated with mass gatherings in the District which will result in continued allocation of resources to mitigate these potential hazards. Historically, the District of Columbia has served as a center for mass gatherings expressing their First Amendment Rights and continues in this tradition today. As a result, it is anticipated that as long term mass gatherings self-terminate nationwide (with few exceptions, i.e. New York City), those in the District will likely endure. This realization will require continued dedication of city resources and will further tax resources already challenged.

(U//FOUO) SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

A mass gathering environment, either on the move or in an encampment, presents a suspicious package and vehicle challenge. The law enforcement/intelligence community remains concerned with suspicious activity due to its potential link to crime or terrorism.

Unattended packages, items or vehicles are an ongoing concern for law enforcement in relation to the threat of possible IEDs and VIEDs. This is particularly true when such items are found in proximity to large numbers of people, critical infrastructure, and tourist/iconic locations. Long-term mass gatherings present the potential for an increase in the reporting of suspicious activity related to backpacks, vehicles, or other items related to mass gathering encampments.

This scenario presents a challenge for officials charged with identifying and responding to suspicious packages and vehicle reporting. These challenges are currently playing themselves out across the nation, including Washington DC, in association with mass gatherings.

To date, national SAR reporting and specifically Washington DC has no SARs directly linked to the recent long-term mass gatherings.

(U//FOUO) PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS

Participants in close quarters using tents as temporary housing units in public parks and accumulating in mass gatherings may be susceptible to communicable disease. Unsanitary conditions also may pose a public health risk.

(U//FOUO) FIRE SAFETY

Long-term mass gatherings where overnight camping is involved present unique issues. The presence of electrical generators, cooking devices, heating devices, various fuel usage and storage practices, when combined with the potential for open fires, cigarette smoking, make-shift non-flame retardant shelters create hazards. Aggravating factors are varying wind and weather conditions and participants sleeping in close proximity without smoke/fire detection present.

The following are considerations regarding issues associated with these camping sites that may present a life safety hazard:

Electrical generators require fuel to include gasoline, diesel and propane. Each fuel presents unique fire hazards and produces deadly carbon monoxide as a product of combustion. The lack of proper ventilation and stand-off distance from any sleeping area may cause poisoning and/or death.

Portable heating devices have similar concerns to electric generators (fuel/carbon monoxide) with the added concern of proximity to flammable materials.

Stoves for preparing food/drink mirror the concerns with portable heating devices, as would the potential presence of any type of open warming and/or cooking fire.

Fuel storage issues include the lack of safe storage areas with adequate stand-off distances from sleeping areas and lack of approved storage containers and absence of limitations on quantity of fuel stored on site. Safety could be compromised by the absence of fire extinguishers and neglecting to follow proper refueling guidelines for each appliance.

Cigarette smoking in unprotected sleeping areas (no smoke/fire detection devices) is a major concern, as would be smoking near any fuel storage areas.

Construction issues include the makeshift shelters, which may not be flame retardant, lack of smoke/fire detection devices, lack of any type of fire separations which would prevent rapid spread of fire, and use of makeshift electrical wiring, a known fire hazard.

Some of the hazards presented above have become reality in other incidents. After Hurricane Katrina, there were 51 reported carbon monoxide poisoning events, resulting in 5 deaths. Many of these were associated with generator usage.

(U//FOUO) CRIME CHALLENGES

Long-term mass gatherings create significant challenges for law enforcement agencies. Law enforcement has to protect legitimate First Amendment rights while also protecting innocent bystanders, safeguarding municipal and private property, ensuring unobstructed traffic, containing unruly protestors and preventing injuries to officers.

Criminals may use a large scale gathering as a crime of opportunity environment. Criminals may target those involved in long-term mass gatherings for robbery, sexual offenses, assault, theft and pickpocketing. They also can prey on protesters or perpetrate crimes in other areas and then blend into the anonymity provided by long-term mass gatherings. A criminal actors nature and potentially violent tendencies can also exacerbate any tensions that may develop between law enforcement personnel and legitimate protesters.

(U//FOUO) OUTLOOK

As long term mass gatherings continue, quality of life concerns may be exacerbated by the following circumstances:

Severe winter weather conditions may increase the likelihood of the use of heating devices, which increases the potential for fire hazards;

The longer the gathering, the greater the potential for disease transmission

Any attempt at removal of mass gathering participants may result in violent clashes with law enforcement

The hazardous conditions relative to recent mass gatherings may be replicated at other large gatherings or protests

The following reported incidents have lead city leaders to take action in response to growing civil unrest and unsanitary conditions at recent mass gatherings throughout the nation:

--Atlanta, GA: On Oct 26, 2011, the city of Atlanta decided to shut down a mass gathering site after a man with an AK-47 assault rifle joined the protesters.[\[ii\]](#)

--Oakland, CA: On Nov 14, 2011, the Oakland police department ordered the shutdown of a mass gathering site after a young man was fatally shot yards from the Frank Orawa Plaza site.[\[iii\]](#)

--New York City, NY: On Nov 15, 2011, the NY police department ordered the shutdown of Zuccotti Park, due to unsanitary conditions.[\[v\]](#)

--Dallas, TX: On Nov 17, 2011, the Dallas police department evicted a mass gathering encampment near City Hall due to growing public safety and health condition concerns.[\[vi\]](#)

Transportation Sector: Mass gatherings taking place in downtown areas can have a significant impact on transportation, causing widespread traffic jams, road closures, and suspension of public transit.

On September 30, New York Police arrested 700 demonstrators for blocking the roadway during a march across the Brooklyn Bridge. (Huffington Post)

On October 12, gatherers forced the suspension of cable car service in the city's financial district. (Bay Area News Group)

On October 6, a gathering of 10,000 protesters caused TriMet, the public agency in charge of mass transit in Portland, to temporarily suspend service and forced police to block-off several roadways. (Portland Oregonian)

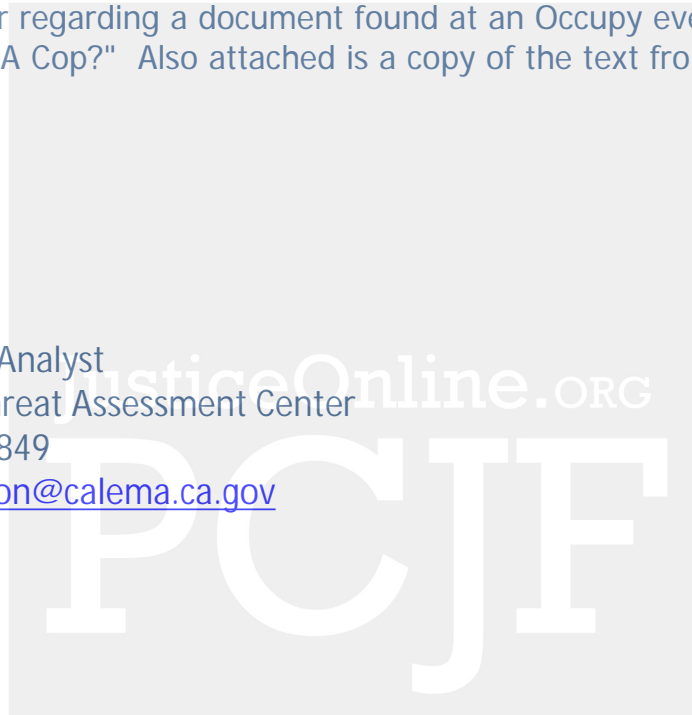

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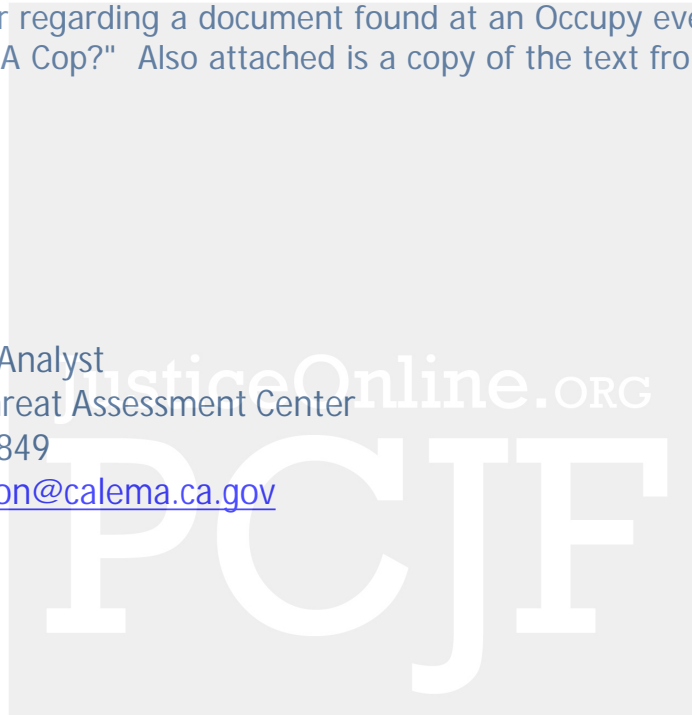

(U) SCOPE

This product was created in response to a request for information (RFI) concerning impacts to the Pittsburgh area from the planned Occupy Pittsburgh set for October 15, 2011. This product is intended to provide the private sector and first responders information on the event and appropriate prevention and response measures. **Information in this report was collected through open source materials only.** Open sources used in this product may include bias and misleading information.

(U) KEY FINDINGS

- *Current information on the Occupy Pittsburgh event, planned for October 15, indicates planned protests at specific facilities and "occupation" of area parks.*
- *Similar events in New York have resulted in a small number of arrests and little indications of violence or damage.*
- *Other "occupation" events may occur in the Region, inspired by these protests.*

(U) OVERVIEW

The Occupy Pittsburgh event is intended as a sympathetic protest to similar events in New York and other "Occupy" protests are meant to emulate protests in the Middle East. The protests are primarily focused on the banking and finance sector, but have expanded to include other causes. Protests in New York have resulted in multiple arrests and the "occupation" of parks near financial institutions.

(U) THREAT ANALYSIS

Current information indicates that the event may include an "occupation" of public areas or other parks in the Downtown Pittsburgh area. Meeting areas discussed include Point State Park, Freedom Corner, City- County Building, or Market Square, but may change. Possible tactics may include the occupation of space surrounding the buildings. Discussions about tactics among

the group range from non-confrontational to other more aggressive terms. Protests discussed at local facilities and businesses include the following¹:

- Gulf Building
- Koppers Building
- BNY-Mellon
- PNC
- Government facilities along Grant St.

Possible additional targets in the Downtown area may include other buildings in the Energy, Banking and Finance, and Government sectors. Other sectors may also be included in possible protests as well.

Other related events include Occupy IUP (Indiana University of Pennsylvania) and other “occupy” events could occur in other locations throughout the Region. Information on the event may change as plans are altered. Discussions on the group’s Facebook site indicate internal disagreements on planning, messages, and other various topics.² Web 2.0 tools, such as Facebook, Twitter, and Google Groups are being used to coordinate and plan the event.

Other possible threats may come from the “hacktivist” group Anonymous. Anonymous is a collective made up of “anonymous” individuals, which focuses on creating civil disturbance through electronic means, such as attacking target websites and spilling private information. Their actions center around a stated desire for complete internet freedom and freedom of speech, usually with an anti-government tone. Their recent operation, anti-security operation, dubbed “AntiSec”, was focused on disclosing government and military secrets, the passcodes to private organizations, and denying service to various public and private webpages.

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Pre-cursor indicators of potential attack or criminal activity may include the following:

- **Elicitation**- unusual requests for information beyond curiosity on sensitive aspects of the facility
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- **Photography and surveillance**- observation of sensitive areas or photography of security systems, entrances, or other infrastructure
- **Testing security**- triggering alarms or probing incidents to evaluate security response time and capability

(U) THREAT MITIGATION AND RISK REDUCTION

Although, the overall threat for this event in Pittsburgh is limited at this time, mitigation and preparedness activities can be considered to counter this threat spectrum.

Appropriate countermeasures to reduce potential risk prior to October 15, include the following options for consideration:

- Conducting identification checks by ensuring personnel have the correct credentials for the facility and assuring proper access control measures are in place
- Reporting suspicious activity
- Establishing liaisons with public safety personnel
- Exercising civil unrest plans, ranging from a tabletop exercise to functional drills
- Evaluating facility vulnerability to civil unrest incidents
- Requesting site assessments of facilities
- Educating staff on how to avoid protestors and to avoid engaging individuals who may be populating the area
- Providing alternative points of entry to facilities in the event of non-violent groups blocking conventional ingress routes to buildings
- Coordinating deliveries to occur on alternative dates so as to avoid opportunity for interrupting goods and services
- Utilize random security measures such as bag checks, door checks, and perimeter sweeps the week prior

The following countermeasures can be put in place to reduce potential risk on the day of October 15:

- Providing escorts for tenants and employees of facility if sit-ins or protests prove to block points of ingress

- Using existing security measures to bolster situational awareness by increasing the frequency of camera sweeps to protest area outside of the facility, and locations of significant assets within the facility
- Working to neutralize protest environment by decreasing foot and auto traffic in and around protestors

(U) INTELLIGENCE GAPS

Outstanding information requirements include the following intelligence gaps:

- What other tactics might be used for potential events in Pittsburgh?
- What routes of movement will protests take?
- What will be the impact to critical infrastructure, both in at identified targets and surrounding areas?
- Will additional targets be identified for possible protests?
- Will local parks be “occupied” beyond the planned protest date?
- Will Anonymous become more involved with Occupy protests?

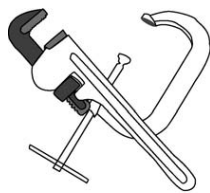

PREFACE: WHY OCCUPY?

We in the US have been too timid for too long. We are afraid of the cops. We are afraid of losing our jobs or getting expelled from school. No one wants to take risks; no one wants anyone else to take risks. Protests are boring, poorly attended and ineffective. Peaceful marches or rallies reduce us to passive observers of what is supposed to be our own activity. We are told to express our anger and frustration by shouting or chanting, but otherwise, we are asked to exercise restraint.

At the UCSC walkout on Sept 24, protestors chanted and carried signs, but they crossed the street only when the 'walk' sign was lit. They would march across the street, push the button to cross at the next intersection and wait patiently for the light to change. The striking union, UPTA, had a picket line but did not actively prevent people from crossing that line. They knew that *most unions at the UC have contracts which explicitly force their members to cross the picket lines of other unions*. In Berkeley, at the general assembly held on the same day, protestors were asked: "what do you want to do next?" But they were never asked the obvious question—"what do you want to do right now?"

Why not decide on an immediate course of action and do it? Organizers complain they are losing members with each successive meeting; they seem to believe that meeting is an end in itself!

This wall of passivity can only be dismantled through action. But equally, we have to avoid the temptation of becoming "activists". On Sept 17, activists interrupted a meeting of the UC Board of Regents. They shouted at Mark Yudof, refused to quiet down and were arrested by cops. These sacrificial actions are disruptive—but only momentarily. They depend on the media to publicize their grievances, but, to gain this attention, activists must provoke the administration into an embarrassing confrontation. Administrators are not so stupid. They know how to neutralize these actions: they simply avoid confrontation. After the protestors were dragged from the room, Yudof said, "the students ought to be angry about the fee increases. I'm angry about it, too."

These are the problems we face: not only the cuts—not only the crisis which caused the cuts—but the ineffectiveness of our means of fighting them. We need to build a movement, but we find that we cannot. People will only join a movement

if it has the potential to change something, but a movement will only change something if people join it. So everyone does what is in their own best interests: they ignore the protestors and get on with their lives. Better to try to find a new job than waste time failing to get your old one back. The problem is not a lack of consciousness. People evaluate their situation and act accordingly.

It is the activists who fail to understand.

Everything is set up in advance to ensure that nothing actually changes. We are given a menu of options for managing the crisis and another for fighting the cuts. We do the hard work of organizing. We attend interminable meetings and plan largely symbolic actions. These things change nothing. The problem is simple: no decision making body has the power to give us what we want—and especially during a crisis, when the very existence of capitalism is at stake. The deans and chancellors making the cuts are subordinate to the UC president. The UC president is subordinate to the Board of Regents. The Board of Regents gets its money from the legislature. And the hands of the legislature are tied by the the California constitution, which requires a two-thirds majority to raise taxes.

We must reject all options on offer and demonstrate that without negotiations *it is still possible to act*. This is why we do not make demands. All demands assume the existence of a power capable of conceding them. We know this power does not exist. Why go through the motions of negotiation when we know we will not win anything but paltry concessions? Better to reveal the nature of the situation: there is no power to which we can appeal except that which we have found in one another.

That is also why we reject the logic of representation. No representative, no matter how charismatic, can achieve anything of consequence, except to deprive us of our own agency. Having representatives reduces us, once again, to passive onlookers upon our own activity. We have to take matters into our own hands. A huge demonstration is not a means to better bargaining; it is nothing if it is not an end in itself. A huge demonstration becomes an end in itself only when people at the demonstration start to act on their own; when they reject the power

who, acting on their own interests, tell people to be "reasonable" to wait for the right moment.

We do not want to wait any longer. We cannot afford to wait any longer.

This pamphlet is a guide to immediate action. It explains how to occupy buildings, with particular attention to universities. That is not because we believe students at the university have a special role to play, or because occupations are the only tactic with which we agree. It is simply because we *are* at the university, we *have* occupied a building here and we begin with what we know.

Occupations are a common tactic used at universities and other workplaces around the world. In 1999, students occupied the National Autonomous University of Mexico, the largest university in Latin America, to ensure that university education would remain free. In 2006, students occupied universities throughout France to repeal the CPE amendment, which would have made it easier for bosses to fire young workers. In 2008, workers occupied the Republic Windows and Doors factory in Chicago, winning concessions from Bank of America. In 2009, workers occupied the Ssangyong car factory in South Korea, holding it for two months and fighting a pitched battle against the police. These are only a few examples of what came before we occupied the Graduate Student Commons at UCSC in September.

We have been criticized for having acted as clandestine "adventurists", for ignoring the democratic process. We have seen the results of that process far too many times. It is never the case that, after people see the failures of letter-writing campaigns or teach-ins, they decide to try something else. They are disheartened that their hard work has come to nothing, and they return to their normal lives. When the next crisis occurs, new people get involved and democratically decide to make the same mistakes.

We have lived through too many cycles of failure and seek to try something else.

We wager that when people see what we are doing, they too will get involved. So far, that has proven true. Once enough people are involved, we will no longer have to act in a clandestine fashion. We will openly decide what to do next. We will march immediately to the administra-

tive building and occupy it indefinitely, without demands? Maybe we march from building to building with bullhorns, calling students and workers out into the street? Perhaps we will march to the base of campus and set up barricades, blocking entrances to the university.

In any case, we know that our movement will only grow in and through action. We do not have to wait: *we can act now and act later*. If in the past, it has taken longer to organize these sorts of actions, that is either because people started too big, or because they were up against stronger foes than the bumbling administration of a California public university. In fact, the reason it took so long to organize this action was simply that many were afraid. We respect these fears even if we encourage everyone to push their boundaries. Others will join the movement, not when their consciousness is raised to the appropriate level, but when they decide that participation is worth the associated risks. Some people feel they have nothing to lose and get involved immediately. Others have so much to lose that they will only get involved at the last possible moment. We trust one another to know what to do.

Those we meet—who are neither hostile to change as such nor self-described "leaders" offended by action taken without their permission—have not criticized us for acting too soon but for occupying such an insignificant building. To these we reply: you are not alone in your desire for escalation. Find us. When we have more numbers, we will take more and more buildings until the campus is ours.

Of course, the goal is not to shut down campus as an end in itself. Once we demonstrate our collective power to dissolve the university, we will decide together what to do next. By then, others will have taken action at other workplaces, and we will be able to decide with them. We know only this: that when we get the chance to strike, we will take it without hesitation. We will take whatever measures are necessary both to destroy this world as quickly as possible and to create, here and now, the world we want:

A WORLD WITHOUT WAGES,
WITHOUT BOSSES, WITHOUT
BORDERS, WITHOUT STATES

GENERAL THEORY OF OCCUPATIONS

Plan ahead.

- Whether we occupy as a small group of clandestine adventurers or at the head of a large and unruly crowd, it is good idea to plan ahead.
- Scope out the building. What sorts of doors will we have to lock down? What sorts of furniture are available for building barricades?
- Check as well for any useful materials outside or around the building. Are there escape routes? Are there rocks to throw at cops?

Draw a large crowd to the occupation.

- A large crowd, especially of 'ordinary, everyday people', is our first line of defense against a police attack.
- If there is a confrontation with the police, a large crowd will probably form anyway to gawk at the spectacle.
- But our best chance of holding the space is to get that crowd as close to the building as possible before the police arrive.
- That way, if the police build barricades, the crowd will be between us and the cops, rather than outside police lines.
- If that crowd is full of 'ordinary, everyday people', the cops will be less likely to use extreme force to remove us from the building.
- Draw a crowd by calling a meeting of some kind: to discuss the crisis or just to dance; or announce the occupation at some other group's meeting.
- Either (1) announce to the assembled crowd that an occupation is occurring and rush them over to the building as quickly as possible.
- Or (2) give a rousing speech, convince the crowd that we all have to occupy a building immediately and then do it.

Get control over a door.

- When we scope out a building, we want to get a sense of how we can open up the space to other people once the occupation is under way.
- Choose a door, an accessible window, or some other method of getting people into and out of the space.
- When outside barricades are built, make sure people know not to barricade this one entrance too heavily.
- For this entrance, set up a lock that can be opened and closed easily, so when the time is right, we can let more people into the space.

Open the space to other people.

- People often want to debate who they should let in to the space, but it is best to let in everyone (reserving the right to turn away sketchy people).
- The risks of diluting the group or letting sketchy people in are minimal compared to what we gain by making the occupation open to everyone.
- Opening the occupation reduces the risks taken by the original occupiers. It's

also the point of occupying—to build a movement through action.

If there is a continual police presence, having a crowd inside police barricades allows people to move in and out of the building via the crowd.

Transform the space.

When we occupy spaces, we never use them as they were 'intended' to be used: libraries are not for studying.

We take over spaces to transform their uses: we organize to occupy more spaces and build a social movement, but we also have fun.

Throw a sick as fuck dance party!

Do not make occupations into arrest actions.

Occupations are tactics within a broader struggle. There is no reason to get arrested just to prove a point. When all else fails, run away!

RECONNAISSANCE

Choosing a building:

- Fewest doors that need to be secured.
- Heavy furniture for making barricades.
- Central location with a lot of foot traffic.
- Contact with the outside world (balcony, windows).

Who owns the building?

- Exploit ambiguities in ownership.

Some occupations are more disruptive than others.

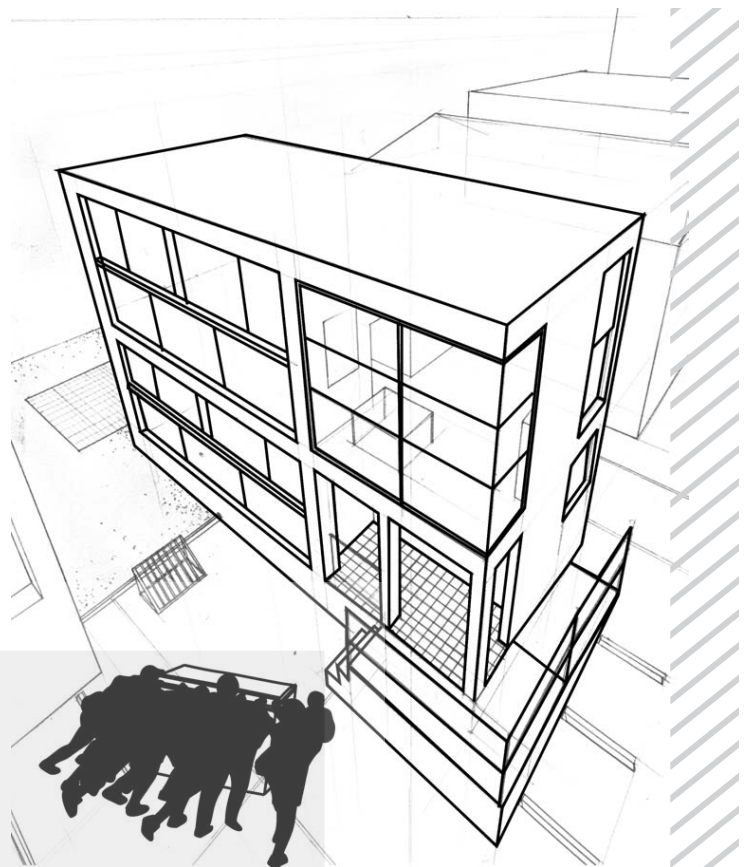
- At a university, occupying an administrative building would be more disruptive than occupying a student space.
- But for the same reason, administrative buildings are harder to hold. They're better left until we have a large social movement.
- Do not be afraid to take space from our purported representatives: unions, student government, etc.

When doing reconnaissance, be discreet but thorough:

- How many doors are there that have to be secured?
- Look for hidden doors and fire escapes.
- What do the doors look like, and how are they opened (handles)?
- We can secure doors using structural supports (poles, pipes). Are there any available?
- What furniture is available for building barricades?
- Can we secure a door in such a way that we can open it, either to let people in or to make an escape?
- If possible, take pictures or at least, take notes. It is always harder to remember the details than you think!

We may be in there for a while:

- Is there a bathroom, access to running water?



- Is there any way to get supplies in and out without opening a door?

Often it is possible to secure a floor or even a room, leaving the rest of the building intact.

SECURING DOORS

Doors open either towards the inside or the outside.

- Doors opening into the occupied space are the easiest to secure because we can barricade them closed.
- Unfortunately, doors in newer buildings tend to open out, so we have to secure the door independently of the barricade.

Different doors have different types of handles and are thus secured in different ways. Here are some examples.

• Door with handles:

Tie one end of a cable lock around the door handle. Tie the other end to a structure support, or even to another door handle. If no structural supports are available, use a piece of furniture or a large block of wood—anything larger than the door frame.

• Doors with bars:

If there is a space between the bar and the door, tie one end of a cable lock around the bar and the other end to a support.

If there is no space, secure a C-clamp to the bar. Loop the cable lock through the space created by the clamp.

• Swinging push doors:

Almost impossible to secure without damaging the doors. Unless they open into the occupied space, avoid them.

BE CREATIVE!

Make sure the doors are secured as tightly as possible:

- If the door opens even an inch, then the lock can be cut.

- Use carabiners to tie locks to one another.
- Carabiners also make it easy to open doors without disassembling the locking mechanism.

BUILDING BARRICADES

Whenever possible, build barricades both inside and outside the doors.

For the inside:

- Use as much heavy furniture as possible.
- Distribute the furniture evenly among the doors.
- Nothing too complicated or precarious.
- Do not excessively barricade the door we want to control.
- Do not stack up furniture that can be easily pushed aside, once doors are breached.
- We need to be able to apply pressure to keep the barricade in place (ie by pushing on it).

For the outside:

- Have a large crowd surround the building and especially against the doors.
- If police building barricades, we want the crowd inside the barricades.
- A separate, outside team should roll in and build outside barricades and then disperse.
- Use dumpsters, trees, wood pallets, chain-link fences, garbage cans filled with rocks.
- Make sure the outside team knows which door we want to control, so they do not barricade it too heavily.

OUTSIDE SUPPORT: LEGAL TEAM

Before the event takes place, contact a lawyer:

- Some lawyers are willing to provide free legal support. Most lawyers will want to meet with the occupiers before the action takes place.
- If at a university, find a lawyer who has some experience with university courts.

Have people fill out a legal release form and provide medical information beforehand, in case of arrest.

Have a legal support team:

- Have someone outside to note or record any abuse by police officers.
- Have someone at a hotline to contact for jail support. Occupiers should write this number on their body.

We should have our IDs and change for the phone, but little else as it will be taken in the event of arrest

Know your rights:

- Do NOT say anything to police except your name, that you do not consent to any searches and that you will not speak until your lawyer is present.
- Resisting arrest raises the stakes. If a police officer stops you, ask if you are being detained. If you are not being detained, walk away.
- In California, concealing your identity while committing a crime raises the charge to a felony. If the mask has something written on it, it may be protected by the 1st amendment.

OUTSIDE SUPPORT: MEDICAL TEAM

Have assigned medics both inside and outside:

- Medics should know about the needs of specific individuals involved in the action beforehand (medications, allergies).

- They should have a medical aid kit. Bring with you:
Water, latex gloves, duct tape, band-aids, gauze and tape, hydrogen peroxide, neosporin, aspirin, benadryl, emergenC.

Wear or bring with you:

- Comfortable clothing, running shoes, long-sleeves, eye protection, clothes to change into.

Do NOT wear:

- Contact lenses, oil-based make-up, things which can be easily grabbed. Do not use tampons if you may end up in jail.

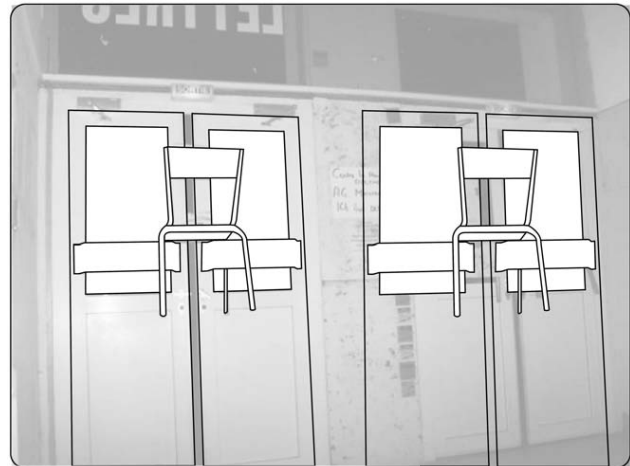
For pepper-spray: clean out eyes with a mixture of milk of magnesia and water.

For tear-gas: cover mouth with a cloth soaked in vinegar or water; use eye-protection.

OUTSIDE SUPPORT: MEDIA TEAM

This is not a symbolic action, but it is still important to have a media team. Have one or more people designated as media contacts, on the outside of the occupation:

- Remember to emphasize the media people as delegates, not representatives of those involved.
- Send articles to different news outlets; alternative media such as Indymedia allows for self-publication of events.



Set up an email address and website associated with the occupation: make this information easily available.

- Do not use the email addresses of anyone involved in the action.

No particular individuals inside the occupation should become too visible, lest they be branded as leaders.

No one on the inside should give televised interviews, or any more information about themselves than is necessary.

Press Releases:

- Have an initial statement prepared before the occupation is announced.
- Pour out your feelings, but make sure you provide a reasoned explanation for what you are doing.
- Do not have an official line. Do not prevent people from expressing themselves in their own way.
- Have people on hand to make and distribute flyers keeping people informed about what you are doing.
- It is hard to do in the middle of it all, but write as much as possible about what you are doing. Keep a diary of daily twists and turns for posterity.

OTHER THINGS TO ORGANIZE:

Collect phone numbers to set up an emergency mass text-message in case of a police raid.

- Bringing supplies into the occupation:
- It is possible that you will be removed in the first few hours. Do not overpack.
- Bring some food, a lot of water, and medical supplies, but not much else.
- Pack extra locks and cables in case you need them.
- Bring a safe computer, in case police confiscate your supplies.

If you are successful, people can bring you extra supplies:

- Food, cigarettes, blankets, etc.

Share everything. Inside the occupation, there is no private property.

Break down barriers between people.

If possible, take pictures of building before you leave, for legal reasons.

Do not make occupations into arrest actions.

Occupations are tactics within a broader struggle. There is no reason to get arrested just to prove a point. When all else fails, run away!

RECONNAISSANCE

Choosing a building:

- Fewest doors that need to be secured.
- Heavy furniture for making barricades.
- Central location with a lot of foot traffic.
- Contact with the outside world (balcony, windows).

Who owns the building?

- Exploit ambiguities in ownership.

Some occupations are more disruptive than others.

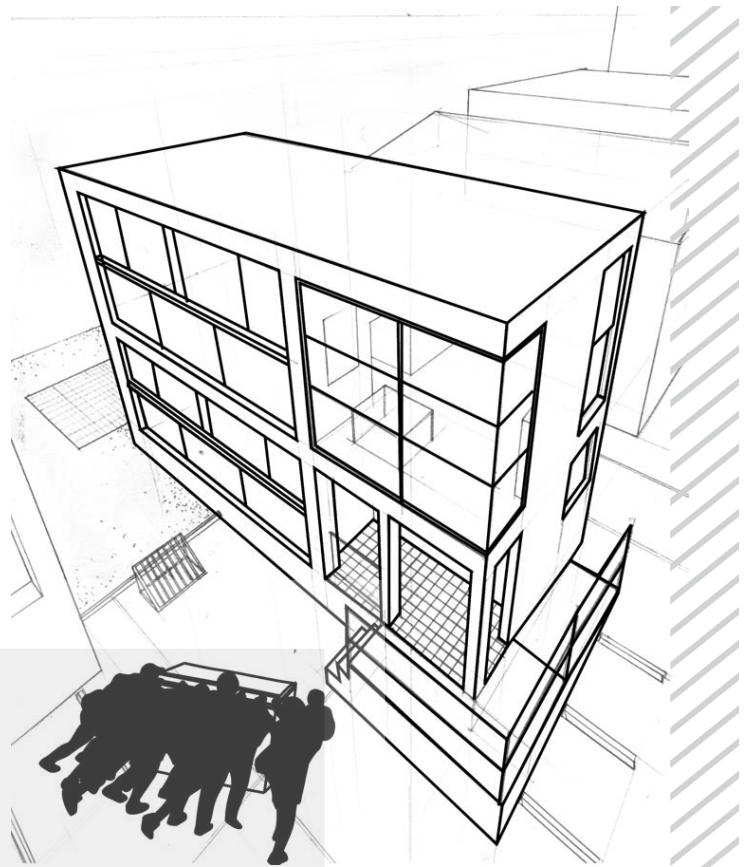
- At a university, occupying an administrative building would be more disruptive than occupying a student space.
- But for the same reason, administrative buildings are harder to hold. They're better left until we have a large social movement.
- Do not be afraid to take space from our purported representatives: unions, student government, etc.

When doing reconnaissance, be discreet but thorough:

- How many doors are there that have to be secured?
- Look for hidden doors and fire escapes.
- What do the doors look like, and how are they opened (handles)?
- We can secure doors using structural supports (poles, pipes). Are there any available?
- What furniture is available for building barricades?
- Can we secure a door in such a way that we can open it, either to let people in or to make an escape?
- If possible, take pictures or at least, take notes. It is always harder to remember the details than you think!

We may be in there for a while:

- Is there a bathroom, access to running water?



- Is there any way to get supplies in and out without opening a door?

Often it is possible to secure a floor or even a room, leaving the rest of the building intact.

SECURING DOORS

Doors open either towards the inside or the outside.

- Doors opening into the occupied space are the easiest to secure because we can barricade them closed.
- Unfortunately, doors in newer buildings tend to open out, so we have to secure the door independently of the barricade.

Different doors have different types of handles and are thus secured in different ways. Here are some examples.

• Door with handles:

Tie one end of a cable lock around the door handle. Tie the other end to a structure support, or even to another door handle. If no structural supports are available, use a piece of furniture or a large block of wood—anything larger than the door frame.

• Doors with bars:

If there is a space between the bar and the door, tie one end of a cable lock around the bar and the other end to a support.

If there is no space, secure a C-clamp to the bar. Loop the cable lock through the space created by the clamp.

• Swinging push doors:

Almost impossible to secure without damaging the doors. Unless they open into the occupied space, avoid them.

BE CREATIVE!

Make sure the doors are secured as tightly as possible:

- If the door opens even an inch, then the lock can be cut.

- Use carabiners to tie locks to one another.
- Carabiners also make it easy to open doors without disassembling the locking mechanism.

BUILDING BARRICADES

Whenever possible, build barricades both inside and outside the doors.

For the inside:

- Use as much heavy furniture as possible.
- Distribute the furniture evenly among the doors.
- Nothing too complicated or precarious.
- Do not excessively barricade the door we want to control.
- Do not stack up furniture that can be easily pushed aside, once doors are breached.
- We need to be able to apply pressure to keep the barricade in place (ie by pushing on it).

For the outside:

- Have a large crowd surround the building and especially against the doors.
- If police building barricades, we want the crowd inside the barricades.
- A separate, outside team should roll in and build outside barricades and then disperse.
- Use dumpsters, trees, wood pallets, chain-link fences, garbage cans filled with rocks.
- Make sure the outside team knows which door we want to control, so they do not barricade it too heavily.

OUTSIDE SUPPORT: LEGAL TEAM

Before the event takes place, contact a lawyer:

- Some lawyers are willing to provide free legal support. Most lawyers will want to meet with the occupiers before the action takes place.
- If at a university, find a lawyer who has some experience with university courts.

Have people fill out a legal release form and provide medical information beforehand, in case of arrest.

Have a legal support team:

- Have someone outside to note or record any abuse by police officers.
- Have someone at a hotline to contact for jail support. Occupiers should write this number on their body.

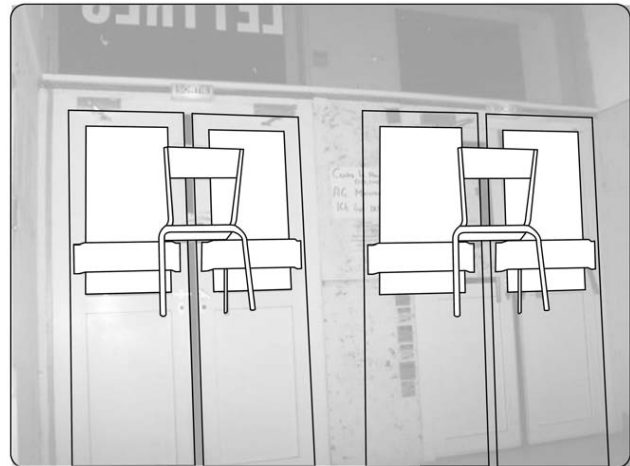

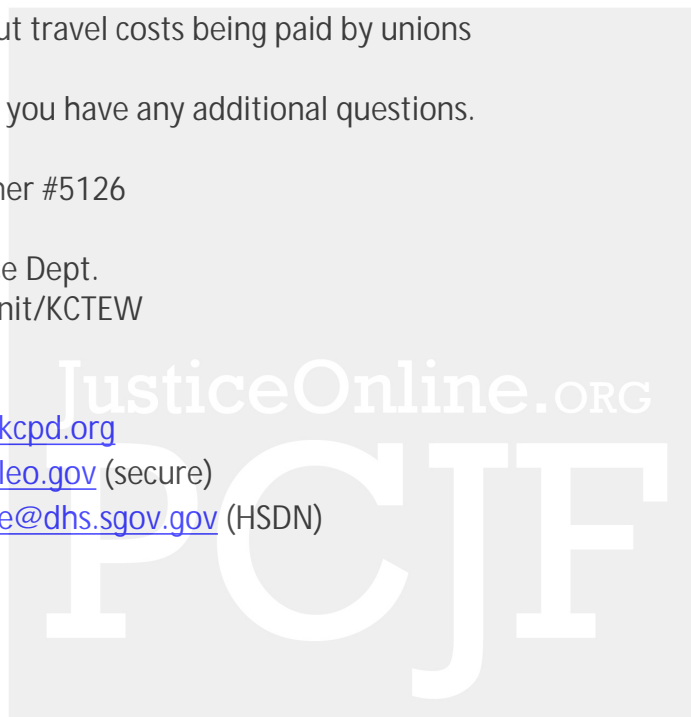

Occupy Phoenix to protest on light rail Thursday

Protesters involved with the Phoenix version of the anti-Wall Street movement say they are planning to "occupy the light rail" on Thursday.

Speaking on behalf of Occupy Phoenix, Ezra Kaplan said protesters will board the light rail trains at 7 a.m. Thursday at three major stops: Sycamore/ Main in Mesa; Washington/Central in downtown Phoenix; and Montebello/19th Avenue.

"The goal is to hit the rush-hour traffic (on the light rail)," Kaplan said. "Once the rush-hour traffic calms down, it (the protest) will probably taper off."

Kaplan said the group also is planning a flash mob that would take place in the downtown business and entertainment areas around noon on Thursday.

The group also is planning a rally on Friday. Kaplan said it will likely begin in the afternoon.

A steady group of Occupy Phoenix protesters has met every day at Cesar Chavez Plaza in downtown Phoenix near City Hall, where police have been monitoring the group to ensure, among other things, that the protesters are obeying the city's no-camping law. This law bars protesters from spending the night on the plaza.

Protesters have objected about the law to the Phoenix City Council, but the nine-member council has declined to offer the group a waiver. The protesters also asked for public port-a-potties. They have been using restrooms at nearby businesses and public buildings.

Last week, Phoenix police spokesman Sgt Trent Crump said that since the protest began in mid-October, 50 protesters have been arrested. Crump said some of the protesters were cited for violations of the no-camping law, as well

as issues with public urination and defecation.

The protesters argue that the police and other city officials are unfairly portraying them as homeless people.

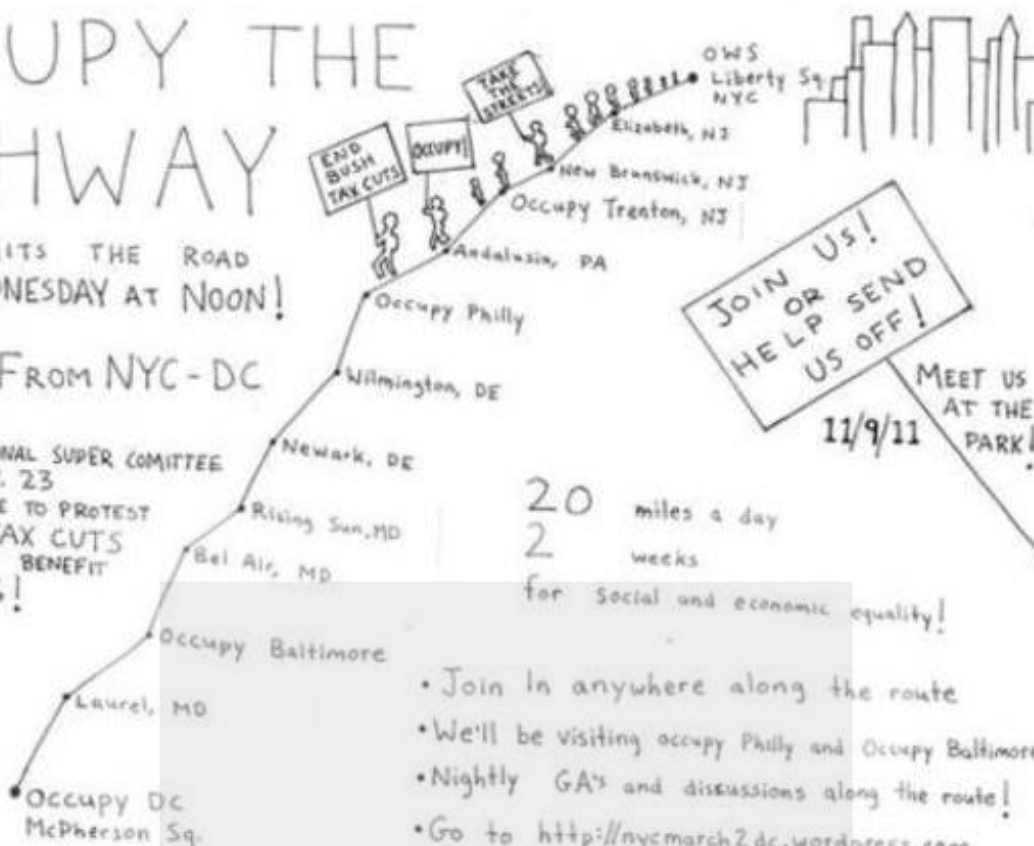

Occupy the Skies! Protesters Could Use Spy Drones

The proliferation of drones throughout the military — and into civilian law enforcement — can make it feel like we're living in an airborne panopticon. **But flying robots are agnostic about who they train their gaze upon, and can spy on cops as easily as they can spy on civilians.**

In the video above, protesters in Warsaw got a drone's eye view of a phalanx of police in riot gear during a heated Saturday demonstration. The drone — spotted by *Wired* editor-in-chief and drone-builder Chris Anderson — was a tiny Polish RoboKopter equipped with a videocamera.

As Chris observes, no more do citizens need to wait for news choppers to get aerial footage of a major event. With drones, they can shoot their own overhead video. But the implications run deeper than that.

The Occupy events around the country gained initial notoriety by filming and uploading incidents of apparent police brutality. Anyone with a cellphone camera and a YouTube account could become a videographer, focusing attention on behavior that cops or banks might not want broadcasted or that the media might not transmit. When the New York Police Department cleared out Zuccotti Park on Tuesday, out came the cellphones to document it.

Getting an aerial view is the next step in compelling DIY citizen video.

As Chris' DIY Drones blog documents, it's as simple as hooking a remote-controlled model aircraft to a camera, or tricking it out to your own specifications. **Some Occupy chapters already provide mobile livecasts using Wi-Fi hot spots — more on that in a forthcoming piece for our sister blog, Threat Level — and placing cameras and laptops in baby strollers. It's not crazy to think that an enterprising Occupier might go vertical.**

Imagine what that would have shown in a hairy situation like the Occupy Oakland tear gas incident. An aerial view gives an entirely different perspective what constitutes a legitimate — and illegitimate — threat.

It would also complicate an emerging trend: police use of aerial drones. Which happens to be the subject of my piece in the December issue of *Playboy*.

It's not yet online, but the article examines a police department in Miami-Dade that recently got the first-ever thumbs up from the Federal Aviation Administration to send drones into the skies for law enforcement in an American city. A sampling:

'The [Miami-Dade Police Department] swears that those it's paid to protect and serve don't need to worry about being spied upon nonstop. First of all, the T-Hawk can't fly for longer than 46 minutes. For another, it's as loud as a lawnmower ...

But perhaps the biggest reason Miami-Dade cops are pledging restraint is because they fear the FAA will repeal their T-Hawk's Certification of Authorization — or jeopardize another police department's chance at receiving a certificate — if they use it frivolously or mistakenly crash it into a local news helicopter. "One person can really make a negative impact and set the program back several years," says Andrew Cohen, the MDPD sergeant who runs the aviation unit at the Kendall-Tamiami airport.'

That's because the use of urban airspace is even more heavily restricted than the use of public parks. The Miami cops have had a tough time getting their clearance; think about how hard it'll be for protesters. Still, the air is slowly opening up. And the cops don't have to be the only ones with eyes in the sky. © Condé Nast Digital. All rights reserved.

2.) Assassination By Killer Drone? The Possibilities Are Endless!

[The first two excerpts are out of order and I only put it here for emphasis: On 14 September 2005, the Pakistani Army announced it had seized a Chinese-made drone in a raid on a suspected Al-Qaeda hideout in North Waziristan. Lieutenant General Safdar Hussain told reporters that the militants had used the technology to 'check the position of security forces and attack them,' adding that the vehicle was also capable of carrying weapons. In 2006, Ali Asad Chandia, a teacher from Maryland in the US, was convicted of providing material support to the Pakistani jihadist group Lashkar-e-Tayyiba (LeT). Among other things, he attempted to acquire a GPS guidance system for a model aircraft on behalf of the LeT.

Just as the US has weaponised its MQ-1B Predator UAVs, the obvious next step for militants is to turn drones into guided weapon systems. Using a UAV to carry out attacks presents many distinct advantages over conventional methods: they can be covertly launched from virtually anywhere, reach otherwise inaccessible targets and potentially cause mass panic with minimum risk to their operators...]

...According to the affidavit submitted by the FBI, he said he wanted to 'decapitate the entire empire' and 'severely disrupt the head and heart of the snake', a term that Al-Qaeda has used to refer to the United States. Ferdaus has pleaded not guilty.

While the plan detailed in the affidavit is unlikely to have had the devastating impact that Ferdaus allegedly hoped to cause, the case has highlighted how rapid technological advancements are making a sophisticated tactical technology, previously only used by nation states, available to terrorists and insurgent groups.

...Although previous generations of drones required expertise in both electronics and radio transmission, today's equipment is vastly simpler to build and operate.

...In 2003, it was possible for a model aircraft designer to fly a remote-controlled plane more than 3,000 km across the Atlantic Ocean on less than a gallon (3.8 litres) of fuel. These efficiencies allow for larger payloads and more equipment to be carried by the drone, opening the door to a wider variety of missions.

[Excerpt out of order: ...using drones as a way to guide improvised explosive devices to their targets could be an effective terrorist weapon, the most obvious target being crowds of people attending open air events where ground infiltration would be difficult. Although C4 is difficult to detonate in mid-air, only 1 kg is required to destroy a car and some model aircraft are capable of carrying between 5 and 15 kg.

...For only USD16.95 anyone can buy the Chinese-made Quantum 'bomb' drop system for remote control aircraft. This 23.5 cm long case splits open to release a

103 g payload of the user's choice. It can be installed in just seconds by connecting the bomb with a radio channel so that it can be released on demand...]

...Using electronic goggles, operators are able to view a virtual-reality cockpit with video streaming in real time from a camera mounted on their drone. Austrian-born Raphael Pirker, also known as 'Trappy', is one of the most well-known in the FPV community, often posting his drone's high-definition videos on the internet. With his modified RiteWing Zephyr aircraft, he is able to go up mountains, down the sides of cliffs or, in one particularly controversial incident, whirl around the head of the Statue of Liberty and over buildings, bridges and streets of New York City.

Many were outraged that a person would be allowed to fly a drone across such a sensitive area, yet the laws prohibiting this action are not yet well developed. From a security point of view, Pirker's videos show how easy it would be for a terrorist to conduct surveillance or even crash into a targeted person, vehicle or building dozens of kilometres away.

Two US security consultants proved what could be done by ill-intentioned actors when they unveiled what they called the Wireless Aerial Surveillance Platform at the Black Hat security conference held in Las Vegas during August. The system consists of a surplus military target drone equipped to imitate a mobile telephone base station so that it can intercept calls. The drone can be programmed with GPS co-ordinates and carries a Linux computer with powerful hacking capabilities, including a 340-million word dictionary that can be used to generate passwords to break into WiFi networks. The security consultants spent only USD6,000 producing the drones.

...there are even more frightening scenarios involving drones, including using them to deploy weapons of mass destruction... Senator Sam Nunn... laid out three 'out of the box' terrorism scenarios. One involved terrorists flying a small UAV loaded with two 40 lb canisters of weaponised Anthrax spores into the Capitol building on the night of the president's State of the Union address to Congress. In Nunn's scenario, terrorists remotely flew the drone from a short distance away and were able to kill hundreds of lawmakers and senior government officials. While the president survived, the government was left paralysed and a huge, densely populated area was biologically contaminated.

With their ability to fly straight flight paths at varying altitudes, modern hobbyist UAVs are almost perfectly suited to deploy chemical, biological or radiological agents. Trends are already moving in this direction: a video-posted online shows how one Japanese farmer, tired of working in the sweltering heat, turned his remote-controlled helicopter into a crop-duster. If a terrorist were to use this same concept to spread a lethal agent over a crowd instead of pesticides over rice fields, the potential for harm could be enormous.

Terrorist groups have already contemplated using remote-controlled aircraft for chemical weapons attacks. In 1995, Aum Shinrikyo, the Japanese terrorist group that attacked the Tokyo subway system with Sarin, planned to use remote-controlled helicopters to spray dangerous chemicals from the air, but it was unable to get the operation of the aircraft correct in trial runs. If the group had been successful, it is hard to tell how much damage it would have been able to inflict on a densely populated area. The group would have been unlikely to face such helicopter-operation problems today.

Another scenario that should not be discounted is one in which terrorists could take control of military drones and use them for their own purposes. This possibility was raised in 2009, when it was revealed that anyone could use a cheap piece of off-the-shelf software to download the unencrypted feeds from US surveillance drones. The Wall Street Journal reported that this had been done by Iraqi Shia militants equipped with a USD26 piece of Russian software used to steal satellite television signals. While the militants were not able to control the drones, they would have been able to view live video feeds and use them to monitor and evade US operations.

One of the most significant problems with the terrorist drone threat is the small window of opportunity to stop an attack once it has been launched, given the speeds of some remote-controlled aircraft. Responders would have less than two minutes to intercept an aircraft launched from 5 km away, travelling at 200 km/h. Even if evacuation was feasible, it would be difficult to determine a drone's ultimate target, given its ability to change flight path according to pre-programmed coordinates and attack targets of opportunity.

A video posted online in October by the Iraqi militant group Ansar-al-Islam (*Ansar al Islam was the al qaida connected group who hosted Zarqawi and other al Qaida fighters after the invasion of Afghanistan and it was a key factor in former President Bush's case for going to war with Iraq. Isaac R.*) showed that insurgents are already deploying other forms of robotic weapons. It showed a vehicle-borne IED that can be remotely steered to its target and a tripod-mounted machine gun that can be fired by remote control. The US military in Iraq confirmed it had found 'a robot that can be used to remotely transport IEDs' in one of the group's safe houses in February 2010.

Attack of the drones - The dangers of remote-controlled aircraft

Key Points

- **Rapid advances in remote controlled aircraft and drone technologies are providing terrorists with new, more effective ways of carrying out surveillance and attacks.**

- The payload, distance and speed of hobbyist drones are improving rapidly and several non-state actors have either launched or planned attacks using remote controlled aircraft.

- **In the future, terrorists will increasingly exploit commercial drone technologies, presenting new challenges for militaries and security organisations that are discovering they no longer have a monopoly on using remote-controlled aircraft for intelligence gathering and kinetic attack.**

Remote-controlled aircraft and drone technologies are providing terrorists with new ways of carrying out surveillance and attacks. Marc Goodman looks at how these developments are presenting challenges for militaries and security organisations.

The US Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) announced on 28 September that it had disrupted a plot to attack the Pentagon and Capitol building with remote-controlled model aircraft packed with explosives. Authorities arrested Rezwan Ferdaus, a 28-year-old Northeastern University physics graduate of Bangladeshi descent. **According to the affidavit submitted by the FBI, he said he wanted to 'decapitate the entire empire' and 'severely disrupt the head and heart of the snake', a term that Al-Qaeda has used to refer to the United States. Ferdaus has pleaded not guilty.**

While the plan detailed in the affidavit is unlikely to have had the devastating impact that Ferdaus allegedly hoped to cause, the case has highlighted how rapid technological advancements are making a sophisticated tactical technology, previously only used by nation states, available to terrorists and insurgent groups.

Technological trickledown

In the 1970s, remote-controlled aircraft that could operate beyond the line of sight and carry film cameras were only used by militaries. However, by the late 1990s, the drones and their video systems decreased in price and size. Now, all the components necessary to build one are commercially available. **Although previous generations of drones required expertise in both electronics and radio transmission, today's equipment is vastly simpler to build and operate.**

The software and hardware needed to turn a standard hobby remote-controlled aircraft into a fully autonomous unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) is readily available and many now come with this feature built-in. There are dozens of options and sensors, ranging in sophistication and utility, which are conveniently accessible through a variety of online vendors. For example, the AP50 autopilot and flight-control system, produced by UAV Flight Systems, includes a global positioning systems (GPS) antenna for location; it can direct the orientation of the aircraft through information obtained from a three-axis sensor module, and includes a two-axis accelerometer, a barometric altimeter, a pilot airspeed sensor and two computers for stability support and executing mission-related tasks.

The weight of modern onboard navigation equipment and sensors is dropping steadily due to advances in information technology and miniaturisation. This allows drone pilots to do more with less. **In 2003, it was possible for a model aircraft designer to fly a remote-controlled plane more than 3,000 km across the Atlantic Ocean on less than a gallon (3.8 litres) of fuel. These efficiencies allow for larger payloads and more equipment to be carried by the drone, opening the door to a wider variety of missions.**

UAV technology is also constantly improving, particularly with regards to precision of movement. David Mellinger, a PhD student at the University of Pennsylvania, posted a video on the internet in May demonstrating that he could programme a quadrotor helicopter to move aggressively. Mellinger's aircraft is capable of flying through windows with less than 8 cm of clearance, even at an angle. It can do flips, attach to surfaces, such as walls, at different angles and move at rapid speeds. With further advances in the use of multiple cameras and sophisticated software, there will be an incredible transformation in the versatility of the next generation of mini-UAVs.

The sophistication of sensors carried by hobbyist drones is increasing substantially, spawning new trends, including the streaming of first person video (FPV). **Using electronic goggles, operators are able to view a virtual-reality cockpit with video streaming in real time from a camera mounted on their drone. Austrian-born Raphael Pirker, also known as 'Trappy', is one of the most well-known in the FPV community, often posting his drone's high-definition videos on the internet. With his modified RiteWing Zephyr aircraft, he is able to go up mountains, down the sides of cliffs or, in one particularly controversial incident, whirl around the head of the Statue of Liberty and over buildings, bridges and streets of New York City.**

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Two US security consultants proved what could be done by ill-intentioned actors when they unveiled what they called the Wireless Aerial Surveillance Platform at the Black Hat security conference held in Las Vegas during August. The system consists of a surplus military target drone equipped to imitate a mobile telephone base station so that it can intercept calls. The drone can be programmed with GPS co-ordinates and carries a Linux computer with powerful hacking capabilities, including a 340-million word dictionary that can be used to generate passwords to break into WiFi networks. The security consultants spent only USD6,000 producing the drones.

Fully functional drone systems that require no assembly are already available for purchase by the general public. The AR Parrot Drone, for example, costs USD300, is

controlled using a smartphone and sends back real-time video feed to the operator's smartphone or tablet computer. When modified with a lightweight computer running Linux, a broadband connection, a GPS receiver and two WiFi cards, the Parrot can be turned into a drone that is capable of hacking into WiFi systems and carrying out rudimentary signals intelligence.

Governments are encouraging the rapid development of a grassroots drone technology. The Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA) in the US has announced a contest to see who can design a UAV that is small enough to fit in a rucksack and costs less than USD10,000. This is what the members of online forums have been doing for years. DIYDrones.com, a group led by Wired magazine's editor-in-chief Chris Anderson, has 15,000 members exploring the boundaries of what is possible with do-it yourself drone technology.

Iran is looking to do the same, in which events like the Div-e-Sepid contest, where competitors from 65 teams race their homemade drones around Mount Damavand. The drones are equipped with cameras and participants have to complete a set of challenges, such as spotting hidden markers or plotting their precise coordinates.

Terrorist plans

Drones have already been used by non-state actors for conducting surveillance. In November 2004, the Lebanese militant group Hizbullah announced it had carried out aerial reconnaissance over Israel for the first time using a Mirsad-1 drone and later broadcast footage taken during the flight on its television station. The Israeli military confirmed the flight and said the drone was supplied by Iran.

On 14 September 2005, the Pakistani Army announced it had seized a Chinese-made drone in a raid on a suspected Al-Qaeda hideout in North Waziristan. Lieutenant General Safdar Hussain told reporters that the militants had used the technology to 'check the position of security forces and attack them,' adding that the vehicle was also capable of carrying weapons. In 2006, Ali Asad Chandia, a teacher from Maryland in the US, was convicted of providing material support to the Pakistani jihadist group Lashkar-e-Tayyiba (LeT). Among other things, he attempted to acquire a GPS guidance system for a model aircraft on behalf of the LeT.

Just as the US has weaponised its MQ-1B Predator UAVs, the obvious next step for militants is to turn drones into guided weapon systems. Using a UAV to carry out attacks presents many distinct advantages over conventional methods: they can be covertly launched from virtually anywhere, reach otherwise inaccessible targets and potentially cause mass panic with minimum risk to their operators. While no such attacks have yet been recorded as yet, there are already signs that militants are developing these weapons. In 2004, six members of the Palestinian militant group Hamas were allegedly killed when trying to make their own explosive-packed drone. An Israeli F-16 jet shot down a weaponised Hizbullah drone over the Mediterranean in August 2006. It

was identified as an Iranian-made Ababil-T, which can be fitted with a 45 kg warhead, although the Israeli military said the one it had downed was unarmed.

Ferdaus allegedly planned to use a similar concept. He travelled to Washington DC in May to conduct pre-attack reconnaissance and then unwittingly gave USB drives detailing his plans and material requirements to undercover FBI agents posing as Al-Qaeda operatives. Those plans detailed how he wanted to launch remote-controlled aircraft from East Potomac Park to fly two into the Pentagon and one into the Capital building to 'blow the dome to smithereens'.

He wanted to use 1/10 scale models of the F-4 Phantom fighter aircraft in the attack, noting that they can be purchased fully assembled with GPS navigation equipment, were capable of travelling at up to 160 mph (258 km/h) and could carry a payload of 10 to 12 lbs (4.5 to 5.4 kg), according to the affidavit.

The affidavit said he later opted to use two cheaper F-86 Sabre fighter aircraft models to attack the Pentagon, and purchased one with USD6,500 provided by the undercover agents. He allegedly asked the undercover agents for 24 lbs (11 kg) of explosives, hand grenades and six automatic weapons. According to the affidavit, he intended to pack 5 lbs (2.3 kg) of explosive into each of the three aircraft and use the rest to blow up bridges surrounding the Pentagon. The automatic weapons and grenades were for a follow-on attack that he allegedly wanted to lead against the Pentagon to capitalise on the disruption caused by the aerial attack. He was arrested when the undercover agents supplied him with six Kalashnikov assault rifles, three hand grenades and what he believed to be 25 lbs of C4 plastic explosive.

It is extremely unlikely that a model aircraft carrying around 2 kg of plastic explosives would have destroyed the dome of the Capitol building, and the plans detailed in the affidavit probably underestimated the Pentagon's ability to withstand attack. Nevertheless, **this concept for using drones as a way to guide improvised explosive devices to their targets could be an effective terrorist weapon, the most obvious target being crowds of people attending open air events where ground infiltration would be difficult. Although C4 is difficult to detonate in mid-air, only 1 kg is required to destroy a car and some model aircraft are capable of carrying between 5 and 15 kg.**

It does not take a sophisticated military-grade device to create a drone capable of delivering an explosive payload. For only USD16.95 anyone can buy the Chinese-made Qunum 'bomb' drop system for remote control aircraft. This 23.5 cm long case splits open to release a 103 g payload of the user's choice. It can be installed in just seconds by connecting the bomb with a radio channel so that it can be released on demand. Although sold as a leisure accessory, when used with a drone equipped with GPS navigation and video feed, this type of device could effectively and accurately deliver a pernicious payload on any desired target. The Qunum bomb system, and the many more like it that will surely follow, make it far easier for any terrorist to turn a remote-controlled plane into an aerial bomber.

Gunships and missiles

It is also possible to develop drones capable of carrying firearms. Commercial versions already exist: developed by Vanguard Defense, Shadowhawk is a remote-controlled helicopter that can be outfitted with 40 mm grenade launchers, stun guns or automatic small-arms. Already in use in East Africa for anti-piracy purposes, the Shadowhawk can patrol for 2.5 hours and reach a speed of 110 km/h. It comes in five different models that can also be outfitted with a turbine or piston engine, CCD TV optics, infrared and thermal cameras, laser pointers, illuminators, GPS and range finders. It even includes software capable of tracking moving objects such as people or vehicles.

In time, such technology is likely to become available to members of the general public. However, there are already many online videos of homemade armed mini-UAVs: one shows a Bergen Gasser EB mini-helicopter carrying a Springfield 1911-A .45 calibre weapon with a digital camera gun sight for accurate shooting.

Another online video demonstrated how a hobbyist remote-controlled aircraft could be used as a guided anti-aircraft weapon. In 2009, footage filmed by a small model aircraft showed it flying directly at a Virgin Blue airliner in the vicinity of Perth airport, Australia. The resulting near-miss was apparently done intentionally to recreate a scene from the film Top Gun. Aviation experts have said the model plane could have caused severe damage if it had been sucked into one of the airliner's engines or cracked the windshield. The offender currently faces up to two years in jail for his stunt.

A remote-controlled aircraft could prove to be a deadly weapon. In 2009, a US Airways airliner had to make an emergency landing in the Hudson River after birds got caught in the engines. The impact of an anti-aircraft attack with a remote-controlled aircraft could be substantially worse if it contained explosives or if multiple drones were used simultaneously.

Nightmare scenario

As problematic as kinetic explosive attacks and UAV gunships might be, there are even more frightening scenarios involving drones, including using them to deploy weapons of mass destruction. In a 1994 meeting to discuss the future of counter-proliferation in a post-Soviet world, Senator Sam Nunn, the then chairman of the US Senate Committee on Armed Services, laid out three 'out of the box' terrorism scenarios. One involved terrorists flying a small UAV loaded with two 40 lb canisters of weaponised Anthrax spores into the Capitol building on the night of the president's State of the Union address to Congress. In Nunn's scenario, terrorists remotely flew the drone from a short distance away and were able to kill hundreds of lawmakers and senior government officials. While the president survived, the government was left paralysed and a huge, densely populated area was biologically contaminated.

With their ability to fly straight flight paths at varying altitudes, modern hobbyist UAVs are almost perfectly suited to deploy chemical, biological or radiological agents. Trends are already moving in this direction: a video-posted online shows how one Japanese farmer, tired of working in the sweltering heat, turned his remote-controlled helicopter into a crop-duster. If a terrorist were to use this same concept to spread a lethal agent over a crowd instead of pesticides over rice fields, the potential for harm could be enormous.

One study showed that if 900 g of weapons-grade anthrax was dropped from a height of 100 m upwind of a large US city, an estimated 1.5 million people would become infected, with more than a 100,000 dying. Another study showed the consequences of dispersing a radiological weapon consisting of 2 kg of plutonium and 50 g of caesium over San Diego could lead to an 8 km area being contaminated and thousands of people exposed.

Terrorist groups have already contemplated using remote-controlled aircraft for chemical weapons attacks. In 1995, Aum Shinrikyo, the Japanese terrorist group that attacked the Tokyo subway system with Sarin, planned to use remote-controlled helicopters to spray dangerous chemicals from the air, but it was unable to get the operation of the aircraft correct in trial runs. If the group had been successful, it is hard to tell how much damage it would have been able to inflict on a densely populated area. The group would have been unlikely to face such helicopter-operation problems today.

Hack attacks

Another scenario that should not be discounted is one in which terrorists could take control of military drones and use them for their own purposes. This possibility was raised in 2009, when it was revealed that anyone could use a cheap piece of off-the-shelf software to download the unencrypted feeds from US surveillance drones. The Wall Street Journal reported that this had been done by Iraqi Shia militants equipped with a USD26 piece of Russian software used to steal satellite television signals. While the militants were not able to control the drones, they would have been able to view live video feeds and use them to monitor and evade US operations.

This was possible because Predator UAVs use a satellite link to send information to command and control bases back in the US. It was later revealed that the US government, presuming nobody would attempt to intercept their video feeds, never bothered to encrypt this information. Such underestimation of an enemy's capabilities might have proved to be a serious error that could have resulted in death and injury to coalition forces in Iraq.

Another incident was revealed in October, when the US military admitted its Predator and Reaper drones had been infected with a computer virus that logged the keystrokes made by pilots as they remotely conducted their missions. While it is not known who was behind the infection or whether it was done accidentally or maliciously, it highlighted another security weakness in US drone operations and heightened concern that hackers may be able to take control of military drones.

While the US is working to improve its security, this possibility will become more likely as drones are deployed by more military and law enforcement agencies. The Teal Group, a company that tracks defence and aerospace markets, has estimated that global spending on procurement of drones over the next decade could total more than USD94 billion. While other militaries are looking to follow the US lead in deploying weaponised drones, most of the new systems will be unarmed, with police, archaeologists, fire-fighters, scientists, universities and entertainment studios all expressing interest in acquiring drones that will provide cheap aerial coverage and allow them to operate in dangerous areas. Honeywell's T-Hawk drone, for example, was used in Japan to survey damage at the stricken Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant.

Anti-drone defences

The proliferation of UAVs for legitimate purposes will complicate efforts to respond to the growing threat of terrorist drones. In the future, people may become desensitised to the sight of miniature aircraft flying low overhead, leading to a situation where it might be harder to tell when one of the devices is being operated by criminals or terrorists.

While there may be attempts to regulate the purchase of remote control aircraft in the future, in most jurisdictions there is currently little if any legislation regulating their sale. In the meantime, virtually anybody could make a functioning mini-UAV with commercially available parts. By one estimate, the kit plane market consists of nearly 100,000 copies of more than 400 different designs from manufacturers worldwide, a decidedly difficult market to regulate and police.

Some governments are beginning to re-examine their ability to respond to terrorist drone attacks. In a recent interview with CBS News' 60 Minutes television programme, New York Police Commissioner Ray Kelly said the New York Police Department had the capability to shoot down an aircraft if an extreme situation were ever to arise, although he declined to provide details.

Targeting a small, low-flying drone presents different challenges to bringing down a hijacked airliner. Since 2003 the Pentagon has held an annual exercise called Black Dart, in which participants experiment with different weapons to bring down small aircraft. Trying to shoot down small UAVs has proved difficult. While the radio signals used to control drones can be jammed, in a crisis situation emergency responders and ordinary citizens rely on these same radio signals to communicate important information. Causing a blackout on these frequencies could do more harm than good and there is no guarantee it will be effective in stopping an attack.

One of the most significant problems with the terrorist drone threat is the small window of opportunity to stop an attack once it has been launched, given the speeds of some remote-controlled aircraft. Responders would have less than two minutes to intercept an aircraft launched from 5 km away, travelling at 200 km/h. Even if evacuation was feasible, it would be difficult to determine a drone's ultimate target,

given its ability to change flight path according to pre-programmed coordinates and attack targets of opportunity.

A video posted online in October by the Iraqi militant group Ansar-al-Islam showed that insurgents are already deploying other forms of robotic weapons. It showed a vehicle-borne IED that can be remotely steered to its target and a tripod-mounted machine gun that can be fired by remote control. The US military in Iraq confirmed it had found 'a robot that can be used to remotely transport IEDs' in one of the group's safe houses in February 2010.

Although previous attempts by terrorists to operationalise the use of remote-controlled aircraft have had limited impact or been intercepted, it may be a matter of time before this increasingly commonplace technology is used to cause substantial harm.

Iraqi militant group demonstrates mobile killer robots

Ansar al-Islam, an Iraqi militant Sunni Islamist group, released an electronic pamphlet to jihadist forums in October that announced it was building vehicle-borne improvised explosive devices (VBIED) that can be steered to their targets by remote control.

The pamphlet admitted the vehicles were difficult to control but said the problem had been offset by the installation of video cameras. It claimed the group had been developing remotely controlled vehicles since 2005 and produced the first working model in 2006. It said the vehicles performed well in tests and only malfunctioned once, when one was immobilised when it hit a concrete barrier in an attempted attack on Iraqi soldiers in early 2007.

The pamphlet also provided a link to a trailer for a forthcoming video, which included footage of a driverless car on the move, a remotely operated weapon station mounted with a machine gun and various other types of improvised weapons.

US forces in Iraq released a statement in February 2010 saying that Iraqi security forces had carried out a raid on an Ansar al-Islam safehouse in the Mosul area of northern Iraq and found 'a robot that can be used to remotely transport IEDs,' as well as 20 shoulder-launched surface-to-air missiles and various other weapons and equipment. No further details of the robot were provided.

Remotely controlled VBIEDs could be useful for militants as they do not require a suicide bomber and are potentially less vulnerable to counter-fire from well-defended targets. However, they would require more time and resources to build and would probably be unreliable and difficult to control in complex urban environments. They may also be vulnerable to the types of electronic jamming equipment used against remotely triggered IEDs. © IHS Global Limited, 2011

That's because the use of urban airspace is even more heavily restricted than the use of public parks. The Miami cops have had a tough time getting their clearance; think about how hard it'll be for protesters. Still, the air is slowly opening up. One of the most significant problems with the terrorist drone threat is the small window of opportunity to stop an attack once it has been launched, given the speeds of some remote-controlled aircraft. Responders would have less than two minutes to intercept an aircraft launched from 5 km away, travelling at 200 km/h. Even if evacuation was feasible, it would be difficult to determine a drone's ultimate target, given its ability to change flight path according to pre-programmed coordinates and attack targets of opportunity.

A video posted online in October by the Iraqi militant group Ansar-al-Islam (*Ansar al Islam was the al qaida connected group who hosted Zarqawi and other al Qaida fighters after the invasion of Afghanistan and it was a key factor in former President Bush's case for going to war with Iraq. Isaac R.*) showed that insurgents are already deploying other forms of robotic weapons. It showed a vehicle-borne IED that can be remotely steered to its target and a tripod-mounted machine gun that can be fired by remote control. The US military in Iraq confirmed it had found 'a robot that can be used to remotely transport IEDs' in one of the group's safe houses in February 2010.

Attack of the drones - The dangers of remote-controlled aircraft

Key Points

- **Rapid advances in remote controlled aircraft and drone technologies are providing terrorists with new, more effective ways of carrying out surveillance and attacks.**

- The payload, distance and speed of hobbyist drones are improving rapidly and several non-state actors have either launched or planned attacks using remote controlled aircraft.

- **In the future, terrorists will increasingly exploit commercial drone technologies, presenting new challenges for militaries and security organisations that are discovering they no longer have a monopoly on using remote-controlled aircraft for intelligence gathering and kinetic attack.**

Remote-controlled aircraft and drone technologies are providing terrorists with new ways of carrying out surveillance and attacks. Marc Goodman looks at how these developments are presenting challenges for militaries and security organisations.

The US Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) announced on 28 September that it had disrupted a plot to attack the Pentagon and Capitol building with remote-controlled model aircraft packed with explosives. Authorities arrested Rezwan Ferdaus, a 28-year-old Northeastern University physics graduate of Bangladeshi descent. **According to the affidavit submitted by the FBI, he said he wanted to 'decapitate the entire empire' and 'severely disrupt the head and heart of the snake', a term that Al-Qaeda has used to refer to the United States. Ferdaus has pleaded not guilty.**

While the plan detailed in the affidavit is unlikely to have had the devastating impact that Ferdaus allegedly hoped to cause, the case has highlighted how rapid technological advancements are making a sophisticated tactical technology, previously only used by nation states, available to terrorists and insurgent groups.

Technological trickledown

In the 1970s, remote-controlled aircraft that could operate beyond the line of sight and carry film cameras were only used by militaries. However, by the late 1990s, the drones and their video systems decreased in price and size. Now, all the components necessary to build one are commercially available. **Although previous generations of drones required expertise in both electronics and radio transmission, today's equipment is vastly simpler to build and operate.**

The software and hardware needed to turn a standard hobby remote-controlled aircraft into a fully autonomous unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) is readily available and many now come with this feature built-in. There are dozens of options and sensors, ranging in sophistication and utility, which are conveniently accessible through a variety of online vendors. For example, the AP50 autopilot and flight-control system, produced by UAV Flight Systems, includes a global positioning systems (GPS) antenna for location; it can direct the orientation of the aircraft through information obtained from a three-axis sensor module, and includes a two-axis accelerometer, a barometric altimeter, a pilot airspeed sensor and two computers for stability support and executing mission-related tasks.

The weight of modern onboard navigation equipment and sensors is dropping steadily due to advances in information technology and miniaturisation. This allows drone pilots to do more with less. **In 2003, it was possible for a model aircraft designer to fly a remote-controlled plane more than 3,000 km across the Atlantic Ocean on less than a gallon (3.8 litres) of fuel. These efficiencies allow for larger payloads and more equipment to be carried by the drone, opening the door to a wider variety of missions.**

UAV technology is also constantly improving, particularly with regards to precision of movement. David Mellinger, a PhD student at the University of Pennsylvania, posted a video on the internet in May demonstrating that he could programme a quadrotor helicopter to move aggressively. Mellinger's aircraft is capable of flying through windows with less than 8 cm of clearance, even at an angle. It can do flips, attach to surfaces, such as walls, at different angles and move at rapid speeds. With further advances in the use of multiple cameras and sophisticated software, there will be an incredible transformation in the versatility of the next generation of mini-UAVs.

The sophistication of sensors carried by hobbyist drones is increasing substantially, spawning new trends, including the streaming of first person video (FPV). **Using electronic goggles, operators are able to view a virtual-reality cockpit with video streaming in real time from a camera mounted on their drone. Austrian-born Raphael Pirker, also known as 'Trappy', is one of the most well-known in the FPV community, often posting his drone's high-definition videos on the internet. With his modified RiteWing Zephyr aircraft, he is able to go up mountains, down the sides of cliffs or, in one particularly controversial incident, whirl around the head of the Statue of Liberty and over buildings, bridges and streets of New York City.**

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Fully functional drone systems that require no assembly are already available for purchase by the general public. The AR Parrot Drone, for example, costs USD300, is

controlled using a smartphone and sends back real-time video feed to the operator's smartphone or tablet computer. When modified with a lightweight computer running Linux, a broadband connection, a GPS receiver and two WiFi cards, the Parrot can be turned into a drone that is capable of hacking into WiFi systems and carrying out rudimentary signals intelligence.

Governments are encouraging the rapid development of a grassroots drone technology. The Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA) in the US has announced a contest to see who can design a UAV that is small enough to fit in a rucksack and costs less than USD10,000. This is what the members of online forums have been doing for years. DIYDrones.com, a group led by Wired magazine's editor-in-chief Chris Anderson, has 15,000 members exploring the boundaries of what is possible with do-it yourself drone technology.

Iran is looking to do the same, in which events like the Div-e-Sepid contest, where competitors from 65 teams race their homemade drones around Mount Damavand. The drones are equipped with cameras and participants have to complete a set of challenges, such as spotting hidden markers or plotting their precise coordinates.

Terrorist plans

Drones have already been used by non-state actors for conducting surveillance. In November 2004, the Lebanese militant group Hizbullah announced it had carried out aerial reconnaissance over Israel for the first time using a Mirsad-1 drone and later broadcast footage taken during the flight on its television station. The Israeli military confirmed the flight and said the drone was supplied by Iran.

On 14 September 2005, the Pakistani Army announced it had seized a Chinese-made drone in a raid on a suspected Al-Qaeda hideout in North Waziristan. Lieutenant General Safdar Hussain told reporters that the militants had used the technology to 'check the position of security forces and attack them,' adding that the vehicle was also capable of carrying weapons. In 2006, Ali Asad Chandia, a teacher from Maryland in the US, was convicted of providing material support to the Pakistani jihadist group Lashkar-e-Tayyiba (LeT). Among other things, he attempted to acquire a GPS guidance system for a model aircraft on behalf of the LeT.

Just as the US has weaponised its MQ-1B Predator UAVs, the obvious next step for militants is to turn drones into guided weapon systems. Using a UAV to carry out attacks presents many distinct advantages over conventional methods: they can be covertly launched from virtually anywhere, reach otherwise inaccessible targets and potentially cause mass panic with minimum risk to their operators. While no such attacks have yet been recorded as yet, there are already signs that militants are developing these weapons. In 2004, six members of the Palestinian militant group Hamas were allegedly killed when trying to make their own explosive-packed drone. An Israeli F-16 jet shot down a weaponised Hizbullah drone over the Mediterranean in August 2006. It

was identified as an Iranian-made Ababil-T, which can be fitted with a 45 kg warhead, although the Israeli military said the one it had downed was unarmed.

Ferdaus allegedly planned to use a similar concept. He travelled to Washington DC in May to conduct pre-attack reconnaissance and then unwittingly gave USB drives detailing his plans and material requirements to undercover FBI agents posing as Al-Qaeda operatives. Those plans detailed how he wanted to launch remote-controlled aircraft from East Potomac Park to fly two into the Pentagon and one into the Capital building to 'blow the dome to smithereens'.

He wanted to use 1/10 scale models of the F-4 Phantom fighter aircraft in the attack, noting that they can be purchased fully assembled with GPS navigation equipment, were capable of travelling at up to 160 mph (258 km/h) and could carry a payload of 10 to 12 lbs (4.5 to 5.4 kg), according to the affidavit.

The affidavit said he later opted to use two cheaper F-86 Sabre fighter aircraft models to attack the Pentagon, and purchased one with USD6,500 provided by the undercover agents. He allegedly asked the undercover agents for 24 lbs (11 kg) of explosives, hand grenades and six automatic weapons. According to the affidavit, he intended to pack 5 lbs (2.3 kg) of explosive into each of the three aircraft and use the rest to blow up bridges surrounding the Pentagon. The automatic weapons and grenades were for a follow-on attack that he allegedly wanted to lead against the Pentagon to capitalise on the disruption caused by the aerial attack. He was arrested when the undercover agents supplied him with six Kalashnikov assault rifles, three hand grenades and what he believed to be 25 lbs of C4 plastic explosive.

It is extremely unlikely that a model aircraft carrying around 2 kg of plastic explosives would have destroyed the dome of the Capitol building, and the plans detailed in the affidavit probably underestimated the Pentagon's ability to withstand attack. Nevertheless, **this concept for using drones as a way to guide improvised explosive devices to their targets could be an effective terrorist weapon, the most obvious target being crowds of people attending open air events where ground infiltration would be difficult. Although C4 is difficult to detonate in mid-air, only 1 kg is required to destroy a car and some model aircraft are capable of carrying between 5 and 15 kg.**

It does not take a sophisticated military-grade device to create a drone capable of delivering an explosive payload. For only USD16.95 anyone can buy the Chinese-made Qunum 'bomb' drop system for remote control aircraft. This 23.5 cm long case splits open to release a 103 g payload of the user's choice. It can be installed in just seconds by connecting the bomb with a radio channel so that it can be released on demand. Although sold as a leisure accessory, when used with a drone equipped with GPS navigation and video feed, this type of device could effectively and accurately deliver a pernicious payload on any desired target. The Qunum bomb system, and the many more like it that will surely follow, make it far easier for any terrorist to turn a remote-controlled plane into an aerial bomber.

Gunships and missiles

It is also possible to develop drones capable of carrying firearms. Commercial versions already exist: developed by Vanguard Defense, Shadowhawk is a remote-controlled helicopter that can be outfitted with 40 mm grenade launchers, stun guns or automatic small-arms. Already in use in East Africa for anti-piracy purposes, the Shadowhawk can patrol for 2.5 hours and reach a speed of 110 km/h. It comes in five different models that can also be outfitted with a turbine or piston engine, CCD TV optics, infrared and thermal cameras, laser pointers, illuminators, GPS and range finders. It even includes software capable of tracking moving objects such as people or vehicles.

In time, such technology is likely to become available to members of the general public. However, there are already many online videos of homemade armed mini-UAVs: one shows a Bergen Gasser EB mini-helicopter carrying a Springfield 1911-A .45 calibre weapon with a digital camera gun sight for accurate shooting.

Another online video demonstrated how a hobbyist remote-controlled aircraft could be used as a guided anti-aircraft weapon. In 2009, footage filmed by a small model aircraft showed it flying directly at a Virgin Blue airliner in the vicinity of Perth airport, Australia. The resulting near-miss was apparently done intentionally to recreate a scene from the film Top Gun. Aviation experts have said the model plane could have caused severe damage if it had been sucked into one of the airliner's engines or cracked the windshield. The offender currently faces up to two years in jail for his stunt.

A remote-controlled aircraft could prove to be a deadly weapon. In 2009, a US Airways airliner had to make an emergency landing in the Hudson River after birds got caught in the engines. The impact of an anti-aircraft attack with a remote-controlled aircraft could be substantially worse if it contained explosives or if multiple drones were used simultaneously.

Nightmare scenario

As problematic as kinetic explosive attacks and UAV gunships might be, there are even more frightening scenarios involving drones, including using them to deploy weapons of mass destruction. In a 1994 meeting to discuss the future of counter-proliferation in a post-Soviet world, Senator Sam Nunn, the then chairman of the US Senate Committee on Armed Services, laid out three 'out of the box' terrorism scenarios. One involved terrorists flying a small UAV loaded with two 40 lb canisters of weaponised Anthrax spores into the Capitol building on the night of the president's State of the Union address to Congress. In Nunn's scenario, terrorists remotely flew the drone from a short distance away and were able to kill hundreds of lawmakers and senior government officials. While the president survived, the government was left paralysed and a huge, densely populated area was biologically contaminated.

With their ability to fly straight flight paths at varying altitudes, modern hobbyist UAVs are almost perfectly suited to deploy chemical, biological or radiological agents. Trends are already moving in this direction: a video-posted online shows how one Japanese farmer, tired of working in the sweltering heat, turned his remote-controlled helicopter into a crop-duster. If a terrorist were to use this same concept to spread a lethal agent over a crowd instead of pesticides over rice fields, the potential for harm could be enormous.

One study showed that if 900 g of weapons-grade anthrax was dropped from a height of 100 m upwind of a large US city, an estimated 1.5 million people would become infected, with more than a 100,000 dying. Another study showed the consequences of dispersing a radiological weapon consisting of 2 kg of plutonium and 50 g of caesium over San Diego could lead to an 8 km area being contaminated and thousands of people exposed.

Terrorist groups have already contemplated using remote-controlled aircraft for chemical weapons attacks. In 1995, Aum Shinrikyo, the Japanese terrorist group that attacked the Tokyo subway system with Sarin, planned to use remote-controlled helicopters to spray dangerous chemicals from the air, but it was unable to get the operation of the aircraft correct in trial runs. If the group had been successful, it is hard to tell how much damage it would have been able to inflict on a densely populated area. The group would have been unlikely to face such helicopter-operation problems today.

Hack attacks

Another scenario that should not be discounted is one in which terrorists could take control of military drones and use them for their own purposes. This possibility was raised in 2009, when it was revealed that anyone could use a cheap piece of off-the-shelf software to download the unencrypted feeds from US surveillance drones. The Wall Street Journal reported that this had been done by Iraqi Shia militants equipped with a USD26 piece of Russian software used to steal satellite television signals. While the militants were not able to control the drones, they would have been able to view live video feeds and use them to monitor and evade US operations.

This was possible because Predator UAVs use a satellite link to send information to command and control bases back in the US. It was later revealed that the US government, presuming nobody would attempt to intercept their video feeds, never bothered to encrypt this information. Such underestimation of an enemy's capabilities might have proved to be a serious error that could have resulted in death and injury to coalition forces in Iraq.

Another incident was revealed in October, when the US military admitted its Predator and Reaper drones had been infected with a computer virus that logged the keystrokes made by pilots as they remotely conducted their missions. While it is not known who was behind the infection or whether it was done accidentally or maliciously, it highlighted another security weakness in US drone operations and heightened concern that hackers may be able to take control of military drones.

While the US is working to improve its security, this possibility will become more likely as drones are deployed by more military and law enforcement agencies. The Teal Group, a company that tracks defence and aerospace markets, has estimated that global spending on procurement of drones over the next decade could total more than USD94 billion. While other militaries are looking to follow the US lead in deploying weaponised drones, most of the new systems will be unarmed, with police, archaeologists, fire-fighters, scientists, universities and entertainment studios all expressing interest in acquiring drones that will provide cheap aerial coverage and allow them to operate in dangerous areas. Honeywell's T-Hawk drone, for example, was used in Japan to survey damage at the stricken Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant.

Anti-drone defences

The proliferation of UAVs for legitimate purposes will complicate efforts to respond to the growing threat of terrorist drones. In the future, people may become desensitised to the sight of miniature aircraft flying low overhead, leading to a situation where it might be harder to tell when one of the devices is being operated by criminals or terrorists.

While there may be attempts to regulate the purchase of remote control aircraft in the future, in most jurisdictions there is currently little if any legislation regulating their sale. In the meantime, virtually anybody could make a functioning mini-UAV with commercially available parts. By one estimate, the kit plane market consists of nearly 100,000 copies of more than 400 different designs from manufacturers worldwide, a decidedly difficult market to regulate and police.

Some governments are beginning to re-examine their ability to respond to terrorist drone attacks. In a recent interview with CBS News' 60 Minutes television programme, New York Police Commissioner Ray Kelly said the New York Police Department had the capability to shoot down an aircraft if an extreme situation were ever to arise, although he declined to provide details.

Targeting a small, low-flying drone presents different challenges to bringing down a hijacked airliner. Since 2003 the Pentagon has held an annual exercise called Black Dart, in which participants experiment with different weapons to bring down small aircraft. Trying to shoot down small UAVs has proved difficult. While the radio signals used to control drones can be jammed, in a crisis situation emergency responders and ordinary citizens rely on these same radio signals to communicate important information. Causing a blackout on these frequencies could do more harm than good and there is no guarantee it will be effective in stopping an attack.

Although previous attempts by terrorists to operationalise the use of remote-controlled aircraft have had limited impact or been intercepted, it may be a matter of time before this increasingly commonplace technology is used to cause substantial harm.

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Iraqi militant group demonstrates mobile killer robots

Ansar al-Islam, an Iraqi militant Sunni Islamist group, released an electronic pamphlet to jihadist forums in October that announced it was building vehicle-borne improvised explosive devices (VBIED) that can be steered to their targets by remote control.

The pamphlet admitted the vehicles were difficult to control but said the problem had been offset by the installation of video cameras. It claimed the group had been developing remotely controlled vehicles since 2005 and produced the first working model in 2006. It said the vehicles performed well in tests and only malfunctioned once, when one was immobilised when it hit a concrete barrier in an attempted attack on Iraqi soldiers in early 2007.

The pamphlet also provided a link to a trailer for a forthcoming video, which included footage of a driverless car on the move, a remotely operated weapon station mounted with a machine gun and various other types of improvised weapons.

US forces in Iraq released a statement in February 2010 saying that Iraqi security forces had carried out a raid on an Ansar al-Islam safehouse in the Mosul area of northern Iraq and found 'a robot that can be used to remotely transport IEDs,' as well as 20 shoulder-launched surface-to-air missiles and various other weapons and equipment. No further details of the robot were provided.

Remotely controlled VBIEDs could be useful for militants as they do not require a suicide bomber and are potentially less vulnerable to counter-fire from well-defended targets. However, they would require more time and resources to build and would probably be unreliable and difficult to control in complex urban environments. They may also be vulnerable to the types of electronic jamming equipment used against remotely triggered IEDs. © IHS Global Limited, 2011

December 13, Bellingham Herald – (Washington) Bellingham protesters arrested after blocking railroad tracks; about a dozen arrested. Bellingham, Washington police arrested about a dozen protesters after they linked themselves together and laid down on railroad tracks for more than 3 hours December 12. About 80 to 100 protesters blocked the tracks and an intersection near downtown Bellingham starting

at noon, in what they said was a show of solidarity with Occupy Oakland and other events aimed at shutting down ports on the West Coast. After several warnings from police, most of the protesters moved away from the tracks except for a handful who refused to move. Several had connected themselves together with bicycle locks around their necks. Around 3 p.m., officers began arresting protesters one at a time. Arrests lasted several hours because officers had to use a saw to cut the bike locks on some protesters' necks. Those arrested were put onto a bus to Whatcom County Jail, where a police spokesman said they likely would remain overnight on suspicion of second-degree criminal trespassing, and obstructing an officer. The protest reportedly delayed two trains, one heading north and the other south, though that could not be confirmed with Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway (BNSF) December 12. ROME (AP) Rome's mayor said Sunday that it could cost at least a 1 million (\$1.4 million) to recover from the havoc wreaked by rioters who smashed windows, tore up sidewalks and torched vehicles after breaking off from a peaceful protest.

The estimate came as clean-up work continued in damaged neighborhoods, where many charred vehicles remained parked along the streets.

The hundreds of rioters infiltrated a march Saturday by tens of thousands of demonstrators unhappy about the global financial crisis part of a worldwide version of the Occupy Wall Street protests in New York.

The protesters, some wearing gas masks and many in hoods, ripped up cobblestones and slabs of sidewalk to hurl at police and buildings, and smashed windows with hammers. Police responded with water hoses and tear gas. Protesters also stormed into a church, tore a crucifix off the wall and smashed a statue of the Virgin Mary.

Rome Mayor Gianni Alemanno inspected the damaged neighborhood near St. John in Lateran Basilica on Sunday. He called the rioters "animals" and told reporters that repairs to city property, including streets and sidewalks, will cost at least 1 million (\$1.4 million).

Interior Minister Roberto Maroni, whose ministry includes the state police corps, said he would brief the Senate on Tuesday about the rioting and the measures to be taken to avoid a replay.

Maroni told a news conference that he has urged investigators to "carefully study the images" that might have been captured by bank and other surveillance cameras so the rioters could be brought to justice "and pay for what they did in an exemplary way."

A city sanitation crew on Sunday whitewashed a wall near the Colosseum to remove graffiti. Charred hulks of dozens of parked, unoccupied cars set ablaze by the rioters still lined several streets, but most of the shattered glass and chunks of hurled stone had been swept away Saturday night.

Hundreds of bus runs on Saturday had to be diverted to avoid the riot areas, but routes were normal on Sunday. Cafes in the area that had quickly shuttered their windows when the riot moved in their direction were open for business Sunday.

October 2011

Mass gatherings associated with public protest movements can have disruptive effects on transportation, commercial, and government services, especially when staged in major metropolitan areas. Large scale demonstrations also carry the potential for violence, presenting a significant challenge for law enforcement.

Background

The Occupy Wall Street (OWS) movement is a loose coalition of ongoing peaceful protests taking place in cities across the United States. The OWS movement began with demonstrations staged in New York City's financial district, where protesters have taken up residence since September 17. The protests focus primarily on issues of economic justice, including corruption in the financial system, the government's handling of the global financial crisis, wealth disparity, and the role of corporate money in the U.S. political system. As a self-identified "leaderless resistance movement," OWS lacks an official set of demands and has co-opted support from participants seeking to bring attention to a wide range of social, economic, political, and environmental issues. The movement has drawn inspiration from recent protests in Europe and the Middle East, specifically citing "the Egyptian Tahrir Square uprising" and recent demonstrations in Spain. The first day of the protest drew approximately 1,000 protesters to Wall Street and the movement has grown considerably since, with an encampment of protesters occupying nearby Zucotti Square in Lower Manhattan. The OWS protests continued to gain momentum in the following weeks, sparking smaller demonstrations in major cities nationwide. Although the protests have been mostly peaceful, hundreds of arrests have been made by local police forces, mostly for trespassing, disorderly conduct, and obstructing traffic.

The financial services sector has served as the focal point of the OWS movement, with protesters holding protests and camping out in the financial districts of cities such as Boston, New York, Chicago, and San Francisco.

New York:

Commercial Facilities

Movement organizers have used public parks and plazas, as well as private property, as areas of public assembly for OWS-linked protests. In many cases, these protests have been staged without permits, leading to arrests. These large gatherings have had a major impact on surrounding business and retail districts. In some cases, commercial facilities have been targeted directly by OWS demonstrations.

Taking place primarily in downtown areas, the OWS demonstrations have had a significant impact on transportation, causing widespread traffic jams, road closures, and suspension of public transit.

Emergency Services

The OWS protests have placed a considerable burden on emergency services personnel to control crowds, protect critical infrastructure, and maintain public order. Although there have been hundreds of arrests made, most have been for minor offenses and confrontations between police and protesters have been rare. Police departments have sought to minimize these types of incidents, enhance security, and heighten awareness through public-private information sharing.

New York:

- The extra manpower needed to police the protests are also placing a financial burden on emergency services, costing the New York Police Department (NYPD) \$1.9 million mostly in overtime as of October 10. (Source: [MSNBC](#))
- The NYPD has kept banks in the loop about protester activity by sending out email blasts to its Lower Manhattan Security Initiative and Midtown Manhattan Security Initiative. The emails tell landlords and occupants in those areas, including large banks, where protesters are headed and whether there are any unusual risks. (Source: [Reuters](#))

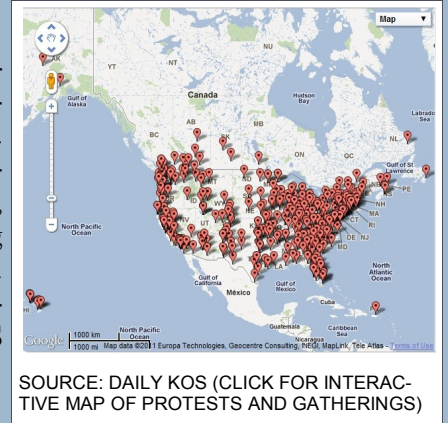

Feature: Social Media and IT Usage

A distinct feature of OWS is how it was born from online organization and continues to use social media to spread its message, organize further protests, and keep protesters connected. OWS and the broader Occupy Together movement that organizes protests in other cities use services such as Twitter, Tumblr, Meetup, and Facebook to this end, as well as having set up a live video feed of the OWS encampment in New York. Announcements, videos, and images are all collected and disseminated via these social networks as well as on the OWS Web site.



- On September 24 and October 5, NYPD officers resorted to pepper spray to subdue protesters. The September 24 incident is under investigation. (Source: [DNAinfo.com](#))
- On October 14, protesters wielding brooms and throwing bottles and garbage clashed erupted with police as protesters attempted to breach the barricades blocking access to Wall Street and the NYSE, leading to 14 arrests. 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- The Boston Police Department (BPD) has also reached out to protesters, issuing a notice which informed protesters of applicable laws and what to expect from BPD officers, as well as communicated with Occupy Boston's members via the movement's Twitter account. Summary

Summary

Since the initial September 17 protest which drew 1,000 participants to Wall Street, OWS-inspired groups have staged protests in upwards of 70 cities across the United States, including most major metropolitan areas. The largest gathering to date came on October 5, when an estimated 15,000 protesters marched on Wall Street and the NYSE. In addition, Occupytogether.org, an OWS-affiliated Web site, lists over 1,500 geographically unique online communities in 25 countries seeking to participate in the demonstrations. As the movement has spread, it has garnered increased media attention, significantly expanded its demographic base, and co-opted support from labor unions, social action groups, and the “hacktivist” collective, Anonymous, among others.

Social media and the organic emergence of online communities have driven the rapid expansion of the OWS movement. In New York, OWS leaders have also formed ad hoc committees to organize protesters and manage communications, logistics, and security. The OWS encampment in Zucotti Park features a medical station, distribution point for food and water, and a media center complete with generators and wireless Internet. Organizers hold general assembly meetings twice a day and have established committees and working groups including an Internet Working Group and a Direct Action Committee, which plans protest activities and works to maintain peaceful and controlled demonstrations. This high level of organization has allowed OWS to sustain its operations, disseminate its message, and garner increasing levels of support.

The growing support for the OWS movement has expanded the protests’ impact and increased the potential for violence. While the peaceful nature of the protests has served so far to mitigate their impact, larger numbers and support from groups such as Anonymous substantially increase the risk for potential incidents and enhance the potential security risk to critical infrastructure (CI). The continued expansion of these protests also places an increasingly heavy burden on law enforcement and movement organizers to control protesters. As the primary target of the demonstrations, financial services stands the sector most impacted by the OWS protests. Due to the location of the protests in major metropolitan areas, heightened and continuous situational awareness for security personnel across all CI sectors is encouraged.

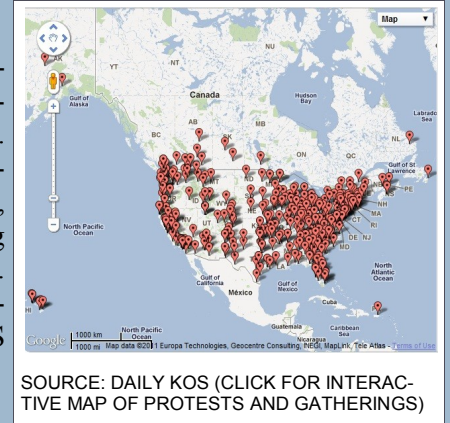

Hi All,

Last night we had approximately 500 Occupy protesters show up at the Court at 1900 hours and climb the steps. In addition, they tried to climb on unauthorized areas (ie statues, etc) outside of the Court as well. They protesters stayed for approximately 10 minutes (they were all subject to arrest if they did not depart) and left. We had one arrest for APO.

If anyone has any updated information for the Occupy the Courts on Friday, please advise. So far, the only confirmed information we have is that there will be a permitted rally on US Capitol grounds from about 12-1300 hours, then the participants will walk across the street to our building and possibly engage in civil disobedience. I have been in communication with Move to Amend. Thus far, they have been cooperative.

Computer hackers are avenging the Occupy movement by exposing the personal information of police officers who evicted protesters and are threatening family-values advocates who led a boycott of an American Muslim television show.

In three Internet postings last week, hackers from the loose online coalition called Anonymous published the personal information of thousands of law enforcement officers all over the country.

One hacker posted the email and physical addresses, phone numbers and encrypted passwords of more than 2,400 police officers and corporate security executives. The targeted police officers and security personnel were members of the Coalition of Law Enforcement and Retail (CLEAR), a nonprofit group that promotes cooperation between local police forces and retail corporations throughout the United States.

Another hacker struck the website of the Florida Family Association. In an Internet posting, he told the family association he was reading its email, and he published email addresses and partial credit-card information of two dozen or so of the group's supporters.

A third hacker posted 18,000 emails, names and passwords of customers from Specialforces.com, a website that sells military-style clothing and weapon accessories. A brief review suggested that many of the customers might be police officers or military personnel and identifiable as such by their emails.

Here is what I have:

1. Colorado Springs currently has one camp in one area. The Occupy group has obtained a revocable permit to keep pop-up style tents in the public right-of-way. The group is not in the park itself, but on the sidewalk surrounding the park.

2. CSPD has made 10 arrests. Only two were required to be booked based on the nature of the offense. The others were served and released.
3. There have been no modifications of City Ordinance, only the issuance of the permit. The permit is valid for 30 days at which time the group can apply for renewal.
4. We have had close liaison with the group using our Homeless Outreach Team as a primary contact point. We have also "ramped up" preparation and planning on two occasions when there was rumor of civil disobedience by the group. Otherwise we respond to calls in a normal fashion.

SSA Marine was recently fined for building an illegal road to the site of its massive, dirty coal terminal project in WA. It was also caught recently not alerting workers to the threat of explosive cargo in Oakland. SSA/Goldman Sachs symbolize the ruin that corporate greed has brought into our lives. The 1% are depriving port truck drivers and other workers of decent pay, working conditions and the right to organize, even while the port of LA/LB is the largest in the US and a huge engine of profits for the 1%. The 1% have pursued a conscious policy of de-industrialization that has resulted in "trade" at the port meaning that there are 7 containers coming in for every one going out. The 1% have driven migrant workers into a "grey market" economy and

repression. The 1% use police brutality and repression, jails and prisons to suppress, divide and try to silence the 99% and all who oppose their insatiable greed. To put an end to all that, we call on the 99% to march, boycott, occupy the ports, and STRIKE on December 12 for full legalization, good jobs for all, equality and justice.

In addition, they tried to climb on unauthorized areas (ie statues, etc) outside of the Court as well. They protesters stayed for approximately 10 minutes (they were all subject to arrest if they did not depart) and left. We had one arrest for APO.

If anyone has any updated information for the Occupy the Courts on Friday, please advise. So far, the only confirmed information we have is that there will be a permitted rally on US Capitol grounds from about 12-1300 hours, then the participants will walk across the street to our building and possibly engage in civil disobedience. I have been in communication with Move to Amend. Thus far, they have been cooperative.

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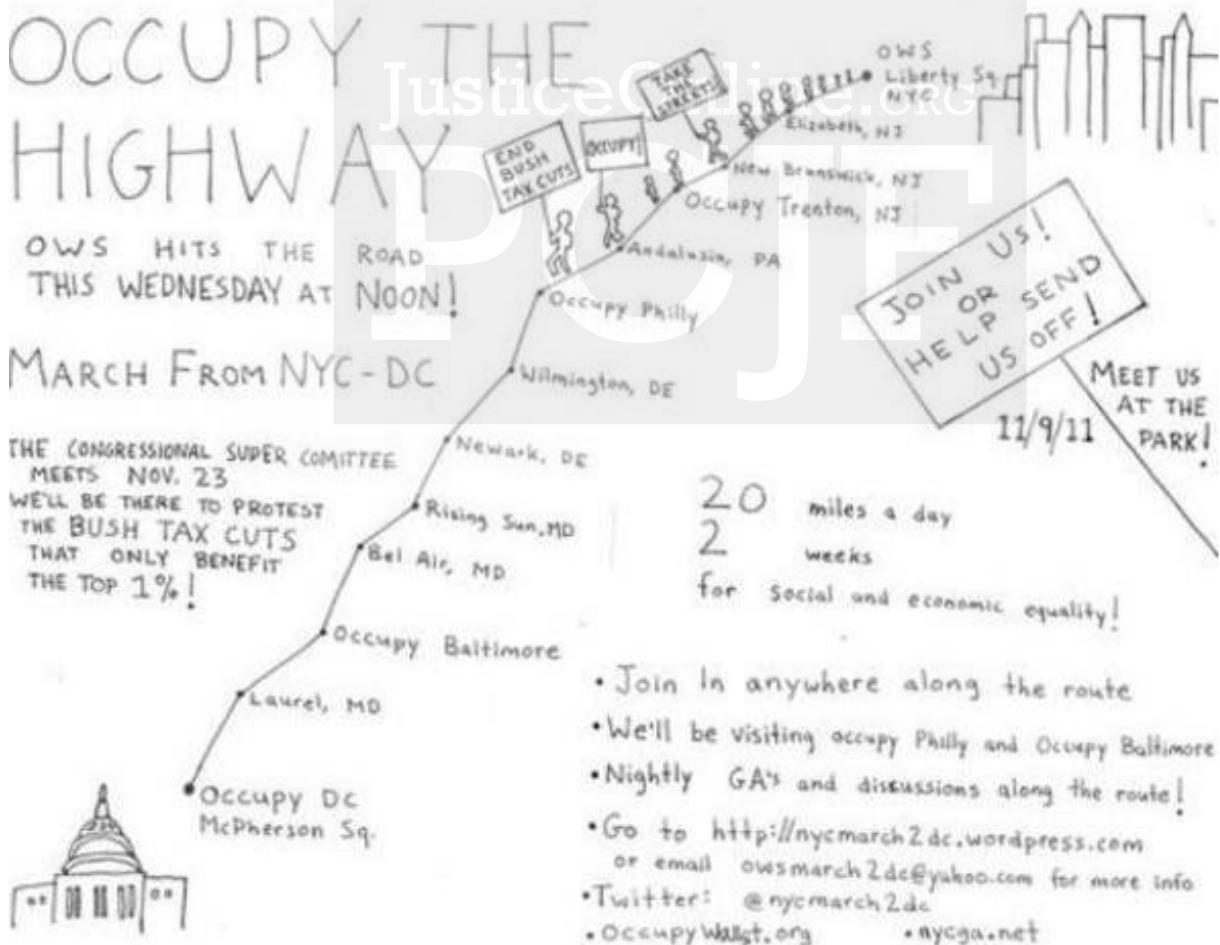

The 20 mile a day/2 week march from Liberty Square to DC is set to leave this Wednesday, November 9 at noon. On Wednesday we'll be leaving Liberty Square and marching to the New York Waterway/Hudson River Ferry and onward to Elizabeth, NJ. This is our first stop. Everyone is welcome to join this two week march. If you'd like to participate, but can't commit for two weeks you're welcome to join us for the day or help send us off!

The march is being organized by a few of us here at OWS. We will be in DC by Nov 23 for the Congressional Super Committee meeting. This committee has the power to keep the Bush tax cuts (that only benefit the top 1%) or let them expire. We want to be there to fight for the 99%! We will also be connecting with Occupy Philly and Occupy Baltimore along the route, and, of course, Occupy DC!

A major draw for this march is to encourage more people in rural communities to get involved as well as bring spreading the word along the highway.
